P R E S E N T, The KING's Moft Excellent Majefty in Council. IS Majefty in Council was this Day pleafed to order, that the Parliament, which flands prorogued to Thurfday the Fifteenth Day of this inflant November, be further prorogued to Thurfday the Third Day of January now next following.

RESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. II S Majefty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hath thought fit to order, and it is hereby ordered, that no Perfon or Perfons whatever shall, from and after the Publication of this Order in the London Gazette, until the 1st Day of March, 1793, directly or indirectly, export, transport, carry or convey, or caufe or procure to be exported, transported, carried or conveyed, out of or from any Port or Place in Great Britain, or load or lay on Board, or caufe or procure to be loaded or laid on Board of any Ship, Veffel or Boat, in order to be exported or carried out of any Port or Place in Great Britain, any Wheat or Wheat Flour.-His Majesty nevertheless, by the Advice aforefaid, hath thought fit to order, and doth hereby order, that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be confirued to extend, to prohibit the Exportation of any Foreign Wheat or Wheat Flour, which shall have been imported into this Kingdom, and warehoufed in the Manner and upon the Conditions mentioned in an Act passed in the Thirty-first Year of His

Majesty's Reign, intituled, " An A& for regu-" lating the Importation and Exportation of Corn, " and the Payment of the Duty on Foreign Corn " imported, and of the Bounty on British Corn ex-" ported ;" nor to prohibit the carrying Coaftwife, or the carrying out and exporting of Wheat and Wheat Flour, in the Manner and in the fame Proportions and Quantities, and from and to the fame Ports and Places, as is by the faid Act allowed, at fuch Times as Wheat and Wheat Flour are prohibited to be exported, by reafon of the Price of Wheat and Wheat Flour being at or above the Prices mentioned in Table B. in the faid Act contained, fubject to the like Securities, Conditions, Regulations and Restrictions, Forfeitures and Penalties, as are required and imposed by the faid Act, or by any other Act now in Force, in any of the Cafes aforefaid. -And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majefty's Treasury are to give the necestary Directions herein accordingly.
