The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

IS Majesty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hath thought fit to order, and it is hereby ordered, that no Person or Persons whatever fhail, from and after the Publication of this Order in the London Gazette, until the 1st Day of March, 1793. directly or indirectly, export, transport, carry or convey, or cause or procure to be exported, transported, carried or conveyed, out of or from any Port or Place in Great British, or load or lay on Board, or cause or procure to be loaded or his on Board of any Snip, Vealed on Boat, in order to be exported or carried out of any Port or Place in Great Britain, any Wheat or Wheat Flour .- His Majesty nevertheless, by the Advice aforesaid, hath thought fit to order, and doth hereby order, that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be conftrued to extend, to prohibit the Exportation of any Foreign Wheat or Wheat Flour, which shall have been imported into this Kingdom, and warehoused in the Manner and upon the Conditions mentioned in an An passed in the Thirty-first Year of His Litajesty's Reign, intituled, " An Act for regu-" lating the Importation and Exportation of Corn, " and the Payment of the Duty on Foreign Corn imported, and of the Bounty on British Corn ex-" ported;" nor to prohibit the carrying Coastwife, or the carrying out and exporting of Wheat and Wheat Flour, in the Manner and in the same Proportions and Quantities, and from and to the fame Ports and Places, as is by the faid Act allowed, at such Times as Wheat and Wheat Flour are prohibited to be exported, by reason of the Price of Wheat and Wheat Flour being at or above the Prices mentioned in Table B. in the said Act contained, subject to the like Securities, Conditions, Regulations and Restrictions, Forseitures and Penalties, as are required and imposed by the said Act, or by any other Act now in Force, in any of the Cases aforesaid.

—And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary Directions herein accordingly.

As several Artificers and Manufadurers, Subjects of Great Britain, have, from Time to Time, gone into Foreign Countries to exercise their several Callings, contrary to the Laws of these Kingdoms; the following Abstracts of Acts of Parliament of Their lave Majesties King George the First and Second, and of His present Majesty, for preventing such Practices, are published, for the Information of all Persons who may be ignorant of the Penalties they may incur by Disobedience to them: And it will be observed, that such Penalties likewise extend to those who are any ways concerned or instrumental in the Sending or Enticing Artificers or Manufacturers out of these Kingdoms, or in the Exportation of the Tools and Instruments, used by them, as well as to the Artificers or Manufacturers themselves:

If any Person shall contract with, entice, or solicit, any Artificer in Wool, Iron, Steel, Brass, or other Metal, Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other Artificer of Great Britain, to go into Foreign Countries out of the King's Dominions, and shall be convicted thereof, upon Indictment or Information, in any of the Courts at Westminster, or at the Assizes or Quarter-Sessions, he shall be fined any Sum not exceeding ONE HUNDRED POUNDS for the first Offence, and shall be imprisoned Three Months, and till the Fine be paid. And if any Person having been once convicted shall offend again, he shall be fined at the Discretion of the Court, and imprisoned Twelve Months, and till the Fine be paid.

If any of the King's Subjects, being such Artificers, shall go into any Country out of His Majesty's Dominions, to exercise or teach the said Trades to Foreigners; and if any of the King's Subjects in any such Foreign Country, exercising any of the said Trades, shall not return into this Realm within Six Months after Warning given by the Ambassador, Minister or Consultof Great Britain, in the Country where such Artisicers shall be, or by any Person authorised by such Ambassador, &c. or by one of the Secretaries of State, and from henceforth inhabit within this Realm; such Persons shall be incapable of taking any Legacy, or of being an Executor or Administrator, or of taking any Lands, &c. within this Kingdom, by Descent, Devise or Purchase, and shall forfeit all Lands, Goods, &c. within this Kingdom, to His Majesty's Use, and shall be deemed Alien, and out of His Majesty's Protection.

Upon Complaint made, upon Oath, before any Justice of Peace, that any Person is endeavouring to seduce any such Artificer, or that any such Artificer hath contracted or is preparing to go our of His Majesty's Dominions, for the Purposes aforefaid, such Justice may fend his Warrant to bring the Person complained of before him, or before some other Justice; and if it shall appear by the Oath of one Witness, or by Confession, that he was guilty of any of the faid Offences, fuch Justice may bind him to appear at the next Affizes or Quarter Sefflors: And, if such Person shall resule to give Security, the Juffice may commit him to Goal till the next Affizes or Quarter Sessions, and until he shall be delivered by-due Course of Law. fuch Artificer shall be convicted, upon Indictment, of any such Promise. Contract, or Preparation to go beyond the Seas, for the Purpose aforesaid, he shall give such Security to the King not to depart out of His Majesty's Dominions, as such Court shall think reasonable, and shall be imprisoned till Security

If any of the above Offences shall be committed in Scotland, the same shall be profecuted in the Court of Justiciary, on the Circuits there.

Statute 23 George II. Chap. 13.

IF any Person shall contract with, or endeavour to feduce any Artificer in Wool, Mohair, Cotton or Silk, or in Iron, Steel, Brass, or other Metal, or any Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other Artificer in any other of the Manufactures of Great Britain or Ireland, to go out of this Kingdom or Ireland, into any Foreign Country not within the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain, and shall be convicted, upon Indictment or Information, in the King's Bench at Westminster, or by Indiament at the Assizes or General Gaol Delivery for the County, &c. wherein such Offence shall be committed in England, or by Indictment in the Court of Justiciary, or any of the Circuit Courts in Scotland, or by Indictment or Information in the King's Bench. at Dublin, if such Offence be committed in Ire-land; the Person so convicted shall, for every Artifeer contracted with, or feduced, forfeit FIVE HUNDIED POUNDS, and shall suffer Impri-Stewartry wherein such Offender shall be convicted, for Twelve Calendar Months, and until Forfeiture be paid: And in Case of a subsequent Offence of the fame Kind, the Persons so again offending shall forfeit, for every Person contracted with or seduced, ONE THOUSAND POUNDS, and shall suffer Imprisonment in the Common Gaol of the County or Stewartry wherein fuch Offender shall be convicted, for Two Years, and until fuch... Forfeiture be paid.

If any Person in Great Britain or Ireland shall put on Board any Ship or Boat, not bound directly to a some Port in Great Britain or Ireland, or to some other of the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain, any such Tools or Utensils as are commonly used in, or proper for the Preparing; Working up to Finishing of the Woollen or Silk Manusactures or any Part of such Tools, or Parts thereof, put on Board, and TWO HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered by Action of Debt, &c. in any Court of Record at Westminster, or in the Court of Session in Scotland, or at any of the Four Courts in Dublin respectively, wherein no Essoin, &c. shall be allowed.

It shall be lawful for any Officer of the Customs in Great Britain, or for any Officer of the Revenue in Ireland, to seize and secure, in some of His Maelly's Warehouses, all such Tools or Utenfils prohibited to be exported, as such Officer shall find on Board any Vessel not bound directly to some Port in Great Britain or Ireland, or to some other of the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain; and all Tools so seized shall, after Condemnation, be publickly sold to the best Bidder; and one Moiety of the Produce shall be to the Use of His Majesty, and the other Moiety to the Officer who shall seize and secure the same.

If the Captain of any Veffel in Great Britain or Ireland knowingly permit any of the faid Tools, prohibited to be exported, to be put on Board his Veffel, he shall, for every such Offence; forseit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered as the Penalties institted upon Persons exporting the Tools; and, if the Vessel belongs to His Majesty; the Captain shall not only forseit ONE HUND DRED POUNDS, but shall also forseit his Empoyment, and be incapable of any Employment under His Majesty.

If any Officer of the Cultoms in Great Britain, or of the Revenue in Ireland, take, or knowingly fuffer to be taken, any Entry outward, or fign any Cocket or Sufferance for the Shipping or Exporting of any of the said Tools, or knowingly suffer the same to be done, he shall forfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered as aforefaid, and also forfeit his Office, and be incapable of any Office under His Majesty.

One Moiety of the Forfeitures shall be applied to the Use of His Majesty, and the other Moiety to the Use of the Person who shall sue for the

fame.

Statutes 14, 21, 25 and 26 of His present Majesty.

BY these Statutes the like Penalties and Forfeitures as above mentioned are extended to Persons packing or putting on board any Vessel, not bound directly for some Port in Great Britain or Ireland, any Machine, Engine, Tool, Press, Paper, Utenfil or Implement whatsoever, used in or proper for the working or finishing of the Cotton, Linen, Steel or Iron Manufactures of this Kingdom, or any Part or Parts of such Machines or Implements, or any Models or Plans thereoff; and all Captains of Ships and other Persons receiving or being in Possession of any such Articles, with an Intent to export the same to Foreign Parts, and all Custom-house Officers suffering an Entry to be made thereof, are respectively liable to the like Penalties as are above mentioned, in the Case of Took and Utenfils used in the Woollen and Silk Manufactures.

General Post-Office, November 3, 1792.

A Plan having been strongly recommended by the Go-wernors and other Persons of Consideration residing in the Leeward Islands, as well as by the West India-Merchants and Planters residing in London, for the Improvement of their Correspondence by employing Two, Schooners to convey the Mails through those Islands, instead of One as at present, the Post=Master General have consented to make a Trial of it for Six Months: Notice is therefore hereby given, that when the Jamaica

Packet, with the Mails from hence of the First Wednesday in the Month, arrives at Barbadoes, One of the Schooners will proceed from thence, with the Leeward. Island Mails as at present, for St. Vincent's, Grenada, Dominica, Autigua, Montserrat, Newis and St. Kitt's; where she will leave the Mail for Tortola to wait the Arrival of the Leeward Island Packet with the Mails of the Third Wednesday in the Month from England. When the Second, or Leeward Island Packet, arrives

at Barbadoes, the other Schooner will take the Mails for Dominica, Antigua, Montferrat, Newis and St. Kitt's; and, after staying Forty-eight Hours for Answers at each Island (excepting at Newis and St. Kitt's) will return to Barbadoes, whilft the Packet will proceed to St. Vincent's and Grenada, and, instead of calling at Dominica, Antigua and Montferrat, as at present, will go directly to Nevis and St. Kitt's, and from thence to Tortola, and then return to Falmouth.

It is calculated that, by the Packet and Schooner each taking a different Course during the same Time till they meet at Nevis, instead of the Packet performing the whole Voyage, will save Thirteen Days in every Voy-
