THE following Address of the Principal and Professors of the University of Edinburgh, having been transmitted by Dr. Robertson, Principal, to the Right Hon. Henry Dundas, His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, has been by him presented to the King: Which Address His Majesty was pleased to receive very graciously:

*Most Gracious Sovereign,*

WE, your Majesty's loyal Subjects, the Principal and Professors of the University of Edinburgh, consider it as our Duty, in this first Meeting of the Senatus Academicus after our annual Vacation, humbly to approach the Throne, in order to express our firm Attachment to your Majesty's Person and Government, and to declare our high Estimation of that excellent Constitution which was established by the glorious Revolution, for the Preservation and Security of which the illustrious House of Hanover was seated on the British Throne.

Sensible of your Majesty's uniform Attention to the Happiness of your People, and to the Maintenance of their Rights and Liberties, Religious and Civil, and most sincerely thankful for the many Blessings we enjoy under your auspicious Reign, we, from the Heart, reprobate every Principle and Opinion subversive of regular Government, and inconsistent with public Peace and good Order.

In pursuance of your Majesty's Royal Injunction, flowing from a provident Solitude for the Welfare of your People, we shall, as the most effectual Means in our Power to check the Progress of such Opinions, labour, with increased Assiduity, in infilling into the Minds of the Youth under our Care such just Sentiments with respect to the Nature of Society, as may early animate them with the Love of their Country, with Reverence for it's Laws, and with Loyalty to their Sovereign, and may form them to act their Part in Life with Credit to themselves,

with Utility to the Public, and with Honour to the Seminary of Learning in which they were educated.

and therefore being the better enabled to prepare and arrange a Plan for crushing at once and generally the only remaining Abuse that has attached on the State Lotteries, the same was submitted to the Consideration of the Lord Mayor and Aldermen of London, and of the Chairman and Justices for Middlesex and Westminster, and for the several Districts under the new Police Act, by whom it has been unanimously determined to co-operate in Support of the Measures prepared by this Office, and to give their utmost Assistance in the speedy and total Suppression of the Abuse, and in the active and effectual Maintenance of the remedial Laws provided for that Purpose.
