"uf Troops into Winter-quarters. Much notice is taken of the liberty which is allowed the Sieur Griffengett in his Prifon, which many people look upon as a mark that the Kings difpleafure against him, begins to leffen, and that possibly he may return to his favor again.

We have this afternoon Strasburg, Octob 17. advice, that the French have taken the Gaffle of Lichtenberg, the Gari'on being to march out as this day. The French are making a Way between Colmar and Brifae of 100 foot broad; and about two Leagues below Brifae, they are laying a Bridge over the Rhine. Monlieur Munclar continues polled at Hegerfoeim; and we are told, that feveral French Troops are coming from Burgundy, and five Regiments are already arrived at Enfifteym. The Duke of Lorrain has his quarters still at Screcke, having fent the Dragoons of Heister and Chavaignae, with the Lorrain Cavalry towards the Mofelle; his Infantry lies encamped along the Rhine from Raftat to Goltscheir.

Cologne, Oftob. 21. Our Magistrates having received a fecond Meffage from the Duke of Luxemburg, concerning the payment of the 50000 Crowns, feized here by the Imperialist, and finding themfelves wholly unable to be fecured against the threats of the French, in cafe they should contest the thing, have thought it more prudence to com-ply with the prefent necessity; a el accordingly sent Deputies to the Duke of Luxemburg, to allure him of their willingness to pay the faid 50000 Crowns, in cafe he would give them time to do it, till the 15 of November. The faid Deputies were likewife ordered to follicite a Neutrality for this City. Yeflerday they returned, having fucceeded as to the first Point, but as for the Neutrality, we do not yet hear that they have obtained it. The French have taken the Town and Callle of Mountjou, and cauled the Governor to be hanged, for going about to defend the place. The Confederate Troops lie on the other fide of the Rbine, above Bonne, the Bishop of Ofnabrug, the Marquis de Grana, General Chauver, Sc. are gone thither.

Bruffels, Octob. 21. We are still expecting the Ratifications from Spain. This day about noon ar-rived an Express from Nimeguen, with Letters to the Marquis de los Balbaces, who had a Conference with his Excellency upon them. The French have not yet quitted *Maestricht*, nor according to our Letters from thence, is there any great appearance that they will do it fuddenly; but our Letters tell us, that they have drawn their Troops out of Leeuwe. The French Army is still in the Dutchy of Juliers, having possessed themselves of all the places in it, except the City of Fuliers, which, it's faid, they have invefted. The Magistrates of Cologne have fent Deputies to the Duke of Luxemburg, with an offer to pay the 50000 Crowns demanded of them, before the 15th of November, and with orders to endeavor to obtain a Neutrality for their City.

Hague, Octob. 25. We are toki that the French Ambassador hath given in a Memorial to the States, wherein he demands of them to withdraw their Forces out of Huy and Haffelt, places in the Country of Liege, and that they will not fuffer fuch Troops which they ihall disband, to enter into the fervice of the Emperor, or any of the Allies: As for Huy, is is faid, the States are willing to draw out the Garifon they have there, but think it necessary to keep their Forces in Haffelt ; and as to the laft Point, that when the Soldiers are put out of their fervice, it is free for them then to enter into whofe they pleafe. The Deputies of the States had two days fince a Conference with the French Ambaffador about fixing a day for the evacuation of Maestricht. which will not be it feems till the 6th of the next month, though the States prefs to have the Article of the Treaty concerning the reflitution of that place complyed with and that it may be delivered up immediately. The Northern Letters tell us, that the Inhabitants of Straelfond feem refolved to defend the place to the laft extremity, being much encouraged by the prefence of Co.nt Conins Smarke, who affures them that their fufferings will be fully confidered and rewarded by the King of Sueden.
