That whenever We shall cause the Militia to be drawn out and embodied, on the Occasions and in the Manner therein mentioned, if the Parliament fliall then be separated by such Adjournment or Prorogation as will not expire within Fourteen Days, We may and shall issue Our Proclamation for the Meeting of the Parliament within Fourteen Days; and the Parliament shall accordingly meet and sit upon fuch Day as shall be appointed by such Proclamation, and continue to fit and act in like Manner, to all Intents and Purposes, as if it had stood adjourned or prorogued to the same Day: And whereas We have thought fit, in pursuance of the said Act, this Day to declare in Our Council, certain Causes and Occasions moving Us to order and direct, that such Part of Our Militia Forces, as may more immediately enable Us to provide for the important Objects therein mentioned, should be drawn out and embodied: And whereas, in pursuance of the said recited Act, We have thought fit on this Day to iffue Our Royal Proclamation, notifying the Causes and Occasions fo declared in Council as aforefaid: And whereas Our Parliament now stands prorogued to Thursday the Third Day of January next; We therefore, by the Advice of Our Privy Council, do hereby publish and declare Our Royal Will and Pleasure, That Our faid Parliament shall, on Thursday the Thirteenth Day of this inftant December, be held for the Dispatch of divers weighty and important Affairs. And the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens and Burgeffes, and the Commissioners for Shires and Burghs of the House of Commons, are hereby required to give Attendance accordingly at Westminster on the faid Thirteenth Day of December.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. Y IS Majesty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hath thought fit to order, and it is hereby ordered, that no Person or Persons whatever shall, from and after the Publication of this Order in the London Gazette, until the 1st Day of March, 1793, directly or indirectly, export, transport, carry or convey, or cause or procure to be exported. transported, carried or conveyed, out of or from any Port or Place in Great Britain, or load or lay on Board, or cause or procure to be loaded or laid on Board of any Ship, Veffel or Boat, in order to be exported or carried out of any Port or Place in Great Britain, any Wheat or Wheat Flour .- His Majesty nevertheless, by the Advice aforesaid, hath thought fit to order, and doth hereby order, that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be construed to extend, to prohibit the Exportation of any Foreign Wheat or Wheat Flour, which shall have been imported into this Kingdom, and warehoused in the Manner and upon the Conditions mentioned in an Act passed in the Thirty-first Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, " An Act for regu-" lating the Importation and Exportation of Corn, " and the Payment of the Duty on Foreign Corn " imported, and of the Bounty on British Corn ex-" ported;" nor to prohibit the carrying Coastwife, or the carrying out and exporting of Wheat and Wheat Flour, in the Manner and in the fame Proportions and Quantities, and from and to the same Ports and Places, as is by the faid Act allowed, at fuch Times as Wheat and Wheat Flour are prohibited to be exported, by reason of the Price of Wheat and Wheat Flour being at or above the Prices mentioned in Table B. in the faid Act contained, subject to the like Securities, Conditions, Regulations and Restrictions, Forseitures and Penalties, as are required and imposed by the faid Act, or by any other Act now in Force, in any of the Cases aforesaid, -And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary Directions herein accordingly.
