THEREAS there was this Day read at the Board, a Report from the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council appointed for the Confideration of all Matters relating to Trade and Foreign Plantations, proposing that all Ships and Veffels clearing out for the Coaft of Africa for Trade, should be permitted to take on Board and export fuch Quantities of Gunpowder, Arms and Ammunition, as shall be necessary for their respective Voyages; His Majesty, having taken the faid Report into Confideration, was pleafed, with the Advice His Privy Council, to order, as it is hereby ordered, that all Ships and Veffels clearing out for the Coaft of Africa, for the Purpofe of carrying on the Trade there, be permitted to take on Board, as an afforted Part of their Cargoes, as much Gunpowder and as large a Quantity of trading Guns, Piftols, Cutlaffes, Flints and Lead Balls, Bars and Shot, as the Exporters shall think necessary, notwithstanding any Thing contained in His Majesty's Order in Council of the 7th of this inftant December; provided that fufficient Security be given to the Principal Officers of His Majefty's Cultoms of the Port in which the Ships are fitted out, and before they proceed upon their refpective Voyages, in Treble the Value of the Articles exported, that the fame

Proof of fuch Expenditure has been made by the Oath of the Captain or Mafter of the Ship or Veffel, in like Manner as is practifed with Regard to Spirits and East India Goods used in carrying on that Trade: And His Majesty is further pleafed to order, that all Ships and Veffels trading to the faid Coaft, be allowed to take on Board, for their Defence, whatever Quantity of Carriage-Guns, Swivels and Small Arms, shall be judged proper by the refpective Mafters thereof; provided that no greater Quantity be taken on Board any One Ship for her Defence, than Twelve Carriage Guns and Twelve Swivels, together with One Mulquet or Blunderbufs, One Pair of Piftols, and One Cutlafs, for every Perfon of which the Ship's Company shall confift, and Ammunition in Proportion; and provided alfo that fufficient Security be in the like Manner given to the faid Principal Officers of the Cuftoms at the Ports where the Ships shall be fitted out, in Treble the Value of the Carriage Guns, Swivels and Small Arms, fo taken on Board for the Defence of the Ships, to bring back the faid Carriage Guns, Swivels and Small Arms, when the Voyage is compleated, and to account, upon Oath, for the Expenditure of the Ammunition : And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treafury are to give the necessary Directions herein accordingly.

HEREAS there was this Day read at the Board, a Report from the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council, appointed for the Confideration of all Matters relating to Trade and Foreign Plantations, humbly fubmitting to His Majefty, at this Board, that it will tend greatly to the Advantage of Trade for a general Order in Council to be iffued to permit and allow Salt Petre and Gunpowder to be carried Coastwife, in finall Quantities, under certain Refrictions to be preferibed by the faid Order; His Majerty, taking the fame into Confideration, is hereby pleased, with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order that Salt Petre and Gunpowder be permitted to be carried Coaftwife to and from any of the Ports of this Kingdom, notwithftanding any Thing contained in His Majelly's Order in Council of the 7th of this inftant December ; provided that no greater Quantity of Salt Petre and Gunpowper be shipped, or laden or carried Costawife, at any One Time, in any One Ship or Vefiel, than One Ton of Salt Petre and Fifty Barrels of Gunpowder, except fuch as shall be shipped, laden and carried Coaftwife by Direction of the Mafter-General, Lieutenant-General, and Principal Officers of the Ordnance, for His Majesty's Service; and alfo except fuch as shall be shipped, laden and carried Coastwife, under Leave or Permission in that Behalf from His Majefty, or His Privy Conneil; and provided also that sufficient Security be first given to the proper Officers of His Majefty's Cuftoms, in Treble the Value of the Salt Petre and Gunpowder intended to be fent Coastwife, to carry the fame to the Places proposed, and none other; and that a Certificate or Certificates be produced, within Two Months from the Date of the Bond, from the proper Officers of the Customs at the Ports for which the respective Quantities of Salt Petre and Gunpowder shall be shipped, of the fame having been duly landed at fuch Forts; in Failure of which the Bonds to be immediately put in Suit; which Certificate or Tertificates the Commiffioners of the Cuftoms are hereby required to transmit to the Lords Commissionzers of His Majefty's Treasury, in order to be laid before this Board : And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are so give the necessary Directions herein accordingly. The KING's Moft Excellent Majefty in Council.

HEREAS His Majefty was gracioufly pleafed, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the First Day of this inftant December, to promife and declare, that a Bounty of Three Pounds fhould be paid to every Able Seaman, and of Two Pounds to every Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, fit for His Majefty's Service; and a Bounty of Twenty Shillings to all fuch Able-bodied Landmen, not above the Age of Thirty-five, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should, on or before the Thirty-first Day of this instant December, voluntarily enter themfelves to ferve in His Majefty's Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of His Majesty's Ships, or Officers employed on Shore for raising Men for the Service of His Majefty's Navy: And whereas the Time limited for Payment of the faid Bounties is near expiring; and it being judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, that the faid Bounties should continue to be paid for fome Time longer, His Majefty, with the Advice of His, Privy Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Time limited for Payment of the faid Bounties be prolonged and extended from the faid Thirty-first Day of this iuflant December, to the Twenty-eighth Day of February next, inclufive: Whereof all Perfons concerned are to take. Notice, and govern themfelver accordingly.

As several Artificers and Manufosturers, Saljasts of Great Britain, have, from Time to Time, gone into Foreign Countries to exercise their several Callings, contrary to the Laws of thefe Kingdoms; the follow; ing Abstracts of Alls of Parliamen; of Their late Majeflies King George the First and Second, and of His prefent Majefty, for prev nting fuch Practices, are published, for the Information of all Perfons who may be ignorant of the Penalties they may incur by Difobelience to them : And it will be observed, that fuch Penalties likewije extend to those who are any ways concerned or influmental in the Sending or Enticing Artificers or Manufacturers out of these Kiugdoms, or in the Exportation of the Tools and Instruments used by thems, as well as to the Artificers or Manufasturers themselves.

Statute 5 George I. Chap. 27.

F any Perfor fhall contract with, entice, or folicit, 1 any Artificer in Wool, Iron, Steel, Brafs, or other Metal, Clock-maker. Watch-maker, or any other Artificer of Great Britaia, to go into Foreign Countries out of the King's Dominions, and shall be convicted thereof, upon Indictment or Information, in any of the Courts at Weftminster, or at the Affizes or Quarter-Schons, he shall be fined any Sum not exceeding ONE HUNDRED POUNDS for the first Offence, and shall be imprisoned Three Months; and till the Fine be paid. And if any Perfon having been once convided fall offend again, he shall be fined at the Discretion of the Court, and imprifoned Twelve Months, and till the Fiac be paid.

If any of the King's Subjects, being fuch Artificers, shall go into any Country out of His Majefty's Dominions, to exercise or teach the faid Trades to Foreigners; and if any of the King's Subjects in any fuch Foreign Country, exercifing any of the faid Trades, fhall not return into this Realm within Six Months after Warning given by the Ambaffador, Minister dr Confuliof Great Britain, in the Country where fuch Artificers shall be, or by any Perfon authorifed by fuch Atabaflador, &c. or by one of the Secretaries of State, and from henceforth inhabit within this Realm ; fuch Ferfons fhall be incapable of taking any Legacy, or of being an Executor or Administrator, or of taking any Lands, &c. within this Kingdom, by Defent, De-vile or Purchafe, and fhall forfeit sl! Lands, Goods, &c. within this Kingdom, to Bis Majefty's Ufe, and shall be deemed Alien, and out of His Majefty's Protection.

Upon Complaint made, anon Oath, befets any Juffice of Peace, that any Perfon is cadeavour-ing to feduce any fuch Archeer, or that any fuch Artificer hath contracted or is preparing to go out of His Majelty's Dominions, for the Pyrpoles alore-faid, fuch Justice may fend his Warrant to bring the Perlon complained of before him, or before fome other Justice; and if it shall appear by the Oath of one Witness, or by Confession, that he was guilty of any of the faid Offences, fuch Juffice may bind him to appear at the next Affizes or Quarter Seffons : And, if fuch Perfon thall refuse to give Security, the Justice may commit him to Goal till the

fuch Artificer shall be convided, epon Indictment, of any fuch Promife, Contract, or Preparation to go beyond the Seas, for the Purpole aforefail, he fhalt give such Security to the King not to depart out of His Majefly's Dominions, as such Court shall think reasonable, and shall be imprisoned till Security given.

If any of the above Offen ces shall be committed in Scotland, the fame shall be prefecuted in the Court of Juiliciary, or the Circuit, there,

Statute 23 George II. Chap. 13.

IF any Person shall contract with, or endeavour to feduce any Artificer in Wool, Mohair, Corton or Silk, or in Iron, Steel, Brafs, or other Metal, or any Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other Artificer in any other of the Manufactures of Great Britain or Ireland, to go out of this Kingdom or Ireland, into any Foreign Country not within the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain, and shall be convicted, upon indictment or Information, in the King's Bench at Weffminster, or by Indictment at the Affizes of General Gaol Delivery for the County, &c. wherein such Offence shall be committed in England, or by Indictment in the Coert of Jufficiary, or any of the Circuit Courts in Scotland, or by Indicament or Information in the King's Bench at Dublin, if, such Offence be committed in Ireland ; the Perfon fo convicted fhall, for every Artificer contracted with, or feduced, forfeit FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS, and fall fuffer Imprifonment in the Common Goal of the County or Stewartry wherein füch Offender shall be convicted, for Twelve Calendar Months, and until Forfeiture be paid : And in Cafe of a fublequeat Offence of the fame Kind, the Persons to again offending ftall forfeit, for every Person contracted with or feduced, ONE THOUSAND POUNDS, and thall fuffer Imprifonment in the Common Gaol of the County or Stewartry wherein fuch Offend r fhall be convicted, for Two Years, and until fach

Forfeiture be paid. If any Perfon in Great Britain or Ireland shall put on Board any Ship or Boat, not bound directly to ome Port in Great Britain or Ireland, or to fome other of the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain, any luch Tools or Utenfils as are commonly afed in, or proper for the Preparing, Working up or Fisishing of the Woollen or Silk Manufactures 62 any Part of fuch Tools, he iball, for every Offence, forfeit all fuch Tools, or Parts thereof, put on Board, and TWO HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered by Action of Debt, &c. in any Court of Record at Weltmialler, or in the Court of Seffion in Scotland, or at any of the Four Courts in Deblin respectively, wherein no Efficin, &c. thall be allowed.

It shall be lawful for any Officer of the Cultoms in Great Britain, or for any Officer of the Revenue in Ireland, to feize and fecture, in fome of His Ma-effy's Warehouses, all fuch Tools or Utenfils prohibited to be exported, as fuch Officer shall find on Board any Vefici not bound directly to fome Port in Great Britain or Ireland, or to some other of the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain ; and 11 next Affizes or Quarter Seffions, and until he shall Tools fo feized shall, after Condemnation, be pub-be delivered by due Course of Law. And if any lickly fold to the best Bidder; and one Morely of

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the Produce shall be to the Use of His Majesty, and the other Moiety to the Officer who shall feize and fecure the fame.

If the Captain of any Veffel in Great Britain or Ireland knowingly permit any of the faid Tools, prohibited to be exported, to be put on Board his Vesiel, he shall, for every such Offence, forfeitONE HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered as the Penalties inflicted upon Perfons exporting the Tools; and, if the Veffel belongs to His Majefty, the Castain fhall not only foreit ONE HUN-DFED POUNDS, but fiall also forfeit his Empoyment, and be incapable of any Employment under His Majefty

if any Officer of the Cuftoms in Great Britzin, or of the Revenue in Ireland, take, or knowingly fuffer to be taken, any Entry outward, or high any Cocket or Sufferance for the Shipping or Exporting of any of the faid Tools, or knowingly fuffer the fame to be done, he shall rorfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered as aforefaid, and alfo forfeit his Office, and be incapable of any Office under His MajeAy.

One Moiety of the Forfeitures shall be applied to the Use of His Majesty, and the other Moiery to the Ufe of the Perfon who shall fue for the fame.

Statutes 14, 21, 25 and 26 of His prefent Majefiy.

BY these Statutes the like Penalties and Forfeitures as above mentioned are extended to Perfons packing or putting on board any Veffel, not bound directly for fome Port in Great Britain or Ireland, any Machine, Engine, Tool, Prefs, Paper, Utensil or Implement whatsoever, used in or proper for the working or finithing of the Cotton, Linen, Steel or Iron Manufactures of this Kingdom, or any Part or Parts of fuch Machines or Implements, or any Models or Plans thereof; and all Captains of Ships and other Perfons receiving or being in Possession of any fuch Articles, with an Intent to export the fame to Foreign Parts, and all Cultom-house Officers fuffering an Entry to be made thereof, are respectively liable to the like Penalties as are above mentioned, in the Cafe of Tools and Utenfils used in the Woollen and Silk Manufactures.
