## Westminster, January 8.

HIS Day the Lords being met, a Meffage was fent to the Honourable Houfe of Commons by Sir Francis Molyneux, Knt. Gentleman Ufher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that The Lords, authorized by virtue of His Majefhy's Commiffion for declaring His Royal Affent to feveral Acts agreed upon by both Houfes, do defire the immediate Attendance of this Honourable Houfe in the Houfe of Peers, to hear the Commiffion read; and the Commons being come thither, the faid Commiffion, impowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, and feveral other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Affent to the faid Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Affent given to

An AEI for establishing Regulations respecting Aliens arriving in this Kingdom, or resident therein, in certain Cases.

An Act to prohibit the Circulation of Promiffory or other Notes, Orders, Undertakings or Obligations for the Payment of any Sum or Sums of Money, or for any other Confideration created and iffued under or in the Name of any Public Authority in France.

An Act for indemnifying all Perfors nobo bave been concerned in advifing or carrying into Execution an Order of Council refpecting the Exportation of Wheat and Wheat Flour; for preventing Suits in confequence of the fame, and for making further Provisions relative thereto; and alfo for authorizing His Majefty to prohibit the Exportation of Corn, Meal, Flour, Bread, Bifcuit and Potatoes, and to permit the Importation of Corn, Meal or Flour, on the Low Duties.

An Act to enable His Majesty to restrain the Exportation of Naval Stores, and more effectually to prevent

the Exportation of Salt Petre, Arms and Ammunition, when prohibited by Proclamation or Order in Council.

An Act for the further Relief of Debtors, with Refpect to the Impriforment of their Perfons, and to oblige Debtors, who fhall continue in Execution in Prifox beyond a certain Time, and for Sums not exceeding what are mentioned in the Act, to make Difcovery of, and deliver upon Qath, their Eftates for their Credites Benefit.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS by an Act paffed in the Twentyeighth Year of the Reign of His prefent Majefty, intituled, "An Act for regulating the Trade " between the Subjects of His Majefty's Colonies " and Plantations in North America and in the " West India Islands, and the Countries belonging 11 to the United States of America, and between " His Majefly's faid Subjects and the Foreign Islands " in the West Indies," it is, amongst other Things, enacted, That it shall and may be lawful for His Majesty in Council, by Order or Orders to b iffued and published from Time to Time, to authorize, or by Warrant or Warrants, under His Sign Manual, to impower the Governor of Newfoundland for the Time being to authorize, in cafe of Neceffity, the Importation into Newfoundland of Bread, Flour, Indian Corn, and Live Stock, from any of the Territories belonging to the faid United State

States, for the Supply of the Inhabitants and Fishermen of the Island of Newfoundland, for the then enfuing Seafon only; provided always, that fuch Bread, Flour, Indian Corn, and Live Stock, fo authorized to be imposted into the Island of Newfoundland, shall not be imported except in conformity to fuch Rules, Regulations and Reffrictions as shall be specified in such Order or Orders, Warrant or Warrants, relpectively, and except by British Subjects and in British-built Ships owned by His Majefly's Subjects, and navigated according to Law. And whereas it is expedient and neceffary that Provision be made for fully supplying the Inhabitants and Fishermen of the Island of Newfoundland, for the enfuing Seafon, with Bread, Flour, and Indian Corn; His Majefty doth thereupon, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order and declare, That, for the Supply of the Inhabitants and Fishermen of the Island of Newfoundiand, for the enfuing Seafon only, Bread, Flour and Indian Corn be imported into the faid Island from any of the Territories belonging to the faid United Gtates; by Britifh Subjects, and in Britifh-built Ships owned by His Majefly's Subjects, and navigated according to Law, and which shall, within the Space of Seven Months previous to the Time of fuch Importation, have cleared out from fome Port in Great Britain, or fome other Port of His Majefty's Dominions in Europe, for which Purpole a Licence Chall have been granted by the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs in England or Scotland, or the Commissioners of His Majesty's Revenue in Ireland, or any other Perfon or Perfons who may be duly authorized in that Kingdom respectively, in the Manner and Form herein after mentioned ; which Licences shall continue and be in Force for Seven Calendar Months from the Day of the Date upon which they are respectively granted, and no longer; provided that no fuch Licence as aforefaid, granted after the Thirtieth Day of June, One Thouland Seven Hundred and Ninety-three, shall be of any Force or Effect : And His Majefly is hereby further pleased to order, That the Master, or Person having the Charge or Command of any Ship or Veffel to whom fuch Licence shall be granted, shall, upon the Arrival of the faid Ship or Veffel at the Port, Harbour or Place in the Island of Newfoundland where he shall discharge such Bread, Flour, or Indian Corn, deliver up the faid Licence to the Collector or other proper Officer of the Cuftoms there, having first inderfed on the Back of fuch Licence the Marks, Numbers and Contents of each Package of Bread, Flour, or Ludian Corn, under ]

the Penalty of the Forfeiture in the faid Act mentioned. And the Collector or other proper Officer of the Cuftoms at Newfoundland is hereby enjoined and required to give a Certificate to the Mafter, or Perfon<sup>s</sup> having the Charge or Command of fuch Ship or Veffel, of his having received the faid Licence, fo indorfed as before directed, and to transmit the fame to the Commissioners of His Majefty's Cuftoms in England or Scotland, or to the Commissioners of His Majefty's Revenue in Ireland, respectively, by whom fuch Licence was granted.

Flour, or Indian Corn, and shall thereupon receive] a Certificate thereof from the faid Collector or other proper Officer of the Cuftoms.

JOHN Christian Curwen and Wilfon Braddyll, Esquires, having this Day presented their Petition to the House of Commons, fetting forth, that, on the 3d Day of March, in the Year 1791, a Select Committee of this Houfe, appointed to try and determine the Merits of a Petition of the faid John Christian Curwen and Wilfon Braddyll, and alfo of another Petition on the Part of, and fubfcribed by, feveral other Perfons, Freemen and Citizens of the City of Carlisle in the County of Cumberland, and having a Right to vote in the Election of Citizens to ferve in Parliament for the faid City, feverally complaining of an undue Election and Return for the City of Carlifle, reported to this Houfe their final Determination on the Merits of those Petitions; and did at the fame Time also report to this House, that it appeared to the faid Select Committee, that the Merits of the faid Petitions did, in Part, depend upon the Right of Election for the faid City, and that thereupon the faid Committee had required the Counfel for the feveral Parties to deliver to the Clerk of the faid Committee Statements in Writing of the Right of Election for which they refpectively contended ; That in Confequence thereof the Counfel for the faid John Christian Curwen and Wilson Braddyll, and also for the faid other Petitioners, the Freemen and Family and Government, and to the Conflitution of Citizens of the faid City of Carlifle; having a Right
