HIS Day the Lords being met, a Meffage was fent to the Honourable Houfe of Commons by Sir Francis Molyneux, Knt. Gentleman Ufher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that The Lords, authorized by virtue of His Majefty's Commiftion for declaring His Royal Affent to feveral Acts agreed upon by both Houfes, do defire the immediate Attendance of this Honourable Houfe in the Houfe of Peers, to hear the Commiftion read; and the Commons being come thither, the faid Commiftion, impowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, and feveral other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Affent to the faid Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Affent given to

An AEI for establishing Regulations respecting Aliens arriving in this Kingdom, or resident therein, in certain Cases.

An Act to prohibit the Circulation of Promiffory or other Notes, Orders, Undertakings or Obligations for the Payment of any Sum or Sums of Money, or for any other Confideration created and iffued under or in the Name of any Public Authority in France.

An Act for indemnifying all Perfors nobo bave been concerned in advifing or carrying into Execution an Order of Council refpecting the Exportation of Wheat and Wheat Flour; for preventing Suits in confequence of the fame, and for making further Provisions relative thereto; and alfo for authorizing His Majefty to prohibit the Exportation of Corn, Meal, Flour, Bread, Bifcuit and Potatoes, and to permit the Importation of Corn, Meal or Flour, on the Low Duties.

An Act to enable His Majesty to restrain the Exportation of Naval Stores, and more effectually to prevent

the Exportation of Salt Petre, Arms and Ammunition, when prohibited by Proclamation or Order in Council.

An Act for the further Relief of Debtors, with Refpect to the Impriforment of their Perfons, and to oblige Debtors, who fhall continue in Execution in Prifox beyond a certain Time, and for Sums not exceeding what are mentioned in the Act, to make Difcovery of, and deliver upon Qath, their Eftates for their Credites Benefit.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS by an Act paffed in the Twentyeighth Year of the Reign of His prefent Majefty, intituled, "An Act for regulating the Trade " between the Subjects of His Majefty's Colonies " and Plantations in North America and in the " West India Islands, and the Countries belonging 11 to the United States of America, and between " His Majefly's faid Subjects and the Foreign Islands " in the West Indies," it is, amongst other Things, enacted, That it shall and may be lawful for His Majesty in Council, by Order or Orders to b iffued and published from Time to Time, to authorize, or by Warrant or Warrants, under His Sign Manual, to impower the Governor of Newfoundland for the Time being to authorize, in cafe of Neceffity, the Importation into Newfoundland of Bread, Flour, Indian Corn, and Live Stock, from any of the Territories belonging to the faid United State
