St. James's, January 15. HIS Day Their Majesties, with Their Royal Highneffes the Princeffes, removed from Windfor to the Queen's Palace, to refide during the Winter.

#### St. James's, January 18.

This Day being appointed for the Celebration of the Anniverlary of the Queen's Birth-Day, there was a very numerous and fplendid Appearance of the No-bility, Foreign Ministers, and other Perfons of Di-flinction, to compliment Their Majeflies on the Oc-casion. The Guns in the Park and at the Tower were fired at One o'Clock. In the Evening there was Ball at Courts and University of the Detries a Ball at Court; and Illuminations and other Public Demonstrations of Joy in London and Weitminster.

#### Dublin-Cafile, January 10.

AHIS Day the Parliament having met, accor-I ding to Prorogation, his Excellency the Lord Licutement went in State to the House of Peer, and being feated on the Throne with the ufual Solemnity, the Honourable Henry Fane, Gentleman Uther of the Black Rod, was fent with a Meffage from his Excellency to the Houfe of Commons, fignifying his Plesfure that they should immediately attend his Excellency in the House of Peers: The Commons being come thicher accordingly, his Excellency made the following Speech :

## My Lords, and Genilemen,

I Have His Majesty's Commands to meet you in Parliament, and to express His Satisfaction in reforting to your Counsels in the present Situation of Affairs.

His Majesty feels the utmost Concern that various Attempts flould have been made to excite a Spirit of Difcontent and Diffurbance, and that Appearances fhould have manifested themselves in any Part of this Kingdom, of a Defign to effect by Violence an Alteration in the Constitution.

It is an additional G ound of Uneafinefs to His Majefty, that Views of Conquest and Dominion should have incited France to interfere with the Government of other Countries, and to adopt Meafures, with regard to His Majefty's Allies the States General, neither conformable to the Law of Nations, nor the politive Stipulations of existing Treaties; especially when both His Majesty and the States General had obferved the ftricteft Neutrality with regard to the Affairs of France. Under these Circumstances, I have ordered, by

His Majefty's Commands, an Augmentation of the Forces upon this Establishment.

By the Advice of the Privy Council, Measures have been taken to prevent the Exportation of Corn, Provisions and Naval Stores, Arms and Ammunition. The Circumstances, which rendered thef: Measures neceflary, will, I truft, juttify any temporary Infringement of the Laws, and will induce you to give them a Parliamentary Sanction.

It will afford His Majefty the greatest Satisfaction if, by a temperate and firm Conduct, the Bleffings of Peace can be continued; but He feels affured of your zealous Concurrence in His Determination to provide for the Security and Interefts of His Dominions, and to fulfil those positive Eligagements, to which He is equally bound by the Honour of His Crown and the general Interests of the Empire.

#### Gentlemen of the Houfe of Commons,

I have ordered the National Accounts to be laid before you, and I have no Doubt of your Readiness to grant such Supplies for the Public Service, as the Honour and Security of His Majefty's Crown and Government, and the Exigences of the Times, may require.

#### My Lords, and Gentlemen,

The Agriculture, the Manufactures, and particularly the Linen Manufactures, the Protestant Charter-Schools and other Public Inflitutions, which have fo repeatedly been the Objects of your Care, will, I doubt not, engage your accustomed Regard and Liberality.

I am to recommend to you, in His Majesty's Name, to adopt fuch Measures as may be most adviseable for the Maintenance of internal Tranquillity, and for this Purpose to render more effectual the Law for eftablishing a Militia in this Kingdom.

His Majefty has the fulleft Confidence that you will, on all Occasions, shew your firm Determination to enforce due Obedience to the Laws, and to maintain the Authority of Government, in which you may depend upon His Majefty's cordial Co-operation and Support : And I have it in particular Command from His Majesty, to recommend it to you to apply yourselves to the Confideration of such Measures as may be most likely to strengthen and cement a general Union of Sentiment among all Claffes and Defcrip-tions of His Majefty's Subjects in Support of the established Conflictution : With this View His Ma-jefty trufts that the Situation of His Majefty's Catholic Subjects will engage your ferious Attention ; and in the Confideration of this Subject He relies on the Wifdom and Liberality of His Parliament.

I am truly fensible of the repeated Teffimonies which I have received of your Approbation, and I will endeavour to merit a Continuance of your good Opinion, by ftrenuoufly exerting the Power with which I am entrufted for the Maintenance of our excellent Constitution in Church and State, as the best Security for the Liberty of the Subject and the Prosperity of Ireland.
