The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in this present Session of Parliament; intituled; "An Act " to enable His Majesty to restrain the Exportation " of Naval Stores, and more effectually to prevent " the Exportation of Salt-Petre; Arms and Ammu- " nition, when prohibited by Proclamation or Order " in Council," it is enacted, amongst other Things, that His Majesty may, by Proclamation or Order in Council, when he shall see Cause, and for such Time as shall be therein expressed, prohibit the exporting, or the attempting to export, Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rosin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet Copper, and other Naval Stores: And His Majesty, judging it necessary to prohibit the Exportation of the said several Articles for a limited Time, doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit and command, that no Person or Persons whatsoever do, at any Time during the Space of Six Months from the Date of this Order in Council; presume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rosin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet Copper, or other Naval Stores; or do ship or lade any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rosin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet Copper, or other Naval Stores, on Board any Ship or Vessel, in

order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, without Leave or Permission first being had and obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring the Forfeitures inflicted by the aforementioned Act: But it is, nevertheless, His Majesty's Pleasure; that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be construed to extend, to any of His Majesty's Ships of War, or any other Ships, or Vessels or Boats, in the Service of His Majesty, or employed or freighted by His Majesty's Board of Ordnance, or by the Commissioners of His Majesty's Navy; nor to prevent any Ship or Vessel from taking or having on Board such Quantities of Naval Stores as may be necessary for the Use of such Ship or Vessel during the Course of her intended Voyage; or by Licence from the Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, or the Commissioners of the Admiralty for the Time being; nor to the Exportation of the said several Articles to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Yards or Garrisons, or to His Majesty's Colonies or Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Forts and Settlements on the Coasts of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies; provided, that upon the Exportation of any of the said Articles, for the Purposes of Trade, to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Yards and Garrisons, or to His Majesty's Colonies and Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to the Island of Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Forts and Settlements on the Coasts of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies, the Exporters of such Articles do first make Oath of the true Destination of the same, to the Places for which they shall be entered Outwards;

wards, before the Entry of the same shall be made, and do give full and sufficient Security by Bond, to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs, to carry the said Articles to the Places for which they are so entered Outwards, and for the Purposes specified, and none other; and such Bond shall not be cancelled or delivered up until Proof be made, to the Satisfaction of the said Commissioners, by the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the said Commissioners and specified in the Bond, of a Certificate or Certificates, in such Form and Manner as shall be directed by the said Commissioners, shewing that the said Articles have been duly landed at the Places for which they were entered Outwards:—And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

WHEREAS, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the last Session of Parliament, intituled, "An Act for regulating the Allowance of the Drawback and Payment of the Bounty on the Exportation of Sugar and Coffee into the Bahama and Bermuda Islands in Foreign Ships," His Majesty was pleased, with the Advice of His Privy Council, by His Order in Council, bearing Date the 15th of June, 1792, to approve of the Port of Exuma, in the Island of Exuma, one of the said Bahama Islands, and of the Port of St. George and the Port of Pembroke, in the said Island of Bermuda, to be Ports for the Importation of Sugar and Coffee, the Produce of any Foreign Country or Plantation, subject to the Regulations prescribed in the Acts of the Twenty-seventh and Thirtieth Years of His Majesty's Reign, mentioned in the said Order in Council: And whereas it has been represented to His Majesty at this Board, that it will better answer the Purposes of the said Act, that the Port of Hamilton, in the Harbour of Crow Lane, in the said Island of Bermuda, should be approved as the Port for the Importation of Sugar and Coffee, the Produce of any Foreign Country or Plantation, instead of Pembroke, mentioned in the said Order. His Majesty is thereupon pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby to revoke and make void so much of the afore recited Order as approved of the Port of Pembroke (therein mentioned) for the Importation of Sugar and Coffee, the Produce of any Foreign Country or Plantation. And His Majesty is further pleased, with the Advice aforesaid, to ap-

prove of the Port of Hamilton, in the Harbour of Crow Lane, in the Island of Bermuda, to be a Port for the Importation of Sugar and Coffee, the Produce of any Foreign Country or Plantation, subject to the Regulations prescribed in the Two Acts last mentioned in the afore recited Order in Council of the 15th Day of June, 1792.

THESE are, by Order of the Right Honourable the Lords and others Commissioners for managing the Affairs of the Royal Hospital at Chelsea, to give Notice, that His Majesty has been pleased to order that all Out-Pensioners (the Cavalry, Letter-Men, such as by the Hospital Books are upwards of Fifty Years of Age, those who have served Twenty-five Years in the Army previous to their Discharges, as well as all those who may be blind, or have lost their Limbs excepted) belonging to the said Hospital, and residing in London, or within the Distance of Twenty-five Miles thereof, do personally and regimentally appear at the said Hospital on the several respective Days as are undermentioned and appointed for them, and when and where Attendance will be given from Nine o'Clock in the Morning till Three in the Afternoon, in order to be examined by a Board, to be held for the Purpose of their being sent to Garrison only.
