The humble Address of the Gentlemen, Clergy, Land-Owners, and other Inhabitants, North of the Sands, in the County Palatine of Lancaster.

Most Gracious Sovereign

WE, the Gentlemen, Clergy, Land-Owners, and other Inhabitants, North of the Sands, in the County Palatine of Lancaster, whose Names are hereunto subscribed, presume to come forward in the present interesting Situation of this Kingdom with a public Testimony of our Loyalty; and beg Leave to assure your Majesty, with a Warmth and Freedom becoming the British Character,

That our Attachment to your Royal Person and Family, and our Love and Veneration for the esta-

blished Government, are unshaken.

That we feel an equal Abhorrence of Tyranny, whatever Shape it may assume, and are as tenacious of our just Liberty as we are indignant at the Insults offered it's facred Name.

That, highly fensible of the superior Blessings we enjoy under this mild and happy Constitution, and persuaded of it's Competency to make them permanent, we think it a Duty we over Country, ourselves, and Posterity, to abide by and support the fame by every Means in our Power.

Animated with these Sentiments, we do most cor-dially unite in expressing our utter Detestation of the infamous and wicked Practices which have been manifestly intended to diffuse a licentious and levelling Disposition through all Ranks of your Majesty's Subjects, and particularly calculated to stir up in the Minds of the Vicious and the Ignorant a Spirit of Discontent, Disobedience to the Laws, and Contempt of the Constitution.

With Hearts, therefore, full of Gratitude, we humbly offer our unfeigned Thanks to your Majesty for the late well-timed Instances of your Royal Wifdom, Prudence, and paternal Regard for the Welfare of your People; which, strengthened by the com-bined Efforts of your dutiful Subjects, we trust will effectually crush the pernicious Designs of the Ene-mies to our Peace and Prosperity.

Firmly perfuaded that the House of Brunswick will never separate it's Interests from those of the People, we conside in your Majesty's unremitting Vigilance and Exertions to maintain this invaluable Constitution, and to protect your faithful Subjects in that greatest of human Blessings, the secure Enjoyment of their Religious and Civil Liberties, which must ever command the Lives and Fortunes of a free and grateful People, in Defence of your Majesty's Person and Family.

That your Majesty may long reign over a happy and united People, is the sincere Prayer of, may it please your Majesty, your Majesty's most faithful and
