And we profess our sincere Attachment to that Form of Government established at the Revolution, consisting of King, Lords and Commons, under which our Ancestors and we have enjoyed so much Happiness, and which we earnestly wish may be handed down unimpaired to our Posterity. We will also discourage and oppose every malicious and insidious Attempt that may be made by wicked and designing Men to mislead the Minds of your Majesty's Subjects, under whatever specious Pretence, as we have a firm Reliance that the Wisdom and Virtue of your Majesty's Councils will, in the present very important Period, be employed in pursuing those Measures which shall ultimately redound to the Honor and Welfare of these Kingdoms.
