Three Deputy Lieutenants for the County of Lancaster, do, in the Absence of the Lord Lieutenant, hereby give Notice to all and every the Militia Men for the said County, as well those who now are serving, as also those who have been lately enrolled, that they are required personally to be and appear in the Market-Place, in the Town of Preston, on Tuesday the 12th Day of February next, by Eleven o'Clock in the Forenoon, to be drawn out and embodied as aforesaid: And if any Militia Man (not labouring under any In-
