To the KING's Most Excellent Majesty,

The humble Address of the Gentlemen, Clergy, Merchants, Bankers, Traders and other Inhabitants of the Town and Neighbourhood of Derby.

S I R E,

WE, your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal Subjects, the Gentlemen, Clergy, Merchants, Bankers, Traders and other Inhabitants of the Town and Neighbourhood of Derby, being deeply impressed with a proper Sense of the invaluable Blessings which we enjoy under our glorious Constitution, consisting of King, Lords and Commons, and perceiving, with the deepest Concern, that Attempts are made to circulate Opinions contrary to the dearest Interest of the People, feel it a Duty we owe to our Country, Ourselves and our Posterity, to invite all our Fellow Subjects to join with us in the Expression of a sincere and firm Attachment to your Majesty and the Constitution; a Constitution wisely framed for the Diffusion of Happiness, and which possesses the distinguished Merit that it has on former Occasions been, and we trust will in future be found competent to correct it's Errors and reform it's Abuses.

We therefore feel ourselves impelled to declare to your Majesty our determined Resolution to support, by every Means in our Power, the antient and most excellent Constitution of Great Britain, and to exert our best Endeavours to impress on the Minds of the People a Reverence for and due Submission to the Laws of our Country; and that we will do all in our Power to aid and assist the Civil Magistrate in maintaining the general Tranquillity, in suppressing all Riots and Disturbances from whatever Quarters they may arise, in bringing the Authors and Promoters to Punishment, and in discovering and bringing to Justice all Persons who shall, either by publishing or distributing seditious Papers or Writings, or by engaging in any seditious or tumultuous Assembly, endeavour to disturb the Public Peace, or excite Disaffection to the lawful, mild and equitable Government of this happy Country.

That your Majesty may long continue to reign in the Hearts of a free, loyal and affectionate People, is our sincere and fervent Prayer.
