By the KING, A PROCLAMATION. GEORGER.

HEREAS Attempts may be made to feduce fome of Our Subjects, contrary to their Allegiance and Duty to Us, to enter on board French Ships or Vessels of War, or other Ships or Vessels of France, with Intent to commit Hoftilities against Us or Our Subjects, or otherwife to adhere or give Aid or Comfort to Our Enemies upon the Sea: Now We, in order that none of Our Subjects may ignorantly incur the Guilt and Penalties of fuch Breaches of their Allegiance and Duty, have thought it neceffary, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to publish this Our Royal Proclamation, hereby notifying and declaring, that all Perfons being Our Subjects, who shall enter or ferve on board any French Ships or Veffels of War, or other Ships or Veffels of France, with Intent to commit Hostilities against Us or Our Subjects, or who shall otherwife adhere or give Aid or Comfort to Our Enemies upon the Sea, will thereby become liable to fuffer the Pains of Death, and all other Pains and Penalties of High Treafon and Piracy. And We do hereby declare Our Royal Intention and firm Refolution to proceed against all fuch Offenders according to Law. Given at Our Court at St. James's, the Twentieth Day of February, 1793, in the Thirtythird Year of Our Reign.

To the KING's Moft Excellent Majefty,

The humble Addrefs of the Right Honorable the Lord Provoft, Magistrates and Council of the City of Edinburgh, in Common Council affembled.

Most Gracious Sovereign,

WE, your Majefty's moft dutiful and loyal Subjects, the Lord Provoft, Magiftrates and Council of your ancient City of Edinburgh, conceive it to be our Duty to offer to your Majefty our moft fincere Thanks for that Expression of your gracious Will, fignified to the Nation by your late Royal Message to both Houses of Parliament; a Message which intimates that, in the fame Spirit which has distinguished every Act of your Majefty's Reign, your have, in the present Emergency, taken every Step which was necessary to maintain the Honour of the British Crown, and the Rights of a brave, a loyal, and a free People.

Senfible as we are of the Bleffings of Peace, which; as a Commercial Nation, it is our Intereft to maintain, when it can be done confiftently with Public Safety and with National Honour, we fhould hold ourfelves unworthy of the Name of Britons, if in this alarming Crifis of imminent and common Danger, we did not roufe to a Man to repel the hoftile Aggreffion of an Enemy, who, after tearing to Pieces every Bond of Society within her own Dominions, has raifed a frantic Arm againft the general Peace and Happinefs of Europe; who, in Defiance of every Principle of Juffice, or of moral Feeling, while Great

Great Britain had honorably maintained a ftrid Neutrality, and generouily forbore to interfere in her domettic Arrangements, had openly countenanced the feditious Defigns of those unworthy Men, who, infensible of the Bleffings they enjoyed under thus admirable Conffitution, had traiteroully courted the Fraternity of France, and strove to differinate in this happy Country the fame infamous Principles which had involved that Nation in Milery and Ruin. Such is that Enemy whom the Circumstances of

the Safety of our Allies, the general Peace of Europe, and at length an open Declaration of War against ourfelves, now call upon us to refift with all our Force. We prepare therefore to fuffain our Part in this moft necellary War, as becomes a brave and an independent People. We devote ourfelves with manly Zeal to the Defence of our Country, in this Hour of Danger; and we will chearfully contribute our Lives and Fortunes, in a vigorous and patriotic Exertion to maintain the Honour of the British Arms, to support your Majesty's wife and equitable Government, and to preferve the Purity, Independence, and Stability of our glorious Constitution.

WE, the Inhabitants of the Town and Neighbourhood of Oldham, Lancashire, highly sensible of the Bleffings we enjoy under your Majesty's mild and equitable Government, humbly prefume to approach the Throne with the warmest Expressions of Loyalty and Gratitude for the wife and falutary Measures adopted by your Majesty for the Sup-pression of those feditious and libellous Publications which have of late difgraced the Liberty of the Prefs.

kirmly attached to your Majesty and our glorious and happy Constitution in Church and State, it is with the deepest Regret and utter Abhorrence we fee the infidious Attempts of ill-disposed Persons to diffeminate those levelling Principles that have cauled the horrid Scenes of Rebellion and Murder in a neighbouring Nation, and which, if introduced into this Kingdom, must inevitably deprive us of all an En-glishman holde most dear; his Religion, Liberty and Laws.

At the Foot of the Throne we therefore beg Leave to offer our Lives and Fortunes, which we freely devote to the Support of your Majefty's Perfon and Government.

We deplore the Fate of the late unfortuanate and much injured French Monarch, but while the fympathing Tear flows from our Eyes at the Recital of his unmerited Suffering, we reflect with redoubled Pleasure on the ineftimable Happiness of our own Situation, in being Subjects of a Sovereign, whofe private Virtues endear him to the Hearts of all his People, as much as his public Conduct commands their Admiration and Respect.

HIS Majesty's Commissioners for managing the Stamp Duties think it proper, on the near Approach of the Drawing of the Lottery, to give this Publick Notice, that the following Regulations are established by this Office, for preventing ILLEGAL INSURANCE: 1st. Pursuant to a Settlement with the Committee of City Lands, no Person will be admitted at Guildhall to

take down the Numbers as they are drawn but the Clerks of the licenfed Lottery-Office-Keepers. 2d. The Numbers are to be taken by the faid Clerks,

not, as before, on feparate Slips, but in the Numerical Book of each Office, figned by the respective Office-Keepers, and counter-figned by Two or more of the Com-

milfioners of Stamps. 3d. No Account of any Part of the Drawing in each Day is to be iffued, nor any of the Clerks to return with their Numerical Books, until the final Clofe of each Day's Drawing.

4th. By a Settlement with Mr. Steele, the Proprietor of the Patent Lift, the fame is not to be published, as beretofore,

herotofore, by Slips, in each Hour, nor by an early Account of the Drawing of each Day, (both of which Com-munications obviously contributed to the Abuses of illegal munications obviously contributed to the Addies of the gad Infurance;) but in future only Twice a Week, for the neceffary Information of the Publick at large, and at fuch Hours as the Intelligence can be least perverted for the Abufes of unlicenfed Offices, if any juck shall remain. But the Committioners truth, that, by these Regulations, and by the published Notices from the Lord Major and the Court of Aldermen, at aveil as from the Chairman the Court of Aldermen, as well as from the Chairman and the Magistrates for Westminster and the County of Middlefex; and likewife from the Magistrates of the Police, of a perfect Co-operation with this Office, the only remaining Abufe that has attached on the State Lotteries will be as totally suppressed as the Sale of illegal Chances, which is completely at an End. The illegal Chances, which is completely at an End. injuperable Difficulties that are now opposed to the illegal I ranfactions, cannot fail to difcourage the Continuance of unlicenfed Offices; and the Evidence of the Publick, that if any fuch should be continued, they must proceed without authentick Intelligence of the Drawings, can-not but prevent, to a great Degree, further Confidence being reposed in the illicit Dealers; who, on their Part, by perfifting in illegal Attempts, can only expose them-

felves, for diminipled Profits, to the increased Vigilance of the MagiAracy in the effectual Maintenance of the Law.
