THE following Addresses have been presented to the King: Which Addresses His Majesty was pleased to receive very graciously.

To the KING's Most Excellent Majesty,

The humble Address of the Provost, Magistrates, and Council of the City of Aberdeen, in Council assembled.

Most Gracious Sovereign,

WE, your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal Subjects, the Provost, Magistrates, and Council of the City of Aberdeen, humbly beg Leave to express to your Majesty our grateful Sense of your paternal Care and Attention to the permanent Interest of your faithful People, in taking such timely Steps as Circumstances have rendered necessary for maintaining the Honour of the Crown and the Freedom of the Nation.

Although we regret that the inestimable Blessings of Peace should suffer any Interruption, yet when we see an ambitious Enemy indiscriminately carrying the Ravages of War among it's surrounding Neighbours, making hostile and unprovoked Attacks on your Majesty, your Subjects, and your Allies; when we have seen that perfidious Nation openly corresponding with and countenancing some of your Majesty's Subjects in their seditious Attempts to disseminate the most pernicious Principles, tending not only to corrupt the Morals of the People, but to sap the Foundation of our happy Constitution; and when we have every Reason to believe that it cheerfully affords Shelter and Protection to such of your Majesty's Subjects as have rendered themselves obnoxious to the mild Laws of this free and happy Country, we cannot forbear to testify, in the most explicit Manner, our Sentiments of the Measures that have been taken to avert the impending Dangers. We therefore declare not only our most cordial Approbation of these Measures, but our determined Resolution to support them to the utmost of our Power. And we devoutly supplicate Almighty God, that

your Majesty's Councils may be directed with such Wisdom and Prudence, and that your Arms may be crowned with such Success, as may speedily restore Peace to this Commercial Country, a Blessing which we esteem essential to it's Happiness and Prosperity.

WE, your Majesty's loyal and dutiful Subjects, the Ministers of the Presbytery of Dunfermline, sensible of the many Blessings we enjoy, both Civil and Religious, under your Majesty's mild and equitable Government, consider it as our Duty at this critical Juncture to come forward with an open and explicit Avowal of our unfeigned Loyalty to your Majesty's sacred Person.

Thankful for these Blessings, and convinced of the Happiness we enjoy under our present free Government, consisting of King, Lords and Commons, as established at the glorious Revolution, 1688, we anxiously embrace this publick Opportunity of expressing our Horror and Detestation of the Principles of these unconstitutional Combinations of wicked, factious and designing Men, who, by their seditious Writings, have endeavoured to inflame the Minds of the ignorant and industrious, and by false Representations to render them dissatisfied and uneasy in their respective Stations, with a View to alienate the Affections of your Majesty's Subjects from their due Allegiance, and to excite Tumult and Disorder,

Sensible of your Majesty's paternal Attention to the Happiness and Welfare of your People, and for the Preservation of their Civil and Religious Liberties, we behold, with the most heartfelt Satisfaction, the Measures taken by your Majesty's Ministers at this momentous Period, as being, in

our

our Opinion, well calculated to prevent similar Scenes of Anarchy, Confusion and Blood in these happy Realms, to those which so lately obtained in a neighbouring Kingdom.

That we will, in our several Parishes, strenuously endeavour to intill into and preserve in the Minds of the People under our Care, such Loyalty to their Sovereign, Love to their Country, and Reverence for its wise and salutary Laws, as may prevent them from imbibing Principles, or entering into Associations, which are directly subversive of all good Government.

STATE LOTTERY.

Stamp-Office, Somerset-Place, Feb. 12, 1793.

HIS Majesty's Commissioners for managing the Stamp Duties think it proper, on the near Approach of the Drawing of the Lottery, to give this Publick Notice, that the following Regulations are established by this Office, for preventing ILLEGAL INSURANCE :

1st. Pursuant to a Settlement with the Committee of City Lands, no Person will be admitted at Guildhall to take down the Numbers as they are drawn but the Clerks of the licensed Lottery-Office-Keepers.

2d. The Numbers are to be taken by the said Clerks, not, as before, on separate Slips, but in the Numerical

Book of each Office, signed by the respective Office-Keepers, and counter-signed by Two or more of the Commissioners of Stamps.

3d. No Account of any Part of the Drawing in each Day is to be issued, nor any of the Clerks to return with their Numerical Books, until the final Close of each Day's Drawing.

4th. By a Settlement with Mr. Steele, the Proprietor of the Patent List, the same is not to be published, at heretofore, by Slips, in each Hour, nor by an early Account of the Drawing of each Day, (both of which Communications obviously contributed to the Abuses of illegal Insurance;) but in future only Twice a Week, for the necessary Information of the Publick at large, and at such Hours as the Intelligence can be least perverted for the Abuses of unlicensed Offices, if any such shall remain. But the Commissioners trust, that, by these Regulations, and by the published Notices from the Lord Mayor and the Court of Aldermen, as well as from the Chairman and the Magistrates for Westminster and the County of Middlesex; and likewise from the Magistrates of the Police, of a perfect Co-operation with this Office, the only remaining Abuse that has attached on the State Lotteries will be as totally suppressed as the Sale of illegal Chances, which is completely at an End. The insuperable Difficulties that are now opposed to the illegal Transactions, cannot fail to discourage the Continuance of unlicensed Offices; and the Evidence of the Publick, that if any such should be continued, they must proceed without authentick Intelligence of the Drawings, cannot but prevent, to a great Degree, further Confidence being reposed in the illicit Dealers; who, on their Part, by persisting in illegal Attempts, can only expose themselves, for diminished Profits, to the increased Vigilance of the Magistracy in the effectual Maintenance of the Law.
