The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. 7 HEREAS it is requisite, in the prefent Conjuncture of Affairs, to prevent the Exportation of falted Provisions of all Kinds, and of Butter and Cheefe, Peafe, Beans, Rice, Hay, Straw, and Forage of any Kind, and of Hides and Leather, manufactured or unmanufactured, to the Ports of France, or of any Countries occupied by the Armies employed by the Perfons exercifing the Powers of Government in France, or any of them; it is hereby ordered, by His Majesty in Council, that an Embargo be forthwith laid upon all Ships and Veffels laden or to be laden in any of the Ports of Great Britain, with falted Provisions of any Kind whatfoever, and also upon all Ships and Vessels laden or to be laden with Butter and Cheefe, Peafe, Beans, Rice, Hay, Straw, or Forage of any Kind whatfoever, and with Hides or Leather, manufactured or unmanufactured ; and that the faid Embargo do continue and remain upon all fuch Ships and Veffels until further Order : But it is His Majesty's Pleasure, that the faid Embargo shall not extend to any Ship or Vessel actually retained or employed in His Majesty's Service, nor to any Ship or Vessel which shall be laden by the especial Order and under the Direction of the Lords Commissioners of His Majefty's Treasury, or the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, or the Mafter-General of the Ordnance,

with any of the Articles above enumerated, for the Use or Suffenance of His Majesty's Fleets, Armies, Forts, and Arfenals; nor to any Ships and Veffels having on Board no greater Quantity of any of the faid Articles than shall be necessary to be carried in any fuch Ships or Vessels on their Voyage Out and Home for the Suftenance, Diet, and Support and Use of the Commander, Master, Mariners, Passengers, and others, or for the Ufe or Suftenance of the Cattle, Live Stock, or other Animals on Board of fuch Ships or Veffels; nor to any Ships or Veffels, being British Ships and Vessels, and navigated according to Law, which may be employed in carrying any of the Articles above mentioned to His Majefty's Kingdom of Ireland, or to the Iflands of Jerfey, Guernfey, Alderney, Sark, and Man, or to any Country, in or out of Europe, in Amity with His Majesty, or to any of His Majesty's Colonies and Plantations in America or the Weft Indies, or to the Island of Newfoundland, or to any of His M2jesty's Forts or Garrisons, or to His Majesty's Forts and Settlements on the Coaft of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies; provided that in all Cafes (except Cafes of Ships retained or employed in His Majefty's Service, or laden by the efpecial Order of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, or the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, or the Master-General of the Ordnance, for the Use or Sustenance of His Majesty's Fleets, Armies, Forts, and Arfenals, or fuch Ships and Veffels having on Board no greater Quantity of any of the

Suftenance of the Crew, Live Stock, and Cattle on Board the faid Ships or Veffels, in Manner hereinbefore mentioned) the Merchant Exporter of any of the faid Articles do make Cath, on the Entry of fuch Ships and Veffels, of the due Deftination thereof to the Place for which fuch Ships and Veffels shall be entered and cleared out; and do give Security by Bond, in Treble the Value of the Articles fo exported, to the proper Officers of the Cuftoms at the Port at which fuch Ships and Veffels shall enter and clear out, with Two other able and fufficient Sureties (of whom the Master of the Ship shall be One) to be approved of by the faid Officers of the Cuftoms, to produce, within Twelve Months from the Date of fuch Bond, from the proper Officer of the Cuftoms of the Port to which fuch Ships or Vefiels shall go, or, in case such Ships or Vessels shall go to a Port where there is no fuch Officer, then from the British Conful refident at fuch Port, or, in cafe there fhall be no fuch Conful there refident, or he fhall be ablent from the fame, then from Two British Merchants refident there; Certificates of their having delivered the Articles above enumerated at the Places for which they have been entered ; and no fuch Bonds or Securities shall be delivered up, but on the Production of fuch Certificates :- And it is His Majefty's further Pleafure, that the faid Embargo fhall not extend to any Ship or Veffel belonging to the Subjects of Countries in Amity with His Majefty, laden with Leather manufactured; provided that the Merchant Exporter do make Oath of the due Deftination of the Ship or Veffel to the Port for which she shall be entered and cleared out, and do give the like Security, with Two other able and fufficient Sureties, being known British Merchants, or other Perfons of acknowledged Credit, refident in this Kingdom, to produce, within Twelve Months from the Date of such Bond, from the proper Officer of the Cuftoms of the Port to which fuch Ships or Veffels shall go, or, in cafe fuch Ships or Veffels shall go to a Port where there is no fuch Officer, then from the British Conful refident at such Port, or, in case there ihall be no fuch Conful there refident, or he fhall be absent from the fame, then from Two British Merchants refident there, Certificates of their having delivered fuch manufactured Leather at the Place for which it shall have been entered; and no fuch Bonds or Securities shall be delivered up but on the Production of fuch Certificates : - And the Right Honorable the Lords Commiffioners of His Majefty's Treasury, and the Lords Commissioners of the Ad. miralty, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain, ...

Most Gracious Sovereign,

THE late vigorous and well-advifed Measures which your Majelty has wifely adopted, to support the Honor and Dignity of your Crown, and to secure our boasted Constitution, call upon us again to folicit your Majesty's Acceptance of this Testimony of our Loyalty and Gratitude.

We shall ever be ready to manifest that Loyalty and Gratitude by chearfully contributing our Aid and Affistance in such Manner as your Majesty, with the Advice of your Parliament, shall call for and direct. And as it is our undoubted Interest and Duty, so shall it be our fervent Wish, that Glory and Success may attend your Majesty's Arms; and that Britain may still maintain that exalted Charaster which she has long held among all furrounding States.

Given under the Common Seal of the faid Borough, the 8th Day of March, in the Thirtythird of your Majefty's Reign.

To the KING's Most Excellent Majesty.

WE, your Majefty's dutiful and faithful Subjects, the Nobility, Gentry, Clergy, Freeholders and other Inhabitants of the County of Northampton, humbly beg Leave to approach your Majefty with thofe Sentiments of Loyalty to your Majefty's Perfon and Government, and of Attachment to the Confliction of our Country, which every good Citizen must feel, and which the Urgency of the prefent Crifis calls on every one to exprefs.

We have learned, with Aftonifkment and Indignation, that the War in which your Majefty and the whole Nation are involved by the Aggreffion of thofe who now exercise the Powers of Government in France, has by them been stated to be the War of your Majefty's Ministers alone, and that Menaces have been held out, of a folemn Appeal from the Executive Government and Legislature, to the general Senfe of the British Nation.

We are anxious to meet or anticipate that Appeal by this publick Declaration, that the Caufe in which your Majefty is engaged is the Caufe of your People. That not only the Safety of our Allies, and the general Tranquillity of Europe, but the internal Peace of our Country, and the Security of our Laws, our our Liberty and our Religion, are equally endan-gered by the Principles and Conduct of that Affembly, which, from fecret and infidious Attempts, has now proceeded to Acts of open Holtility.

Lamenting the Preflure of that Necessity, which must occasion a temporary Interruption of the Bleffings of Peace, but convinced that Objects infinitely more dear to us than even the Extension of our Commerce and Revenue are involved in the prefent Conteft, we shall chearfully contribute to those Burdens which the Exigency of the State may require.

In fuch a Caufe we truft the united Exertions of a free, loyal and happy Nation will enable your Majefty, under the Bleffing of the Divine Providence, to vindicate and maintain with Effect the Rights and Interests of your Crown, which we shall ever deem infeparable from the Rights and Interests of your People.

By a Settlement with Mr. Steele, the Proprietor of the Patent Lift, the fame is not to be published, as hereisfore, ly Slips, in each Hour, nor by an early Ac-count of the Drawing of each Day, (both of which Communications obvioully contributed to the Abufes of illegal Informance;) but in future only Twice a Week, for the necessary Information of the Publick at large, and at fuch Hours at the Intelligence can be least perverted for the Abuses of unlicensed Offices, if any such shall remain

But the Commissioners truft, that; by these Regulations, and by the published Notices from the Lord Mayor and the Court of Aldermen, as well as from the Chairman and the Magistrates for Westminster and the County of Middlejex; and likewife from the Magistrates of the Police, of a perfect Co-operation with this Office, the only remaining Abufe that has attached on the State Lotteries will be as totally suppressed as the Sale of illegal Chances, which is completely at an End.
