P R E S E N T,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS it is requisite, in the present Conjunction of Affairs, to prevent the Exportation of salted Provisions of all Kinds, and of Butter and Cheese, Pease, Beans, Rice, Hay, Straw, and Forage of any Kind, and of Hides and Leather, manufactured or unmanufactured, to the Ports of France, or of any Countries occupied by the Armies employed by the Persons exercising the Powers of Government in France, or any of them; it is hereby ordered, by His Majesty in Council, that an Embargo be forthwith laid upon all Ships and Vessels laden or to be laden in any of the Ports of Great Britain, with salted Provisions of any Kind whatsoever, and also upon all Ships and Vessels laden or to be laden with Butter and Cheese, Pease, Beans, Rice, Hay, Straw, or Forage of any Kind whatsoever, and with Hides or Leather, manufactured or unmanufactured; and that the said Embargo do continue and remain upon all such Ships and Vessels until further Order: But it is His Majesty's Pleasure, that the said Embargo shall not extend to any Ship or Vessel actually retained or employed in His Majesty's Service, nor to any Ship or Vessel which shall be laden by the especial Order and under the Direction of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, or the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, or the Master-General of the Ordnance,

with any of the Articles above enumerated, for the Use or Sustainance of His Majesty's Fleets, Armies, Forts, and Arsenals; nor to any Ships and Vessels having on Board no greater Quantity of any of the said Articles than shall be necessary to be carried in any such Ships or Vessels on their Voyage Out and Home for the Sustainance, Diet, and Support and Use of the Commander, Master, Mariners, Passengers, and others, or for the Use or Sustainance of the Cattle, Live Stock, or other Animals on Board of such Ships or Vessels; nor to any Ships or Vessels, being British Ships and Vessels, and navigated according to Law, which may be employed in carrying any of the Articles above mentioned to His Majesty's Kingdom of Ireland, or to the Islands of Jersey, Guernsey, Alderney, Sark, and Man, or to any Country, in or out of Europe, in Amity with His Majesty, or to any of His Majesty's Colonies and Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to the Island of Newfoundland, or to any of His Majesty's Forts or Garrisons, or to His Majesty's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies; provided that in all Cases (except Cases of Ships retained or employed in His Majesty's Service, or laden by the especial Order of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, or the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, or the Master-General of the Ordnance, for the Use or Sustainance of His Majesty's Fleets, Armies, Forts, and Arsenals, or such Ships and Vessels having on Board no greater Quantity of any of the

the said Articles than is necessary for the Use and Sustenance of the Crew, Live Stock, and Cattle on Board the said Ships or Vessels, in Manner hereinbefore mentioned) the Merchant Exporter of any of the said Articles do make Oath, on the Entry of such Ships and Vessels, of the due Destination thereof to the Place for which such Ships and Vessels shall be entered and cleared out; and do give Security by Bond, in Treble the Value of the Articles so exported, to the proper Officers of the Customs at the Port at which such Ships and Vessels shall enter and clear out, with Two other able and sufficient Sureties (of whom the Master of the Ship shall be One) to be approved of by the said Officers of the Customs, to produce, within Twelve Months from the Date of such Bond, from the proper Officer of the Customs of the Port to which such Ships or Vessels shall go, or, in case such Ships or Vessels shall go to a Port where there is no such Officer, then from the British Consul resident at such Port, or, in case there shall be no such Consul there resident, or he shall be absent from the same, then from Two British Merchants resident there; Certificates of their having delivered the Articles above enumerated at the Places for which they have been entered; and no such Bonds or Securities shall be delivered up, but on the Production of such Certificates:—And it is His Majesty's further Pleasure, that the said Embargo shall not extend to any Ship or Vessel belonging to the Subjects of Countries in Amity with His Majesty, laden with Leather manufactured; provided that the Merchant Exporter do make Oath of the due Destination of the Ship or Vessel to the Port for which she shall be entered and cleared out, and do give the like Security, with Two other able and sufficient Sureties, being known British Merchants, or other Persons of acknowledged Credit, resident in this Kingdom, to produce, within Twelve Months from the Date of such Bond, from the proper Officer of the Customs of the Port to which such Ships or Vessels shall go, or, in case such Ships or Vessels shall go to a Port where there is no such Officer, then from the British Consul resident at such Port, or, in case there shall be no such Consul there resident, or he shall be absent from the same, then from Two British Merchants resident there, Certificates of their having delivered such manufactured Leather at the Place for which it shall have been entered; and no such Bonds or Securities shall be delivered up but on the Production of such Certificates:—And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, and the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

To the KING's Most Excellent Majesty,

The humble Address of the Mayor, Aldermen and Capital Burgeesses of the Borough of Preston, in Common Council assembled.

Most Gracious Sovereign,

THE late vigorous and well-advised Measures which your Majesty has wisely adopted, to support the Honor and Dignity of your Crown, and to secure our boasted Constitution, call upon us again to solicit your Majesty's Acceptance of this Testimony of our Loyalty and Gratitude.

We shall ever be ready to manifest that Loyalty and Gratitude by cheerfully contributing our Aid and Assistance in such Manner as your Majesty, with the Advice of your Parliament, shall call for and direct. And as it is our undoubted Interest and Duty, so shall it be our fervent Wish, that Glory and Success may attend your Majesty's Arms; and that Britain may still maintain that exalted Character which she has long held among all surrounding States.

To the KING's Most Excellent Majesty.

WE, your Majesty's dutiful and faithful Subjects, the Nobility, Gentry, Clergy, Freeholders and other Inhabitants of the County of Northampton, humbly beg Leave to approach your Majesty with those Sentiments of Loyalty to your Majesty's Person and Government, and of Attachment to the Constitution of our Country, which every good Citizen must feel, and which the Urgency of the present Crisis calls on every one to express.

We have learned, with Astonishment and Indignation, that the War in which your Majesty and the whole Nation are involved by the Aggression of those who now exercise the Powers of Government in France, has by them been stated to be the War of your Majesty's Ministers alone, and that Menaces have been held out, of a solemn Appeal from the Executive Government and Legislature, to the general Sense of the British Nation.

We are anxious to meet or anticipate that Appeal by this publick Declaration, that the Cause in which your Majesty is engaged is the Cause of your People. That not only the Safety of our Allies, and the general Tranquillity of Europe, but the internal Peace of our Country, and the Security of our Laws,

our

our Liberty and our Religion, are equally endangered by the Principles and Conduct of that Assembly, which, from secret and insidious Attempts, has now proceeded to Acts of open Hostility.

Lamenting the Pressure of that Necessity, which must occasion a temporary Interruption of the Blessings of Peace, but convinced that Objects infinitely more dear to us than even the Extension of our Commerce and Revenue are involved in the present Contest, we shall cheerfully contribute to those Burdens which the Exigency of the State may require.

In such a Cause we trust the united Exertions of a free, loyal and happy Nation will enable your Majesty, under the Blessing of the Divine Providence, to vindicate and maintain with Effect the Rights and Interests of your Crown, which we shall ever deem inseparable from the Rights and Interests of your People.

STATE LOTTERY.

Stamp-Office, Somerset-Place, Feb. 12, 1793.

HIS Majesty's Commissioners for managing the Stamp Duties think it proper, on the near Approach of the Drawing of the Lottery, to give this Publick Notice, that the following Regulations are established by this Office, for preventing ILLEGAL INSURANCE :

1st. Pursuant to a Settlement with the Committee of City Lands, no Person will be admitted at Guildhall to take down the Numbers as they are drawn but the Clerks of the licensed Lottery-Office-Keepers.

2^d. The Numbers are to be taken by the said Clerks, not, as before, on separate Slips, but in the Numerical Book of each Office, signed by the respective Office-Keepers, and counter-signed by Two or more of the Commissioners of Stamps.

3^d. No Account of any Part of the Drawing in each Day is to be issued, nor any of the Clerks to return with their Numerical Books, until the final Close of each Day's Drawing.

4th. By a Settlement with Mr. Steele, the Proprietor of the Patent List, the same is not to be published, as heretofore, by Slips, in each Hour, nor by an early Account of the Drawing of each Day, (both of which Communications obviously contributed to the Abuses of illegal Insurance;) but in future only Twice a Week, for the necessary Information of the Publick at large, and at such Hours as the Intelligence can be least perverted for the Abuses of unlicensed Offices, if any such shall remain

But the Commissioners trust, that, by these Regulations, and by the published Notices from the Lord Mayor and the Court of Aldermen, as well as from the Chairman and the Magistrates for Westminster and the County of Middlesex; and likewise from the Magistrates of the Police, of a perfect Co-operation with this Office, the only remaining Abuse that has attached on the State Lotteries will be as totally suppressed as the Sale of illegal Chances, which is completely at an End. The insuperable Difficulties that are now opposed to the illegal Transactions, cannot fail to discourage the Continuance of unlicensed Offices; and the Evidence of the Publick, that if any such should be continued, they must proceed without authentick Intelligence of the Drawings, cannot but prevent, to a great Degree, further Confidence being reposed in the illicit Dealers; who, on their Part, by persisting in illegal Attempts, can only expose themselves, for diminished Profits, to the increased Vigilance of the Magistracy in the effectual Maintenance of the Law.

WHEREAS Sarah Liddiard, the Wife of William Liddiard, lately a Letter Carrier in the Post-Office at Hungerford, was convicted, at the Assizes held at Salisbury the 9th Instant, of feloniously stealing Bills and Notes, which were taken out of a Letter at Hungerford; and at the same Assizes an Indictment was preferred and found against Mary Richardson, the Wife of Thomas Richardson, of Hungerford, Painter, Mother of the said Sarah Liddiard, as an Accessary after the Fact to the said Felony so committed by her.

The said Mary Richardson was committed to Devoizes Bridewell on the said Charge in November last, but escaped from thence on the 24th of December.
