AT the Court at St. James's, the 15th of March, 1793,

P R E S E N T,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS it is requisite, in the present Conjunction of Affairs, to prevent the Exportation of salted Provisions of all Kinds, and of Butter and Cheese, Pease, Beans, Rice, Hay, Straw, and Forage of any Kind, and of Hides and Leather, manufactured or unmanufactured, to the Ports of France, or of any Countries occupied by the Armies employed by the Persons exercising the Powers of Government in France, or any of them; it is hereby ordered, by His Majesty in Council, that an Embargo be forthwith laid upon all Ships and Vessels laden or to be laden in any of the Ports of Great Britain, with salted Provisions of any Kind whatsoever, and also upon all Ships and Vessels laden or to be laden with Butter and Cheese, Pease, Beans, Rice, Hay, Straw, or Forage of any Kind whatsoever, and with Hides or Leather, manufactured or unmanufactured; and that the said Embargo do continue and remain upon all such Ships and Vessels until further Order: But it is His Majesty's Pleasure, that the said Embargo shall not extend to any Ship or Vessel actually retained or employed in His Majesty's Service, nor to any Ship or Vessel which shall be laden by the especial Order and under the Direction of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, or the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, or the Master-General of the Ordnance,

with any of the Articles above enumerated, for the Use or Sustainance of His Majesty's Fleets, Armies, Forts, and Arsenals; nor to any Ships and Vessels having on Board no greater Quantity of any of the said Articles than shall be necessary to be carried in any such Ships or Vessels on their Voyage Out and Home for the Sustainance, Diet, and Support and Use of the Commander, Master, Mariners, Passengers, and others, or for the Use or Sustainance of the Cattle, Live Stock, or other Animals on Board of such Ships or Vessels; nor to any Ships or Vessels, being British Ships and Vessels, and navigated according to Law, which may be employed in carrying any of the Articles above mentioned to His Majesty's Kingdom of Ireland, or to the Islands of Jersey, Guernsey, Alderney, Sark, and Man, or to any Country, in or out of Europe, in Amity with His Majesty, or to any of His Majesty's Colonies and Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to the Island of Newfoundland, or to any of His Majesty's Forts or Garrisons, or to His Majesty's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies; provided that in all Cases (except Cases of Ships retained or employed in His Majesty's Service, or laden by the especial Order of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, or the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, or the Master-General of the Ordnance, for the Use or Sustainance of His Majesty's Fleets, Armies, Forts, and Arsenals, or such Ships and Vessels having on Board no greater Quantity of any of

the said Articles than is necessary for the Use and Sustenance of the Crew, Live Stock, and Cattle on Board the said Ships or Vessels, in Manner hereinbefore mentioned) the Merchant Exporter of any of the said Articles do make Oath, on the Entry of such Ships and Vessels, of the due Destination thereof to the Place for which such Ships and Vessels shall be entered and cleared out; and do give Security by Bond, in Treble the Value of the Articles so exported, to the proper Officers of the Customs at the Port at which such Ships and Vessels shall enter and clear out, with Two other able and sufficient Sureties (of whom the Master of the Ship shall be One) to be approved of by the said Officers of the Customs, to produce, within Twelve Months from the Date of such Bond, from the proper Officer of the Customs of the Port to which such Ships or Vessels shall go, or, in case such Ships or Vessels shall go to a Port where there is no such Officer, then from the British Consul resident at such Port, or, in case there shall be no such Consul there resident, or he shall be absent from the same, then from Two British Merchants resident there, Certificates of their having delivered the Articles above enumerated at the Places for which they have been entered; and no such Bonds or Securities shall be delivered up, but on the Production of such Certificates:—And it is His Majesty's further Pleasure, that the said Embargo shall not extend to any Ship or Vessel belonging to the Subjects of Countries in Amity with His Majesty, laden with Leather manufactured; provided that the Merchant Exporter do make Oath of the due Destination of the Ship or Vessel to the Port for which she shall be entered and cleared out, and do give the like Security, with Two other able and sufficient Sureties, being known British Merchants, or other Persons of acknowledged Credit, resident in this Kingdom, to produce, within Twelve Months from the Date of such Bond, from the proper Officer of the Customs of the Port to which such Ships or Vessels shall go, or, in case such Ships or Vessels shall go to a Port where there is no such Officer, then from the British Consul resident at such Port, or, in case there shall be no such Consul there resident, or he shall be absent from the same, then from Two British Merchants resident there, Certificates of their having delivered such manufactured Leather at the Place for which it shall have been entered; and no such Bonds or Securities shall be delivered up but on the Production of such Certificates:—And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, and the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

A Convention was this Day signed by the Right Honorable Lord Grenville, His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, and by Count Woronzow, Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary from the Empress of Russia, for renewing the Treaty of Commerce of the Year 1766, between Great Britain and Russia, for the Term of Six Years.

Hague, March 22.

Intelligence has been received here of a Victory obtained by the Prince of Saxe-Cobourg over the French, at Neerlanden near Tirlemont, which was preceded by a long and sharp Action.

On the 15th Instant the advanced Posts of the Imperial Army had been beat back from Tirlemont; which was retaken by the Enemy: On the 16th M. Dumourier attempted to pass the Left Wing of the Imperial Army: On the 17th there was a Change of Position, and a brisk Cannonade; On the 18th, at Seven o'Clock in the Morning, M. Dumourier attacked the Center of the Imperial Army; but was repulsed: He was likewise repulsed by the Imperial Right Wing; but about Three o'Clock in the Afternoon M. Dumourier's Right Wing penetrated through the Imperial Left Wing, whose Cavalry was prevented from manœuvring, the Ground being intersected by Ditches: The Corps of Reserve, commanded by M. Clairfayt, then decided the Victory: The French retired in good Order until Six o'Clock in the Evening, when the Imperial Light Cavalry put them to the Rout.

The Number of killed and Wounded is variously reported: It is said that the French have lost 33 Pieces of Cannon.
