HIS Day the Lords being met, a Message was fent to the Honourable House of Commons by Sir Francis Molyneux, Knt. Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that The Lords, authorized by virtue of His Majesty's Commission for declaring His Royal Assent to several Asts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate Attendance of this Honourable House in the House of Peers, to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the faid Commission, impowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord Chancellor, and the Marquis of Stafford, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read ecordingly, and the Royal Assent given to

An Ast to indemnify fuch Persons as have omitted to qualify themselves for Offices and Employments, and to indemnify Justices of the Peace or others who have omitted to register or deliver in their Qualifications within the Time limited by Law, and for giving further Time for those Purposes; and to indemnify Members and Officers in Cities, Gorporations and Borough Towns, whose Admissions have been omitted to be stamped according to Law, or having heen to be stamped according to Law, or, having been stamped, have been lost or missaid, and for allowing them Time to provide Admissions duly stamped; to give further Time to Such Persons as have omitted to make and file Affidavits of the Execution of Indentures of Clerks to Attornies and Solicitors; and for indemnifying Deputy Lieutenants and Officers of the Militia, who have neglected to transmit Descriptions of their Qualifications to the Clerks of the Peace within the

Time limited by Law, and for giving further Time for that Purpose.

An Act to continue the Laws now in Force for regulating the Trade between the Subjects of His Ma-jefty's Dominions and the Inhabitants of the Territories belonging to the United States of America, fo far as the same relate to the Trade and Commerce carried on between this Kingdom and the Inhabitants of the Countries belonging to the said United States.

An Ast to prevent Asts of Parliament from taking

Effect from a Time prior to the passing thereof.

An Ast to enable the Royal Exchange Assurance

Companies and their Successors to grant, purchase and sell Annuities upon or for Lives.

An Act to enable the Governor and Company of the Bank of England to purchase ceriain Houses and Ground contiguous to the Bank of England.

An Ast for effectually carrying into Execution an Ast of Parliament of the Thirtieth Year of His prefent Majesty, for making and maintaining a naviga-ble Communication between Stowmarket and Ipswich

in the County of Suffolk.

An Act to enable the Company of Proprietors of the Canal Navigation from Manchester to or near Ashton under Lyne and Oldham to extend the said Canal from a Place called Clayton Demesne, in the Township of Droylsden, in the Parish of Manchester aforesaid, to a Place in the Turnpike Road in Heaton Norris leading between Manchester and Stockport, opposite to the House known by the Sign of the Three Boars Heads, and from or nearly from a Place called Taylor's Barn, in the Town-ship of Reddish, to Denton, at a Place called Beat Bank, adjoining the Turnpike Road leading between Stockport and Alpton under Lyne; and also from the intended Aqueduct Bridge, at or near a Place called Waterhouses, in the Parish of Ashton under Lyne aforesaid,
