#### Quebec, December 20.

HB General Affembly of the Province of Lower Canada met on the 17th Inftant, when his Excellency Major General Clarke, Lieutenant-Governor, opened the Seffion with a Speech, which, together with the Addreffes to his Excellency from the Legiflative Council and Affembly, and his Excellency's Anfwers thereto, are as follow:

#### Gentlemen of the Legislative Council, and Gentlemen of the House of Assembly,

OUR most gracious Sovereign, always watchful over the Happiness of His People, having taken into Confideration the Condition of His Ioyal Subjects of this Province, and recommended them to His Parliament for such Change in their Colonial Government as Circumstances might require and admit, the Act was passed that has made it my Duty, as it is my Pride, to meet you in General Assession least inconvenient to your private Interests.

On a Day like this, fignalized by the Commencement in this Country of that Form of Government which has raifed the Kingdom, to which it is fubordinate, to the higheft Elevation, it is impossible not to feel Emotions difficult to be expressed. - However pleasant the Task, it cannot be a neces-

- However pleafant the Tafk, it cannot be a neceffary one on the prefent Occafion to difplay the Fitnefs of this Syftem, to promote the Felicity all Governments profefs to have in View, but is under none fo well established as by the British, which, after having been celebrated for Ages by the first Pens of Europe, at this Moment gives Great Britain decided and enviable Diffinctions of real Glory, beyond all other Nations of the World.

What I feel on the Change that brings us to this memorable Convention, I perfuade myfelf muft be a common Sentiment with all who have Capacity to diftern the Magnitude of the Bleffing conferred; and

therefore I content myfelf with barely fuggefting, that, next to the Gratitude due for it to the Almighty Arbiter of the Univerfe, we cannot fufficiently extol the Magnanimity and Grace of the King, the common Father of His People, and of that Parliament who have fo generoufly co-operated for that Eftablifhment, which is most defervedly the Subject of our general Joy.

Joy: To give an Opportunity for your loyal and grateful Acknowledgments to His Majefty is one of my Motives for calling you together; and that Debt difcharged, your Councils will, doubtlefs, be next employed for enacting the Laws neceffary to confirm and augment the Profperity of your Country.

#### Gentlemen of the House of Assembly,

Acquainted as you are with the Condition and Defires of the People you reprefent, it is from your Houfe the Public will chiefly expect fuch ordinary Provifion as the Common Weal may require; and I truft that if any Meafures conducive to it fhall neceffarily be polyponed for maturer Confideration to a fubfequent Seffion, no Regulations of indifpenfable Unility will efcape your prefent Attention.

#### Gentlemen of the Legiflative Council, and Gentlemen of the Houfe of Alfembly,

Great Britain being happily at Peace with all the World, and, I hope, without Apprehenfion of it's Interruption, the prefent Moment muft be moft fit and urgent for all thole Arrangements, beft made at a Scafon of Tranquillity, and falling within the Sphere of our Truft. The Conviction I feel of your Difpolition to cultivate that Harmony amongft yourfelves and each Branch of the Legiflature, which is always effential to the public Good and private Satisfaction, makes it unneceflary for me to enlarge upon this Subject. Such Objects, as it may become my Duty to recommend to your Confideration, thall be occafionally

fionally communicated by Meilage; and you may affure yourfelves, Gentlemen, that feeling, as I do, peculiar Satisfaction in being placed, through His Majesty's Favor, in a Situation to forward His benevolent Intentions, I shall most chearfully concur in every Measure advancive of the Prosperity of this Colony, and confiftent with the general Interests of the Empire, which juftly claims, and I am fully fatisfied will ever experience your warmest Attachment and Support.

#### May it please your Excellency,

WE, His Majefty's most dutiful and loyal Subjects, the Legislative Council of the Province of Lower Canada, beg Leave to return you our humble Thanks for your Speech from the Throne.

Whether our Thoughts are confined to the past and the prefent, or extended to the future Condition of this Country, in every View we perceive Motives to unufual Solemnity, and find ourfelves embarrafied for Language to express the Senfations excited by this fingular and eventful Day.

All Praise to the unerring Providence of God, which, after rending the Bands afunder that united Canada to the Power that planted it, now refcues it from the Tragedies acting upon a Theatre of Anarchy, outraging Humanity, and even to Savages a Reproach.

We confels, therefore, our grateful Acknowledgments to Heaven, that on our Difcharge from that Connection we were delivered over to the Care of a Monarch, who, by making the Succeis of His Arms the Means of extending His Beneficence, has an uncontrovertible Right to our affectionate Fidelity, and most of all for that last and greatest of the re-peated Instances of His Munificence, by which we enter into a generous Participation of the Privileges and Safety of native Inhabitants of a Kingdom, diftinguished for its Felicity under a political Frame of all others best calculated to inlarge and fecure it. God Almighty give us the Wifdom to preferve this ineftimable Treasure, and to hand it down to our latest Posterity.

After fuch a Declaration, made with equal Piety and Loyalty, we know not how to add ftronger Afsurances of the Gratitude we owe to a Sovereign, to whom we pledge ourfelves in all our Councils for the Welfare of this remote Part of His Dominions, never to be unmindful of that true Tell of Colonial Mcrit, the Abandonment of every Partiality repugnant to the general Interest of that Empire, of which in has pleafed the Almighty and wife Arbiter of the

World to make us a Part. Accept our Thanks, Sir, for your friendly Recommendation to the Harmony effential to our Prosperity; and be affured of our Confidence in every Measure that can bring Credit to an Administration disposed to co-operate with the King's Grace, and the Generofity of His Parliament; with the Example of that, the most illustrious Diet of the World in our Eye, we will make it our Stndy to follow the Steps of shat Branch of it, which we are conftituted to fupply in the humble Sphere of a fubordinate Legiflation.

Truly fenfible of the paternal Solicitude of our most gracious Sovereign, in watching over the Happinels of His People, and of the Justice and Benevolence of the Parliament of Great Britain, in granting to His Majefty's loyal Subjects of this Province a new and liberal Conftitution for their Colonial Government, we shall ever retain the most grateful and lively Senfe of the Duties we owe to the Parent State; and we feel ourfelves ftrongly called upon to acknowledge your Excellency's great Attention to us individually, in affembling us at a Time leaft inconvenient to our private Affairs, and for providing fo fuitable a Houfe for our Reception.

We beg Leave to affure your Excellency that our Feelings and those of our Conflituents, fully sensible of the Magnitude of the Bleffings conferred by the Change that brought us to fo memorable a Convention, are of the most lively Nature, and, next to our. Gratitude to the Almighty Arbiter of the Universe, we cannot fufficiently extol the Magnanimity and Grace of the King, the common Father of His People, and of that Parliament which has fo generously co-operated for the Establishment that is most defervedly the Subject of our general Joy.

It is an unparalleled Happiness for us to have an . for that Maturity of Reflection which their Importance may require.

We hear with Pleafure that Great Britain is at Peace with all the World; and we confider this as the most favourable Time for the Confideration of the Objects that fall within the Sphere of our Charge. To cultivate Harmony among ourfelves and each Branch of the Legislature, is our most ardent Wish, convinced as we are, that it is a Condition effentially neceffary to the Public Good and our own private Satisfaction.

We will at all Times give the most speedy and deliberate Confideration to fuch Meffages as we may receive from your Excellency :

And we congratulate ourfelves that it hath pleafed His Majefty to place your Excellency in a Situation of forwarding His benevolent Intentions. We fhall confider it our Duty to concur with your Excellency in every Measure conducive to the Prosperity of this Province, and confiitent with the general Interest of the Empire.

These are the Means by which we will endeavour to evince our fincere Gratitude, and on which we found the Hope of that Support whereof we fland in Need.

An Act for the Encouragement of Seamen and Marines employed in the Royal Navy, by rendering it more eafy to Petty Officers and Seamen, Non-commiffioned Officers of Marines, and Marines, to remit their Ways to this Kingdom, and by providing for the Payment in this Kingdom of Wages due to deccased Officers, Seamen and Marines, as a jorefaid.
