#### Hague, April 2.

On the 30th Ultimo in the Evening Prince Frederick of Orange obtained an Advantage over the French, near Gertruydenburgh, in an Action which lasted near Three Hours. The Loss of the Dutch was a Captain of Grenadiers and Six Soldiers killed, and several wounded; 150 French were taken, with a Lieutenant-Colonel, a Captain and Lieutenant, feveral Horfes, and a Piece of Cannon. Yesterday the Hereditary Prince was with his Corps at Haigie, about Half a League from Breda. All Hostilities were suspended both there and at Gertruydenburghs. The Articles of Capitulation, both for Breda and Gertruydenburgh, are now supposed to be sinally settled: In the mean Time those Piaces continue to be blockaded by Two Corps of Troops, under the Hereditary Prince of Orange and his Brother Prince Frederick.

Accounts are received here that the French have evacuated Antwerp and Mons; and that the Army, under the Command of General Dumourier, has retreated towards Valenciennes and Liffe.
