To the KING's Most Excellent Majesty.

May it please your Majesty,

WE, the High Sheriff and Grand Jury of the County of Denbigh, assembled at the Spring Assizes held at Ruthin the 25th Day of March, 1793, humbly offer to your Majesty our unfeigned Thanks for the just and salutary Measures your Majesty has adopted in Support of your Allies, and for curbing the hitherto uncontroled ambitious Views of the French Nation, whose late Conduct has so deservedly brought on them the Detestation of every civilized State throughout the World.

In Support of so just a War, that your Majesty has been forced into, we beg Leave to tender to your Majesty our Lives and Fortunes, being highly sensible that the Welfare of Mankind in general, and the Peace not only of this Country but of all Europe, depends on the Success thereof.

Hague, April 2.

On the 30th Ultimo in the Evening Prince Frederick of Orange obtained an Advantage over the French, near Gertruydenburgh, in an Action which lasted near Three Hours. The Loss of the Dutch was a Captain of Grenadiers and Six Soldiers killed, and several wounded; 150 French were taken, with a Lieutenant-Colonel, a Captain and Lieutenant, several Horses, and a Piece of Cannon. Yesterday the Hereditary Prince was with his Corps at Haigie, about Half a League from Breda. All Hostilities were suspended both there and at Gertruydenburgh. The Articles of Capitulation, both for Breda and Gertruydenburgh, are now supposed to be finally settled: In the mean Time those Places continue to be blockaded by Two Corps of Troops, under the Hereditary Prince of Orange and his Brother Prince Frederick.

Accounts are received here that the French have evacuated Antwerp and Mons; and that the Army, under the Command of General Dumourier, has retreated towards Valenciennes and Lillo.
