upon Payment of fuch Duties as Snuff, being the Production or Manufacture of Europe, imported from Europe, is or hereafter may be fubject to, and may be warehoused and again exported ; subject respectively nevertheless to all and fingular the Regulations of an Act made and paffed in the Twentyninth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled, "An Act for repealing the_Duties on To-" bacco and Snuff, and for granting new Duties in " Lieu thereof:" And another Act paffed in the Thirtieth Year of His prefent Majefty's Reign, intituled, "An Act to explain and amend an Act " made in the last Seffion of Parliament, intituled, " An Act for repealing the Duties on Tobacco and " Snuff, and for granting new Duties in Lieu " thereof."

And His Majefly is further pleafed to order, That any Rice, being the Growth or Production of any of the Territories of the United States of America, which shall be imported directly from thence into any of the Ports of this Kingdom, in Manner above-mentioned, may, upon the Importer paying down, in ready Money, the Duty of Eight-pence the Hundred Weight, being Part of the Duties now payable on the Importation of Rice, be landed and warehoused (except as hereinaster excepted) under His Majesty's Locks, in such Warehouses as shall be approved of for that Purpose by the Commisfioners of His Majefty's Cultoms, or any Four or more of them, upon the Importer's own Bond for Payment of the Remainder of the Duties due and payable for fuch Rice, within Eighteen Months, according to the net Weight and Quantity of fuch Rice at the Time it shall be so landed : But it is His Majesty's Pleasure nevertheless, that upon the Importation of any fuch Rice into the Ports of London, Briftol, Portfmouth, Cowes, Liverpool, Lancaster, Falmouth, Pool, Whitehaven, Hull, Greenock, and Port Glafgow, or either of them, in the Manner herein before expressed, the Importer shall be at Liberty to enter and land the fame without Payment of any Duty whatever; in which Cafe fuch Rice shall be warehoused, under the joint Locks of His Majefly and the Proprietors, in fuch Warehouse or Warehouses as shall be approved of for that Purpose by the Commissioners of His . Majefty's Cultoms, or any Four or more of them, in that Part of Great Britain called England, and any Three or more of them, in that Part of Great Britain called Scotland; every Expence attending which Warehousing shall be borne by the faid Proprietors: And that fuch Proprietor or Proprietors, or his or their known Agent, fuall from Time to Time, at all feasonable Hours, as Occasion may require, have free Access to fuch Warehouses, in the Presence monies,

of some proper Officer of the Culloms, for the Furi pole of fkreening and shifting the Rice, to prevent it's receiving Damage. And that if any Rice, which shall be fo imported from the Territories of the faid United States into any of the Ports abovementioned respectively, and warehoused as aforefaid, shall be taken out of the Warehouses wherein the same shall be fecured, under the joint Locks of His Majesty and the Proprietors as aforefaid, for Home Confumption, the full Duties due and payable by Law, upon the Importation of fuch Rice into this Kingdom for Home Confumption, shall, previously to it's being taken out of fuch Warehoufes, be paid to the Collector of His Majesty's Customs at the Ports where fuch Rice shall be fo warehoused ; but that such Proprietor, if he intends to export fuch Rice, shall have Liberty to export the fame from fuch Warehoufes respectively, under the usual Regulations, without Payment of any Duty whatever; and that if any Rice which shall have been imported into any Port of this Kingdom, not herein before specially named, and shall have been warehoused upon the Importer's Bond, in Manner aforefaid, shall, within the Time herein before mentioned, be taken out of the Warehouse wherein it shall have been to fecured, to be exported directly from thence, the Bond entered into for the Payment of the faid Duties thereon fhall be difcharged and cancelled by Debenture or Debentures, made out and paffed in the ufual Manner, for the Quantity or Quantities of Rice duly exported. And if any Rice imported into any Port of this Kingdom, not herein before fpecially named; and warehoufed in Manner aforefaid, shall be taken out of any fuch Warehouse for Home Confumption, the Remainder of the Duties, due and payable by Law, shall, previously to it's being taken out of fuch Warehoufe, be paid to the Collector of His Majefty's Cuftoms at the Port where fuch Rice shall be fo warehoused.

And the Right Honorable the Lords Commiffioners of His Majefty's Treafury, and the Lords Commiffioners of the Admiralty, are to give the neceffary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.
