APROCLAMATION,

For granting the Distribution of Prizes during the present Hostilities.

GEORGE R.

7HEREAS, by Our Order in Council dated the Eleventh Day of February last, We have ordered that General Reprizals be granted against the Ships, Goods, and Subjects of France, fo that as well Our Fleets and Ships, as also all other Ships and Vessels that shall be commissionated by Letters of Marque, or General Reprizals, or otherwise, by Our Commissioners for executing Our Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, shall and may lawfully feize all Ships, Veffels, and Goods belonging to France, or any Persons being Subjects of France, or inhabiting within any of the Territories of France, and bring the same to Judgement in any of Our Courts of Admiralty within Our Dominions: We, being defirous to give due Encouragement to all Our faithful Subjects who shall lawfully seize the same, and having declared in Council, by Our Order of the Eighth of March last, Our Intentions concerning the Distribution of all Manner of Captures, Seizures, Prizes, and Reprizals of all Ships and Goods, during the present Hostilities, do now make known to all Our loving Subjects, and all others whom it may concern, by this Our Proclamation, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, that Our Will and Pleasure is, That the Neat Produce of all Prizes taken, the Right whereof is inherent in Us, and Our Crown, be given to the Takers, (fave and except the Produce of fuch Prizes as are or shall be taken

by Ships or Vessels belonging to Our Commissioners of Customs or Excise, the Disposition of which We reserve to Our further Pleasure) but subject to the Payment of all fuch or the like Customs and Duties as the fame are now, or would have been liable to, if the same were or might have been imported as Merchandize: And that the same may be so given in the Proportion and Manner herein-after fet forth; that is to fay, That all Prizes taken by Ships and Vessels having Commissions of Letters of Marque and Reprizals, (fave and except fuch Prizes as are or shall be taken by the Ships or Vessels belonging to Our Commissioners aforesaid) may be sold and disposed of by the Merchants, Owners, Fitters, and others, to whom fuch Letters of Marque and Reprizals are granted, for their own Use and Benefit, after final Adjudication, and not before. And We do hereby further order and direct, that the Neat Produce of all Prizes, which are or shall be taken by any of Our Ships or Vessels of War, shall be for the entire Benefit and Encouragement of Our Flag Officers, Captains, Commanders, and other Commissioned Officers in Our Pay, and of the Seamen, Marines, and Soldiers on Board Our faid Ships and Vessels at the Time of the Capture; and that such Prizes may be lawfully fold and disposed of by them and their Agents, after the fame shall have been to Us finally adjudged lawful Prize, and not otherwife. The Distribution shall be made as follows; the Whole of the Neat Produce being first divided into Eight equal

The Captain or Captains of any of Our faid Ships or Veffels of War, who shall be actually on Board at the Taking of any Prize, shall have Three Eighth Parts; but in case any such Prize shall be taken by any of Our Ships or Vessels of War, under the Command of a Flag or Flags, the Flag Officer or Officers, being actually on Board, or directing and assisting in the Capture, shall have One of the said Three Eighth Parts; the said One Eighth Part to be paid to such Flag or Flag Officers in such Proportions, and subject to such Regulations, as are herein-after mentioned:

The Captains of Marines and Land Forces, Sea Lieutenants, and Master on Board, shall have One Eighth Part, to be equally divided amongst them: But that every Physician appointed, or hereaster to be appointed, to a Fleet or Squadron of Our Ships of War, shall, in the Distribution of Prizes which shall hereaster be taken by the Ships in which he shall serve, or in which such Ship's Company shall be intitled to share, be classed with the Sea Lieutenants with respect to the said One Eighth Part, and be allowed to share equally with them; provided such Physician be actually on Board at the Time of Taking such Prizes:

The Lieutenants and Quarter-Masters of Marines, and Lieutenants, Ensigns and Quarter-Masters of Land Forces, Secretaries of Admirals or of Commodores, with Captains under them, Boatfwains, Gunners, Purser, Captain, Master's Mates, Chirurgeon, Pilot, and Chaplain on Board, shall have One Eighth Part, to be equally divided amongst them:

The Midshipmen, Captain's Clerk, Master Sailmaker, Carpenter's Mates, Boatswain's Mates, Gunner's Mates, Master at Arms, Corporals, Yeomen of the Sheets, Coxswain, Quarter-Masters, Quarter-Masters Mates, Chirurgeon's Mates, Yeoman of the Powder Room, Serjeants of Marines, and Land Forces on Board, shall have One Eighth Part, to be equally divided amongst them:

The Trumpeters, Quarter Gunners, Carpenter's Crew, Steward's, Cook, Armourer, Steward's Mate, Cook's Mate, Gunsmith, Cooper, Swabber, Ordinary Trumpeter, Barber, Able Seamen, Ordinary Seamen, and Marines, and other Soldiers, and all other Persons doing Duty and affisting on Board, shall have Two Eighth Parts, to be equally divided amongst them.

Provided, that if any Officer being on Board any of Our Ships of War at the Time of Taking any Prize, shall have more Commissions or Offices than One, such Officer shall be entitled only to the Share or Shares of the Prizes which, according to the abovementioned Distribution, shall belong to his Superior Commission or Office. And We do hereby

ftrictl yenjoin all Commanders of Our Ships and Veffels of War, taking any Prize, as foon as may be, to transmit, or cause to be transmitted, to the Commissioners of Our Navy, a true List of the Names of all the Officers, Seamen, Marines, Soldiers, and others, who were actually on Board Our Ships and Vessels of War under their Command at the Time of the Capture; which List shall contain the Quality of the Service of each Person on Board, and be subfcribed by the Captain or Commanding Officer, and Three or more of the Chief Officers on Board. And We do hereby require and direct the Commissioners of Our Navy, or any Three or more of them, to examine, or cause to be examined, such Lists by the Muster Books of such Ships and Vessels of War, and Lists annexed thereto, to fee that such Lists do agree with the faid Muster Books and annexed Lists, as to the Names, Qualities or Ratings, of the Officers, Seamen, Marines, Soldiers, and others belonging to fuch Ships and Vessels of War, and upon Request forthwith to grant a Certificate of the Truth of any List transmitted to them, to the Agents nominated and appointed by the Captors to take Care and difpose of such Prize; and also upon Application to them (the faid Commissioners) they shall give, or cause to be given, to the said Agents, all such Lists from the Muster Books of any such Ships of War, and annexed Lists, as the faid Agents shall find requisite for their Direction in paying the Produce of fuch Prizes, and otherwise shall be aiding and affishing to the faid Agents in all fuch Matters as shall be necessary. We do hereby further will and direct, that the following Regulations shall be observed concerning the One Eighth Part herein-before mentioned to be granted to the Flag, or Flag Officers, who shall actually be on Board at the Taking of any Prize, or shall be directing or assisting therein: First, That a Flag Officer, Commander in Chief, when there is but One Flag Officer upon Service, shall have to his own Use the said One Eighth Part of the Prizes taken by Ships and Vessels under his Command: Secondly, That a Flag Officer, fent to command at Jamaica, or elsewhere, shall have no Right to any Share of Prizes taken by Ships or Vessels employed there, before he arrives at the Place to which he is fent, and actually takes upon him the Command: Thirdly, That when an inferior Flag Officer is fent out to reinforce a superior Flag Officer at Jamaica, or elsewhere, the superior Flag Officer shall have no Right to any Share of Prizes taken by the inferior Flag Officer before the inferior Flag Officer shall arrive within the Limits of the Command of the fuperior Flag Officer, and actually receive some Order from him: Fourthly, That a Chief Flag Officer returning home from Jamaica, or elsewhere, shall have no Share of the Prizes taken by the Ships or Vessels left behind to act under another Command: Fifthly, That if a Flag Officer is sent to command in the Out-Ports of this Kingdom, he shall have no Share of the Prizes taken by Ships or Vessels, which have shiled from that Port by Order from the Admiralty: Sixthly, That when more Flag Officers than One terve together, the Eighth Part of the Prizes taken by any Ships or Vessels of the Flect or Squadron shall be divided in the following Proportions, viz. If there be but Two Flag Officers, the Chief shall have Two Third Parts of the faid One Eighth Part, and the other shall have the remaining Third Part; but if the Number of Flag Officers be more than Two, the Chief shall have only One Half, and the other Half shall be equally divided amongst the other Flag Officers: Seventhly, That Commodores with Captains under them shall be esteemed as Flag Officers with respect to the Eighth Part of Prizes taken, whether commanding in Chief or ferving under Command: Eighthly, That the first Captain to the Admiral and Commander in Chief of Our Fleet, and also the first Captain to Our Flag Officer appointed, or hereafter to be appointed, to command a Fleet or Squadron of Twenty Ships of the Line of Battle, shall be deemed and taken to be a Flag Officer, and Thall be entitled to a Part or Share of Prizes, as the junior Flag Officer of fuch Fleet or Squadron. And We do hereby further order, That in the Case of Cutters, Schooners, and other armed Vessels commanded by Lieutenants, the Share of such Lieutenants shall be Three Eighth Parts of the Prize, unless such Lieutenants shall be under the Command of a Flag Officer or Officers; in which Cafe the Flag Officer or Officers shall have One of the said Three Eighths, to be divided among fuch Flag Officer or Officers in the Manner herein-before directed in the Case of Captains serving under Flag Officers: Secondly, We direct that the Share of the Master or other Person acting as Second in Command, and the Pilot, (if there happens to be one on Board,) shall be One Eighth Part, to be divided into Three equal Parts; of which Two Thirds shall go to the Master or other Person acting as Second in Command, and the remaining One Third to the Pilot; but if there is no Pilot, then fuch Eighth Part to go wholly to the Master or Person acting as Second in Command: That the Share of the Chirurgeon, or Chirurgeon's Mate (where there is no Chirurgeon,) Midshipmen, and Clerk and Steward, shall be One Eighth; That the Share of the Boatswain's, Gunner's and Carpenter's Mates, Yeoman of the Sheets, Saitmaker, Quarter-Master, and Quarter-Master's Mate, shall be One Eighth; and the Share of the Seamen, Marines, and other Persons on Board assisting in the Capture, shall be Two Eighth Parts. But it is Our Intention, nevertheless, that the above Distribution shall only extend to such Captures as shall be made

by any Cutter, Schooner, or armed Vessel, without any of His Majesty's Ships or Vestels of War being prefent or within Sight of, and adding to the Encouragement of the Captors, and Terror of the Euemy: But in case any of His Majesty's Ships or Vessels of War shall be present, or in Sight, that then the Officers, Pilots, Petty Officers, and Men on Board fuch Cutters and Schooners, or armed Vessels, shall share in the same Proportion as is allowed to Perfons of the like Rank and Denomination, on Board His Majesty's Ships and Vessels of

THEREAS by an Act made in the Twentythird Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled, "An Act for preventing certain " Instruments from being required from Ships " belonging to the United States of America; " and to give to His Majesty, for a limited " Time, certain Powers for the better carrying on Trade and Commerce between the Subjects " of His Majesty's Dominions and the Inhabitants " of the faid United States;" which said A& has been continued by several subsequent Acts until the 5th Day of April, 1793. And whereas by an Act made in the Twenty-fourth Year of His present Majesty's Reign, intituled, " An Act to extend the " Powers of an Act, made in the Twenty-third Year " of the Reign of His present Majesty, for giving " His Majesty certain Powers for the better carrying

" His Majesty's Dominions and the Inhabitants " of the United States of America, to the Trade " and Commerce of this Kingdom with the British " Colonies and Plantations in America, with Re-" spect to certain Articles therein mentioned," the Powers given by the faid recited Act were extended to the Trade and Intercourse between this Kingdom and the British Colonies and Plantations in America, so far as the same might relate to Iron, Hemp and Sailcloth, and other Articles of the Produce of any Place bordering on the Baltic, which might be exported from this Kingdom; which last mentioned Act has also by several subfequent Acts been continued until the faid 5th Day of April, 1793.

on Trade and Commerce between the Subjects of

And whereas by another Act passed in this present Session of Parliament, intituled, "An Act to continue \* the Laws now in Force for regulating the Trade between the Subjects of His Majesty's Dominions, " and the Inhabitants of the Territories belonging " to the United States of America, fo far as the " same relate to the Trade and Commerce carried " on between this Kingdom and the Inhabitants " of the Countries belonging to the faid United "States," it is declared to be expedient, that the faid Act of the Twenty-third Year of His present Majesty's Reign, so far only as the same extends to the Trade and Commerce carried on between this Kingdom and the People and Territories belongsing to the United States of America, and also that the faid Act of the Twenty-fourth Year of His present Majesty's Reign, should be further continued and be in Force; and it is thereby enacted, that the faid Acts shall continue and be in Force until the 5th Day of April, 1794, and to the End of the then next Session of Parliament:

His Majesty doth thereupon, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order and declare, That any Unmanufactured Goods and Merchandizes, the Importation of which into this Kingdom is not prohibited by Law (except Tobacco, for which Provision is herein after made, and except Oil made from Fish, or Creatures living in the Sea, and Blubber, Whale Fins and Spermaceti) and any Pig Iron, Bar Iron, Pitch, Tar, Turpentine, Rofin, Pot-Ash, Pearl-Ash, Indico, Masts, Yards and Bowfprits, being the Growth or Production of any of the Territories of the United States of America, may be imported directly from thence into any of the Ports of this Kingdom, either in British-built Ships, owned by His Majesty's Subjects, and navigated according to Law, or in Ships built in the Countries belonging to the United States of America, or any of them, and owned by the Subfects of the faid United States, or any of them, and whereof the Maller and Three-fourths of the Mariners at least are Subjects of the said United States, or any of them; and may be entered and landed in any Port of this Kingdom, upon Payment of fuch Duties as the like Sorts of Goods or Merchandize are or may be subject and liable to if imported in British-built Ships, owned by His Majesty's Subjects, and navigated according to Law, from any British Island or Plantation in America, notwithstanding such Goods or Merchandize, or the Ships in which the fame may be brought, may not be accompanied with the Certificates or other Documents heretofore required by Law.

And it is further ordered, that all other Goods and Merchandize not herein before enumerated or described, the Importation of which into this Kingdom is not prohibited by Law, (except Snuff, for which Provision is herein after made) and also Oil made from Fish or Creatures living in the Sea, and

Blubber, Whale-Fins and Spermaceti, being the Growth, Production or Manufacture of any of the Territories of the said United States of America, may be imported from thence into this Kingdom in British or American Ships, owned and navigated as herein before required, upon Payment of such Duties of Customs and Excise as are payable on the like Goods and Merchandize upon their Importation into this Kingdom from Countries not under the Dominion of His Majetty, according to the Schedule and Tables, marked A. D. and F. annexed to an Act. passed in the Twenty-seventh Year of His present Majesty's Reign, intituled, " An Act for repealing the " feveral Duties of Customs and Excise, and grant-" ing other Duties in Lieu thereof, and for apply-" ing the said Duties together with the other Du-"ties composing the Public Revenue; for permit-" ting the Importation of certain Goods, Wares " and Merchandize, the Produce or Manufacture " of the European Dominions of the French, King, " into this Kingdom; and for applying certain un-" claimed Monies remaining in the Exchequer, for " the Payment of Annuities on Lives, to the Re-" duction of the National Debt;" or by any other Laws in Force passed subsequent to the said Act, touching the Duties contained in the faid Schedule and Tables, marked A. D. and F.; and in Cases where different Duties are imposed upon the like Goods imported from different Countries not under the Dominion of His Majesty, then that such Goods shall be imported upon the lowest Duties which by the faid Schedule and Tables, marked A. D. and F. are required to be paid on the Importation of any fuch Goods from any European Country not under the Dominion of His Majesty.

And His Majesty is hereby further pleased to order, that all such Goods and Merchandize shall be intitled to the same Drawbacks as are allowed upon the Exportation of the like Goods and Merchandize when exported from this Kingdom, according to the faid Schedule and Tables, marked A. D. and F. annexed to the before mentioned Act. passed in the Twenty-seventh Year of His present Majetty's Reign, or according to any other Law in Force, passed subsequent to the faid Act, touching Drawbacks. And it is hereby further ordered, that there shall be allowed and paid the same Drawbacks and Bounties on Goods and Merchandize exported from this Kingdom to the Territories of the faid United States, or any of them, as are or may hereafter be allowed by Law upon the Exportation of the like Goods or Merchandize to any of the Islands, Plantations, or Colonies, belonging to the Crown of Great Britain in America. And it is hereby further ordered, that there shall be allowed and paid the same Drawbacks upon the Exportation of any Sort of Foreign Hemp or Foreign

Tron exported from this Kingdom into any British Colony or Plantation in America, or into the Terri tories of the United States of America, or any of them, as are or may hereafter be allowed by Law upon the Exportation of the like Sort of Hemp or Iron to other Foreign Parts; and all such Drawbacks and Bounties respectively shall be allowed and paid in the same Manner, and under the same Rules, Regulations, Restrictions and Forseitures, in all Respects, as such Drawbacks and Bounties are allowed and paid, or are subject and liable to by Law.

And His Majesty is hereby further pleased to or-. der, that any Tobacco, being the Growth or Production of any of the Territories of the faid United States of America, may be imported in British or American Ships, owned and navigated as herein before required, upon Payment of the same Duties as Tobacco imported by British Subjects from any British Colony or Plantation, is or may hereaster be subject to; and that any Snuff, being the Production or Manufacture of any of the faid Territories, may be imported in Manner befors-mentioned, apon Payment of fuch Duties as Snuff, being the Production or Manufacture of Europe, imported from Europe, is or hereafter may be subject to, and may be warehoused and again exported; subject respectively nevertheless to all and singular the Regulations of an Act made and passed in the Twentyninth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled, "An Act for repealing the Duties on Tobacco and Snuff, and for granting new Duties in " Lieu thereof:" And another Act passed in the Thirtieth Year of His present Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act to explain and amend an Act " made in the last Session of Parliament, intituled, " An Act for repealing the Duties on Tobacco and Snuff, and for granting new Duties in Lieu thereof."

And His Majesty is further pleased to order, That any Rice, being the Growth or Production of any of the Territories of the United States o America, which shall be imported directly from thence into any of the Ports of this Kingdom, in Manner above-mentioned, may, upon the Importer paying down, in ready Money, the Duty of Eight pence the Hundred Weight, being Part of the Duties now payable on the Importation of Rice, be landed and warehoused (except as hereinafter excepted) under His Majesty's Locks, in such Warehouses as shall be approved of for that Purpole by the Commif-Sioners of His Majesty's Customs, or any Four or more of them, upon the Importer's own Bond for Payment of the Remainder of the Duties due and payable for such Rice, within Eighteen Months, according to the net Weight and Quantity of such Rice at the Time it shall be so landed: But it is His Majesty's Pleasure

nevertheless, that upon the importation of any such Rice into the Ports of London, Briffol, Portsmouth, Cowes, Liverpool, Lancaster, Falmouth, Pool, Whitehaven, Hull, Greenock, and Port Glafgaw, or either of them, in the Manner herein before expressed, the Importer shall be at Liberty to enter and land the same without Payment of any Duty whateyer; in which Case such Rice shall be warehoused, under the joint Locks of His Majely and the Proprietors, in such Warehouse or Warehouses as shall be approved of for that Purpose by the Commissioners of His Maiesty's Customs, or any Four or more of them. in that Part of Great Britain ca'led England, and any Three or more of them, in that Part of Great Britain called Scotland; every Expence attending which Warehousing shall be borne by the faid Proprietors: And that such Proprietor or Proprietors, or his or their known Agent, shall from Time to Time, at all seasonable Hours, as Occasion may require, have free Accels to fuch Warehouses, in the Presence of some proper Officer of the Customs, for the Purpose of skreening and shifting the Rice, to prevent it's receiving Damage. And that if any Rice, which shall be so imported from the Territories of the said United States into any of the Ports abovementioned respectively, and wareho ed as aforesaid, shall be taken out of the Warehouses wherein the same shall be secured, under the joint Locks of His Majesty and the Proprietors as aforesaid, for Home Consumption, the full Duties due and payable by Law, upon the Importation of such Rice into this Kingdom for Home Consumption, shall, previously to it's being taken out of such Warehouses, be paid to the Collector of His Majesty's Customs at the Ports where fuch Rice shall be so warehoused; but that such Proprietor, if he intends to export fuch Rice, shall have Liberty to export the same from such Warehouses respectively, under the usual Regulations, without Payment of any Duty whatever; and that if any Rice which shall have been imported into any Port of this Kingdom, not herein before specially named. and shall have been warehoused upon the Importer's Bond, in Manner aforesaid, shall, within the Time herein before mentioned, be taken out of the Warehouse wherein it shall have been so secured, to be exported directly from thence, the Bond entered into for the Payment of the faid Duties thereon shall be discharged and cancelled by Debenture or Debentures, made out and passed in the usual Manner, for the Quantity or Quantities of Rice duly exported. And if any Rice imported into any Port of this Kingdom, not herein before specially named, and warehoused in Manner aforesaid, shall be taken out of any such Warehouse for Home Consumption. the Remainder of the Duties, due and payable by Law, shall, previously to it's being taken of fuch Warehouse, be paid to the Collector of His . Majesty's

be so warehoused.

And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, and the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.
