WHEREAS by an Act passed in this present Session of Parliament, intituled, "An Act for indemnifying all Persons who have been concerned in advising or carrying into Execution an Order of Council respecting the Exportation of Wheat and Wheat Flour; for preventing Suits in consequence of the same, and for making further Provisions relative thereto; and also for authorizing His Majesty to prohibit the Exportation of Corn, Meal, Flour, Bread, Biscuit and Potatoes, and to permit the Importation of Corn, Meal or Flour on the Low Duties," it is enacted, that it shall and may be lawful for His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, and He and They is and are thereby authorized, by and with the Advice of His of Their Privy Council; until the End of the present Session of Parliament, from Time to Time, to prohibit generally, for a limited Time, the Exportation from Great Britain of any Sort of Corn, Meal or Flour, Bread or Biscuit whatsoever, or of Potatoes; and in like Manner to permit generally the Importation of Corn, Meal or Flour, subject to either of the Low

Duties specified in the Table D. contained in an Act passed in the Thirty-first Year of His present Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act for regulating the Importation and Exportation of Corn, and the Payment of the Duty on Foreign Corn imported, and of the Bounty on British Corn exported:" His Majesty therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hath thought fit to order, and it is hereby ordered, that from and after the Date of this His Majesty's Order in Council, it shall be lawful to import Wheat and Wheat-Meal or Flour upon the lowest Duty specified in the Table marked D. in the said Act passed in the Thirty-first Year of His present Majesty's Reign, until the End of the present Session of Parliament, or until such Time as His Majesty shall think fit to revoke this present Order.—And th Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary Direction hereint accordingly.

We beg Leave to assure your Majesty, that we will use every Exertion to detect those who are disaffected to your Government, and to bring their ill-founded Malevolence to publick View and publick Punishment.

We ardently pray for the Success of your Majesty's Arms in the present War, which France unprovoked has declared against your Majesty's Kingdoms. May Victory follow Victory, until the Justice of the British Cause shall be crowned by a Peace, solid in its Advantages to the Nation, and therein giving Happiness to your Majesty.

*Most Gracious Sovereign,*

**WE**, your Majesty's most loyal and dutiful Subjects, the Freeholders, Justices of the Peace, and Commissioners of Supply of the Stewartry of Kirkcudbright, beg Leave to express our Thanks to your Majesty for having embodied the Militia, and for having assembled your Parliament, at a Time when the most vigorous Measures were necessary for the Publick Security.

We have beheld with Indignation the hostile Aggressions of the Assembly possessing the Executive Power of France, who, in Pursuit of a System of Ambition and Aggrandizement, violate the Rights of Nations, endeavour to excite Disturbances in other Countries, and who, after having openly threatened the Subversion of established Governments and the Peace of Society, have declared War and commenced Hostilities against this Kingdom and her Allies.

Animated by the most firm Allegiance to your Majesty's Sacred Person and Government, and contending for our dearest Interests, we have to assure your Majesty of our warmest Support to maintain the Stability of our happy Constitution, the Security and Honour of your Majesty's Crown, and the Preservation of our Religion, our Liberty, and our Laws.

Confiding in the Vigour and Wisdom of your Majesty's Councils, and in the Zeal and Courage of a free and loyal People, we look forward to the happy Period when the Contest of Arms may give Place to the Arts and Blessings of Peace, and when Reason may regain her Sway over the mad Ambition which has disturbed the Tranquillity of Europe.

Viewing with Horror the Distraction and recent Crimes of another Nation, we will not impute indiscriminately to a whole People the deliberate Injustice, the cruel and sanguinary Guilt, which stain their History; persuaded that the Country which gave Birth to a Bouillé and to a Deseze, must still retain Multitudes of virtuous Men within her Territories, whose chief Blame and Misfortune it has been, that they wanted Courage or neglected to vindicate the Laws and the Principles of Justice at the Time when it was necessary to act.
