HEREAS by an Act passed in this present Session of Parliament, intituled, " An Act for indemnifying all Perfons who have been concerned in adviting or carrying into Execution an " Order of Council respecting the Exportation of Wheat and Wheat Flour; for preventing Suits in of confequence of the fame, and for making further . Provisions relative thereto; and also for authorizing " His Majesty to prohibit the Exportation of Corn, " Meat, Flour, Bread, Biscuit and Potatoes, and to " permit the Importation of Corn, Meal or Flour " on the Low Duties," it is enacted, that it shall and may be lawful for His Majerty, His Heirs and Successors, and He and They is and are thereby authorized, by and with the Advice of His of Their Privy Council; until the End of the prefent Sellion of Parliament, from Time to Time, to prohibit generally, for a limited Time, the Exportation from Great Britain of any Sort of Corn, Meal or Flour, Bread or Biscuit whatsoever, or of Potatoes; and in like Manner to permit generally the Importation of Corn, Mail or Flour, furjest to either of the Low Duties specified in the Table D. contained in an Act passed in the Thirty-first Year of His present Majesty's Reign, intituled, " An Act for regulating the "Importation and Exportation of Corn, and the " Payment of the Duty on Foreign Coin imported, "and of the Bounty on British Corn exported:" His Majesty therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hath thought fit to order, and it is hereby ordered, that from and after the Date of this His Majesty's Order in Council, it shall be lawful to import Wheat and Wheat-Meal or Flour upon the lowest Duty specified in the Table marked D. in the faid Act passed in the Thirty-first Year of His present Majesty's Reign, until the End of the present Session of Parliament, or until fuch Time as His Majesty shall think fit to revoke this present Order.-And th Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary Direction herein accordingly. -

Confiding in the Vigour and Wifdom of your Ma-

jesty's Councils, and in the Zeal and Courage of a free and loyal People, we look forward to the happy Period when the Contest of Arms may give Place to the Arts and Blessings of Peace, and when Reason may regain her Sway over the mad Ambition which

has disturbed the Tranquillity of Europe,
Viewing with Horror the Distraction and recent Crimes of another Nation, we will not impute in-difcriminately to a whole People the deliberate In-justice, the cruel and fanguinary Guilt, which stain their History; persuaded that the Country which gave Birth to a Bouillé and to a Deseze, must still retain Multitudes of virtuous Men within her Territories, whose chief Blame and Missortune it has been, that they wanted Courage or negelected to vindicate the Laws and the Principles of Justice at the Time when it was necessary to act.
