The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. HEREAS by an Act passed in this present Session of Parliament, intituled, " An Act for indemnifying all Perfons who have been co-u " cerned in advising or carrying into Execution an " Order of Council respecting the Exportation of "Wheat and Wheat Flour; for preventing Suits in confequence of the fame, and for making further Provisions relative thereto; and also for authorizing " His Majesty to prohibit the Exportation of Corn, Meal, Flour, Bread, Biscuit and Potatoes, and to permit the Importation of Corn, Meal or Flour " on the Low Duties," it is enacted, that it shall and may be lawful for His Majesty, His Heirs and Succeffors, and He and They is and are thereby authorized, by and with the Advice of His or Their Privy Council, until the Ead of the present Session of Parliament, from Time to Time, to prohibit generally, for a limited Time, the Exportation from Great Britain of any Sort of Corn, Meal or Flour, Bread or Biscuit whatsoever, or of Potatoes; and in like Manner to permit generally the Importation of Corn; Meal or Flour, subject to either of the Low Duties specified in the Table D. contained in an AS passed in the Thirty-first Year of His present Majesty's Reign, intituled, " An Act for regulating the "Importation and Exportation of Corn, and the " Payment of the Duty on Foreign Coan imported, " and of the Bounty on British Corn exported:" His Majesty therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hath thought fit to order, and it is hereby ordered, that from and after the Date of this His Majesty's Order in Council, it shall be lawful

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. THEREAS His Majesty was graciously pleafed, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Twenty-fixth Day of December last, to promise and declare, that the Bounties of Five Pounds for every Able Seaman, and Two Pounds Ten-Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, fit for His His Majesty's Service, should be paid in the Manner thereby directed to every fuch Able and Ordinary Scaman, not above the Age of Fifty nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should, on or before the Twenty-eighth Day of February then following, enter themselves to serve in His Majesty's Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of His Majefiy's Ships or Vessels, or Officers employed on Shore for railing when for the Service of the Royal Navy: And whereas His Majesty was also graciously pleased, by His said Proclamation, to declare, that all Able-hodied Landmen, not above the Age of Thirty-five nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should for enter themselves as aforesaid, should receive the Sum of Thirty Shillings each Man, as His Majefty's Royal Bounty: And whereas the Time thereby limited was, by Order in Council, prolonged

to import Wheat and Wheat-Meal or Flour upon the

Day of February to the Thirmeth Day of this inflant April: And whereas His Majesty was also graciously pleased, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Sixteenth Day of the faid Month of February last, to promife and declare, that a Reward of Twenty Shillings for every Able and Ordinary Seaman fit to serve on board His Majesty's Ships, should be paid to any Person who should discover any Seaman or Seamen who might conceal him or themseves, so that such Seaman or Seamen should be taken for His Majesty's Service on or before the Thirtieth Day of this instant April, by any of His Majesty's Sea Officers appointed to raise Men on Shore, or by the Captains and Commanders of any of His Majesty's Ships or Vessels in the Ports, or on the Coasts of this Kingdom: And it being judged expedient for His Majesty's Service that the said Bounties and Reward should be continued to be paid for some Time longer; His Majesty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby accordingly ordered, that the Time limited for Payment of the faid Bounties and Reward be prolonged and extended from the faid Thirtieth Day of this instant April to the Thirtieth Day of Jone next, inclusive: Whereof all Persons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themselves accordingly.
