raedt, and, it's believed, they possess themselves of these Passes, in order to their falling into the Country of Cleves, and the rather, because they are repairing the Bridge over the Roer at Linnich. Our Electur has fentiome Troops out of the lower Diocels to reinforce the Garifon of Bonne.

Liege, Nov. 4. The French Troops that are quartered in the Country of Juliers, possess themselves every day of same place or other, and seem intentioned to firetch out their quarters as far as the Moselle. Since our last they have taken a very strong Castle, called Schomberg, belonging to the Elector of Treves, as likewife Biackenheim, and they give out they will beliege Treves or Juliers with the first Prost.

Ditto, Nov. 8. The French have finally evacuated Maestricht, the Garifon marched out the 6th instanting at the Gate of St. Pierre, and foon after leveral Dutch Regiments, commanded by the Prince of Bight felt, entited the place. All thefe parts are filled with French Troops, by which means the Country is greatly ruined. The Duke of Lux-emburg has leave to return to Court, and, we are told, that the Mareschal de Belsonds will have the command of a Body of 15 ct 16000 men, to act in favor of the Suedes. The Prince of Orange is expected in a day or two at Maestrich, to settle the Assairs of that City, as well Civil as Military. The French at Aix la Chapelle, have arrested several Merchants belonging to this City.

Bruffels, Novemb. 8. Sunday last, being our Kings Birth day, was kept with the usual solemnity, and in the evening the Court was entertained with a Ball. The same day Maestricht was evacuated by the French, and taken possession of in the name of the States, by the Prince of Berkenfelt. The Dutch Garison is to consist of 8 Regiments of Foot, and 12 Squadrous of Horse and Dragoons. Yesterday Count Naffan went thither to view the Portifications, and give the necessary orders concerning them. The Dutch Troops are now upon removing out of the Country of Liege, in order to their going into quarters. Monsieur Calvo is marched with part of those Troops that were in Maestricht, towards Aix la Chapelle, where his quarters will be this Winter, being to command the Troops that are lodged in the Country of Juliers. The Duke of Luxemburg continues his quarters at Herac in Liege, having fent a confiderable detachement into the Country of Eyffelt, to seize all the places there that are tenable, which they have accordingly done. Yesterday arrived the Spanish Ordinary, but brought not the Ratifications, which are fo impatiently expected here, because of the great charge this Country in the mean time lies under. Yesterday the chief President of the Supreme Court at Malines, was arrested by order of his Excellency, for what cause is not known. The Sickness continues very great at Antwerp, and many persons of the best quality are dead there. Monsieur Boreel being recovered of his illacis, is upon his way hither from the Hague, as is Monlieue Odyke from Zealand; Monfieur Dickvelt has orders to May for them, that fo they may proceed together on their Embassic to

Ding, Nov. 11 His Excellency being informed that the Count de Nassaw was marching with the Dutch Troops under his command, which come from the Country of Liege, into the Spanish Territories, has

fent to the Prince of Orange, and to the faid Court, to represent to them, how much he is surprized at it. The Letters from Nimegies of the oth inflant, tell us, that the French Ambaffadors have agreed with those of Spain. for prolonging the term for the Exchange of the Ratifications till the 20 instant inclusive; and that thereis great appearance that a Peace between the Entperor and France, will be concluded this Winter. From Liege we have an account, that the Duke of Luxemburg was gone for Paria, leaving the command of the Kings Forces in those parts to Monsieur Cal-

This day the States of Holy Hague, Novemb. 12. land re-ast mbled, and the Heer Van Beverning, one of the Ambaffadors of this State at Minneguen, made his report to them. The Spanish Ratifications are not yet arrived, but we hear from Nimequen, that the term for the exchange of them, hath been prolonged till the 26 inflant. The 9th inflant the States. and the Prince of Orange, received Letters from the Count de Nussaw, commanding their Troops in the Country of Liege: wherein he gives an account, that the 6th inflant, about feven in the morning, the Sieur Calvo marched out of Maestriehr with the French Garison, which he drew up upon a Hill hard by, and there continued about an hour, while the Dutch Troops, commanded by the Prince of Birkenfelt, entred into the Town, where has been ' fince great rejoicing, on occasion of their geturner

ing under the obedience of this State.
