THEREAS by an Act passed in this present Session of Parliament, intituled, " An Act so for indemnifying all Persons who have been con-" cerned in advising or carrying into Execution an " Order of Council respecting the Exportation of " Wheat and Wheat Flour; for preventing Suits in " consequence of the same, and for making further " Provisions relative thereto; and also for autho-" rizing His Majesty to prohibit the Exportation of " Corn, Meal, Flour, Bread, Biscuit and Potatoes, " and to permit the Importation of Corn, Meal or " Flour on the Low Duties;" His Majesty is authorized, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, until the End of the prefent Session of Parliament, to permit generally, for a limited Time, the Importation of Foreign Corn, Meal or Flour, subject to either of the Low Duties specified in the Table D. in the Act passed in the Thirty-first Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, " An Act for regulating the Im-" portation and Exportation of Corn, and the Pay-" ment of the Duty on Foreign Corn imported, " and of the Bounty on British Corn exported," and in like Manner to recall fuch Permission; if Circumstances shall appear so to require: His Majesty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, by virtue of the Powers vested in Him by the first above-recited Act, hereby order, that it

shall be lawful until the End of the present Session of Parliament to import into any Port of this Kingdom any Foreign Rye and Rye-Meal at the lowest Duty specified in the said Table D. in the said Act passed in the Thirty-first Year of His Majesty's Reign .-And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give necessary Directions herein accordingly.

HEREAS by an Act passed in this present Session of Parliament, intituled, "An Act " for indemnifying all Perfons who have been cou-" cerned in advising or carrying into Execution an " Order of Council respecting the Exportation of " Wheat and Wheat Flour; for preventing Suits in " consequence of the same, and for making further " Provisions relative thereto; and also for authorizing " His Majesty to prohibit the Exportation of Corn, " Meal, Flour, Bread, Biscuit and Potatoes, and to " permit the Importation of Corn, Meal or Flour " on the Low Duties," it is enacted, that it shall and may be lawful for His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, and He and They is and are thereby authorized, by and with the Advice of His or Their Privy Council, until the End of the present Session of Parliament, from Time to Time, to prohibit generally, for a limited Time, the Exportation from

Great Britain of any Sort of Corn, Meal or Flour, Bread or Biscuit whatsoever, or of Potatoes; and in like Manner to permit generally the Importation of Corn, Meal or Flour, subject to either of the Low Duties specified in the Table D. contained in an Act passed in the Thirty-first Year of His present Majesty's Reign, intituled, " An Act for regulating the " Importation and Exportation of Corn, and the " Payment of the Duty on Foreign Corn imported, " and of the Bounty on British Corn exported:" His Majesty therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hath thought fit to order, and it is hereby ordered, that from and after the Date of this His Majesty's Order in Council, it shall be lawful to import Wheat and Wheat-Meal or Flour upon the lowest Duty specified in the Table marked D. in the faid Act passed in the Thirty-first Year of His present Majesty's Reign, until the End of the present Session of Parliament, or until fuch Time as His Majesty shall think fit to revoke this present Order .-- And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary Directions herein accordingly

May it please your Majesty,

THE gracious Letter with which your Majesty has been pleased to honour this Meeting of the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland was received with the utmost Respect and Gratitude.

As dutiful Subjects of a virtuous and affectionate Sovereign, we have a just Sense of the Considence which your Majesty reposes in our Loyalty and Attachment to your Person and Government, and in our Zeal for the Cultivation of found Learning and true Religion. We feel in it a most pleasing Recompence for having done our Duty, and we trust that our future Conduct will continue to deserve the same honourable Proofs of Royal Favour and Protection.

Convinced, by long and happy Experience, of your Majesty's good Disposition to the Church of Scotland, we rely, with the most perfect Security, on your Resolution to maintain it in all its established Rights and Privileges. We regard the present Declaration of your Royal Purpose to this Effect as a powerful Encouragement to direct our Proceedings to those great Objects for which we are affembled: And it shall be our Care, in Compliance with your Majesty's Desire, to labour affiduously in promoting such Measures as are best calculated to diffuse the Principles and Practice of genuine Christianity, to check the Progress of Vice and Impiety, and to infill into all Ranks of Men that Attention to moral Duties,

that Love of Order and Obedience to the Laws, upon which the Peace, Harmony and true Happiness of Society so entirely depend. These are the great Ends of our Publick Establishment; and we deem it a peculiar Felicity that we live under a Prince who, by reminding us of our proper Work, teaches us that the faithful Discharge of our Duty to God and our Country is the most certain Recommendation to his Favour.

We beg Leave to return our humble Thanks to your Majesty for your persevering Attention to the Interests of Christian Knowledge and Virtue in the Highlands and Islands of Scotland. We consider your Royal Donation for this Purpose as a fresh Proof of your Paternal Care for all your Subjects; and we shall endeavour to apply it in such a Manner as may best promote the generous and pious Design for which it is bestowed.

The hereditary and warm Attachment of the Earl of Leven to the Cause of Civil and Religious Liberty, his affectionate Regard for the Church of Scotland, his exemplary Conduct in private Life, and his approved Experience and Knowledge in the Administration of his important Office, render the Re-appointment of him to represent your Majesty's Royal Person a most acceptable Mark of Attention to this Assembly.

Permit us to assure your Majesty that it shall be our Study to conduct all our Proceedings with that Unanimity, cordial Affection and Christian Charity to one another, which become us as the Servants of the Prince of Peace, and which are so necessary for bringing the Purposes of our Meeting to a happy Conclusion.

That Almighty God may protect your Majesty's Person, prolong your Days, and direct your Councils: That He may bless the Queen, the Prince of Wales, and all the Royal Family: That He may continue with us the many National Bleffings which we enjoy under your Majesty's mild Administration, and transmit them as a precious Inheritance to our Posterity; and that, after reigning long with Wisdom and Felicity over a free, loyal and happy People, you may receive from Him the Recompence of an Heavenly Crown, are the fervent Prayers of

WE, your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal Subjects, the Ministers and Elders of the Church of Scotland, met in the General Assembly, think it our Duty, in the present Situation of Public Affairs, to express our Zeal for the Welfare of our Country, and our affectionate Regard for a Prince who is the Guardian of Liberty and the Father of his People.

We have beheld, with the strongest Feelings of Disapprobation, the infidious Designs and violent Attempts of the French Nation to overturn the Constitutions

stitutions and disturb the Peace of most of the other Nations in Europe. We are fully fenfible, that in consequence of the Declaration of War by the National Convention of France against Great Britain, and by the Acts of Hostility in which they have been engaged, your Majesty, with the Approbation of Parliament, was necessarily led to take vigorous Measures for repressing their Ambition and defeating their unjust Enterprizes.

Though some of the People under our Care were deluded by the dangerous Principles which were industriously propagated, we can assure your Majesty, that the great Body of the Members of this National Church continues strongly attached to your Majesty's Person and Government, and ardently desirous of the Success of those Measures which, with the Blessing of Providence, may transmit our excellent Constitution

unimpaired to the latest Posterity.

Your Majesty has been graciously pleased to express, by the Lord High Commissioner, the Sense which you entertain of the Boldness and Zeal with which the Ministers of the Church of Scotland manifested their Loyalty upon a late trying Occasion; a Mark of your Royal Approbation, which we received with profound Respect, and which affords us the most entire Satisfaction, because we are conscious that

it is not n isplaced.

Attached by the Genius of Presbyterian Government to good Order, no less than to Freedom, we have employed all our Influence in counteracting the Tendency of the feditious Writings which were affiduously circulated, and in warning the People committed to our Care against the busy Efforts of defigning or deluded Men. In the true Spirit of those Principles which our Fathers, in former Seasons of Danger and Alarm, strenuously afferted, we shall continue to cherish in the Minds of the People, Loyalty to our gracious Sovereign, Veneration for the British Constitution, and Obedience to the Laws: And, having nothing so much at Heart as the Glory of God, the Honour of your Majesty, and the Support of your Government, we trust that while we approve ourselves the dutiful Servants of the Prince of Peace, we shall enjoy the Continuance of your Royal Protection, and the good Opinion of all the true Friends of their Country.

While we congratulate your Majesty upon the Check which, under Divine Providence, has already been given to the alarming Progress of our Enemies, we offer our earnest Supplications, that the God of Battles may continue to bless your Fleets and Armies with Success, and may bring the present War to a speedy and happy Termination: That mutual Love and Confidence may ever subsist between your Majefty and your Subjects, and that a Race of Kings of your Royal Line, Lovers of Religion, Liberty and their Country, may always sway the Sceptte over
