The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. WHEREAS by an Act passed in this present Session of Parliament, intituled, " An Act " for indemnifying all Persons who have been con-« cerned in advising or carrying into Execution an " Order of Council respecting the Exportation of " Wheat and Wheat Flour; for preventing Suits in consequence of the same, and for making further " Provisions relative thereto; and also for autho-" rizing His Majesty to prohibit the Exportation of " Corn, Meal, Flour, Bread, Biscuit and Potatoes, and to permit the Importation of Corn, Meal or " Flour on the Low Duties;" His Majesty is authorized, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, until the End of the present Session of Parliament, to permit generally, for a limited Time, the Importation of Foreign Corn, Meal or Flour, subject to either of the Low Duties specified in the Table D. in the Act passed in the Thirty-first Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, " An Act for regulating the Im-" portation and Exportation of Corn, and the Pay-" ment of the Duty on Foreign Corn imported, " and of the Bounty on British Corn exported," and in like Manner to recall fuch Permission, if Circumstances shall appear so to require: His Majesty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, by virtue of the Powers vested in Him by the first above-recited Act, hereby order, that it shall be lawful until the End of the present Session of
