The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in this present Session of Parliament, intituled, " An Act for indemnifying all Persons who have been concerned in advising or carrying into Execution an Order of Council respecting the Exportation of Wheat and Wheat Flour; for preventing Suits in consequence of the same, and for making further Provisions relative thereto; and also for authorizing His Majesty to prohibit the Exportation of Corn, Meal, Flour, Bread, Biscuit and Potatoes, and to permit the Importation of Corn, Meal or Flour on the Low Duties;" His Majesty is authorized, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, until the End of the present Session of Parliament, to permit generally, for a limited Time, the Importation of Foreign Corn, Meal or Flour, subject to either of the Low Duties specified in the Table D. in the Act passed in the Thirty-first Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, " An Act for regulating the Importation and Exportation of Corn, and the Payment of the Duty on Foreign Corn imported, and of the Bounty on British Corn exported," and in like Manner to recall such Permission, if Circumstances shall appear so to require: His Majesty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, by virtue of the Powers vested in Him by the first above-recited Act, hereby order, that it shall be lawful until the End of the present Session of Parliament to import into any Port of this Kingdom any Foreign Rye and Rye-Meal at the lowest Duty specified in the said Table D. in the said Act passed

in the Thirty-first Year of His Majesty's Reign.— And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give necessary Directions herein accordingly.
