The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. 7 HEREAS by an Act passed in this prefent Sellion of Parliament, intituled, " An Act " for indemnifying all Perfons who have been concerned in advising or carrying into Execution an " Order of Council respecting the Exportation of " Wheat and Wheat Flour; for preventing Suits in " confequence of the fame, and for making further " Provisions relative thereto; and also for autho-" rizing His Majesty to prohibit the Exportation of " Corn, Meal, Flour, Bread, Bifcuit and Potatoes, " and to permit the Importation of Corn, Meal or " Flour on the Low Duties ;" His Majefty is authorized, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, until the End of the prefent Selfion of Parliament, to permit generally, for a limited Time, the Importation of Foreign Corn, Meal or Flour, fubject to either of the Low Duties specified in the Table D. in the Act paffed in the Thirty-first Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, " An Act for regulating the Im-" portation and Exportation of Corn, and the Pay-" ment of the Duty on Foreign Corn imported, " and of the Bounty on British Corn exported," and in like Manner to recall fuch Permission, if Circumitances shall appear to to require : His Majesty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy

Council, by virtue of the Powers vefted in Him by the first above-recited Act, hereby order, that it shall be lawful until the End of the prefent Session of Parliament to import into any Port of this Kingdom any Foreign Rye and Rye-Meal at the lowest Duty specified in the faid Table D. in the faid Act passed in the Thirty-first Year of His Majesty's Reign.— And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary Directions herein accordingly.
