P R E S E N T,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in this present Session of Parliament, intituled, "An Act for indemnifying all Persons who have been concerned in advising or carrying into Execution an Order of Council respecting the Exportation of Wheat and Wheat Flour; for preventing Suits in consequence of the same, and for making further Provisions relative thereto; and also for authorizing His Majesty to prohibit the Exportation of Corn, Meal, Flour, Bread, Biscuit and Potatoes, and to permit the Importation of Corn, Meal or Flour on the Low Duties;" His Majesty is authorized, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, until the End of the present Session of Parliament, to permit generally, for a limited Time, the Importation of Foreign Corn, Meal or Flour, subject to either of the Low Duties specified in the Table D. in the Act passed in the Thirty-first Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act for regulating the Importation and Exportation of Corn, and the Payment of the Duty on Foreign Corn imported, and of the Bounty on British Corn exported," and in like Manner to recall such Permission, if Circumstances shall appear so to require: His Majesty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy

Council, by virtue of the Powers vested in Him by the first above-recited Act, hereby order, that it shall be lawful until the End of the present Session of Parliament to import into any Port of this Kingdom any Foreign Rye and Rye-Meal at the lowest Duty specified in the said Table D. in the said Act passed in the Thirty-first Year of His Majesty's Reign.— And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary Directions herein accordingly.

To the KING's Most Excellent Majesty,

The humble Address of the Ministers and Elders of the Provincial Synod of Ross, met at Dingwall, the 24th Day of April, 1793.

May it please your Majesty,

WE, your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal Subjects, the Ministers and Elders of the Synod of Ross, beg Leave to approach your Throne, to declare our firm Loyalty and Affection to your Majesty's Person and Family, and our unshaken Attachment to the excellent Constitution of this Kingdom, as established at the glorious Revolution in the Year 1768; an Æra so lately commemorated with public Gratitude, and which ought never to be forgotten.

We declare our utmost Detestation of all seditious and inflammatory Writings, tending to disturb the Peace and good Order of Society, to alienate the Minds

Minds of your Majesty's Subjects from their Duty and Allegiance to your sacred Person, and calculated to seduce them from a due Submission to the Laws of this free and happy Country.

We rejoice to find those Sentiments universally prevalent among the People in the different Parishes committed to our Charge; and it will be our constant Care to cherish them, deeply sensible of the inestimable Blessings we enjoy under a Form of Government that has stood the Test of Ages, and which, we trust, will be transmitted in it's full Energy to future Generations.

That the best Blessings of Heaven may be bestowed on your Majesty's sacred Person and illustrious Family; and that, after a long and prosperous Reign, you may receive a Crown that fadeth not away, is the ardent Wish and Prayer of,

And, as a further Encouragement, His Majesty is hereby pleased to promise a Reward of ONE HUNDRED GUINEAS to any Person (except as aforesaid) who shall make such discovery as aforesaid; to be paid by the Right Hon. the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, upon the Conviction of One or more of the Offenders.
