Liston, May 11.

On Monday Morning the 29th Ultimo, Her Royal Highness the Princess of Brazil was delivered of a Princess: And on Monday, the 6th Instant, the new-born Princess was baptized, by the Cardinal Patriarch, by the Name of Maria: His Catholic Majesty, represented by the Infante Dom Pedro, and the Dowager Princels of Brazil, were Sponfors. Both those Events were respectively celebrated by the Firing of the Artillery of the Caffle and Fleet, by Illuminations and many other Marks of public Rejoicing.

Upon this Occasion the Three vacant Great Crosses were filled up, viz. Two of the Order of Christ were conferred on the Marquis de Castel Melhor and the Count de Soure, and One of the Order of Avis on the Count de Aveiras. Several Titles of Nobility were also granted, and various Promotions, both Civil and Military, took Place.

Bodenheim, May 21.

On the 15th Instant the advanced Posts of the French were repulsed from Bliescastel by Colonel Sockule. Whilst the advanced Posts were thus engaged, Monsieur Houchard endeavoured, with Twenty Thousand Infantry and a considerable Corps of Cavalry, to turn Prince Hohenloe's Camp near Homburg, and to take Possessin of the important Position of Kayserlautern; but Prince Hohenloe, having received Instination of that Intention, quitted Homburg, and returned with the greatest Expedition to Kayserlautern, where he arrived only Half an Hour before the French Army, and thus secured that Position. The Country of Deux Ponts, Homburg and Carliberg is consequently again abandoned; and the French, upon taking Possessin of the several Towns deserted by the Prussians; committed great Devastations.

Oftend, June 1.

A Column of 5000 French Troops arrived before Furnes about Seven o'Clock Yesterday Morning: The Garrison, composed of near 1200 Dutch, opposed them very bravely for Four Hours. They had only Three Pieces of Cannon, Three-Pounders, whilst the French had more than Twelve Eight-Pounders in this Action. The Loss of the French is unknown. The Dutch, after having had Six Men killed, and Ten wounded, were obliged to retreat, which they effected in good Order, and arrived here this Evening with their Cannon and Baggage. The Prench, after having plundered the principal Inhabitants, left Furnes at Ten o'Clock last Night, taking with them the Bailiss, Burgomasser, and Five Magistrates, as Hostages for the Contributions which they demanded in Cattle, Corn, &c. The Dutch, having been informed of their Retreat, returned thither this Assertance in the Contribution of German Troops have arrived at Furnes from Ypres and Courtray.
