And, as a further Encouragement, His Majesty is hereby pleased to offer a Reward of TWO HUNDRED GUINEAS to any Person making such Discovery as aforesaid, to be paid by the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, upon the Conviction of any One or more of the Offenders.
