Dublin Castle, June 5, 1793.

Yesterday being the Anniversary of His Majesty's the Great Guns at the Salute Battery in His Majesty's Park the Phoenix were fired three Rounds, and answered by Vollies from the Regiments in Garrison, which were drawn up in the Royal Square at the Barracks. At Noon there was a very numerous Assembly of the Nobility and other Perfons of Distinction at the Castle, who appeared in great' Splendor to compliment his Excellency the Lord Lieutenant, before whom an Ode, fet to Mufic, was performed. In the Evening a Play was given by his Excellency to the Ladies; and at Night there were Bonfires, Illuminations, and all other Demonftrations of Joy throughout the City.

Aranjuez, April 20.

Intelligence has been received here, that, on the 23d Instant, the Spanish Troops, under the Command of Don Ventura Caro, attacked the Fort of Andaya, whilst another Corps occupied the Heights in the Neighbourhood of the French Camp. Course of the Action the Spaniards spiked Six Cannon, drove the French from their advanced Work and Intrenchments, and, after having destroyed the Incampment of Biriatu, killed several of the Enemy and taken a considerable Number of Cattle, retired to Vera, having only Six Men wounded.

Accounts are also received from General Don Antonio Ricardos, Commander in Chief of the Army of Catalonia, that, on the 21st Instant, a Body of Troops, amounting to less than 3000 Men, attacked the Town of Ceret, defended by more than 3000 French, and, though the Spaniards were without any Cannon, they forced the Town, after an Engagement of Three Hours, put the Enemy to Flight, and took their

Cannon.

Aranjuez, May 29.

On the 5th Instant the Squadron under the Command of Admiral Borja, failed from Carthagena, and in a few Days arrived at Barcelona, from whence it continued it's Course towards the Coast of Italy.

Corunna, June 2.

On the 6th Ultimo Admiral Aristizabal failed from Ferrol for Cadiz with Six Ships of the Line and One. Frigate.
