HIS Day the Lords being met, a Mesfage was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by Mr. Quarme, Yeoman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that The Lords, authorized by wirtue of His Majesty's Commission for declaring His Royal Assent to several Alls agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate Attendance of this Honourable House in the House of Peers, to bear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the faid Commission, impowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the faid A&s, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to

An Act for continuing in the East India Company. for a further Term, the Possession of the British Territories in India, together with their exclusive Trade, under certain Limitations; for establishing further Regulation for the Government of the said Territories, and the petter Administration of Justice within the same; for appropriating to certain Uses the Revenues and Profits of the faid Company; and for making Provision for the good Order and Government of the Totons of Calcutta, Madras, and B. mbay.

An Act requiring and authorizing Charles Gilbert, Esquire, Treasurer of the Eastern Division, and the Reverend Francis Tutie, the legal Representative of Randolph Tutte, deceased, late Treasurer of the Western Division of the County of Sussex, to pay cer-tain Sums of Money received by them the faid Treasu-ters, or either of them, on Account of the not raising

the Militia of the faid County, into the Public Stocks of the faid Divisions, to be applied as is therein directed, and for other Purposes therein mentioned.
