Westminster, June 11.

THIS Day the Lords being met, a Message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by Mr. Quarme, Yeoman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them; that The Lords, authorized by virtue of His Majesty's Commission for declaring His Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate Attendance of this Honourable House in the House of Peers, to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to

An Act for continuing in the East India Company, for a further Term, the Possession of the British Territories in India, together with their exclusive Trade, under certain Limitations; for establishing further Regulation for the Government of the said Territories, and the better Administration of Justice within the same; for appropriating to certain Uses the Revenues and Profits of the said Company; and for making Provision for the good Order and Government of the Towns of Calcutta, Madras, and Bombay.

An Act requiring and authorizing Charles Gilbert, Esquire, Treasurer of the Eastern Division, and the Reverend Francis Tuttle, the legal Representative of Randolph Tuttle, deceased, late Treasurer of the Western Division of the County of Sussex, to pay certain Sums of Money received by them the said Treasurers, or either of them, on Account of the not raising

the Militia of the said County, into the Public Stocks of the said Divisions, to be applied as is therein directed, and for other Purposes therein mentioned.

An Act to vary and extend the Line of the Canal authorized to be made by an Act, passed in the Thirty-first Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled, An Act for making and maintaining a navigable Canal from the City of Hereford to the City of Gloucester, with a collateral Cut from the same to the Town of Newent in the County of Gloucester; and to amend the said Act.

An Act for making effectual the Statute Labour, and for levying Conversion Money in lieu of Labour, in certain Cases; and for otherwise regulating, making and repairing High Roads and Bridges in the County of Caithness.

An Act for enlarging the Term and Powers of an Act, passed in the Twelfth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled, An Act for repairing and widening the Road from the Forty-eighth Mile Stone, in the Parish of Cardington, in the present Turnpike Road between Hitchin and Bedford, to Great Barford Bridge; and for continuing a Road from thence to the Great Northern Road near Fensford Bridge, in the County of Bedford.
