A^T the Court at St. James's, the 14th of June, 1793,

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. 7HEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty's Order in Council of the 7th of December, 1792, for prohibiting the Exporting out of this Kingdom, or carrying Coaltwife, Gunpowder or Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, expired upon the 7th Day of this inftant June: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the faid Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer; His Majesty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit and command, that no Perfon or Perfons whatfoever (except the Master General of the Ordnance for His Majesty's Service) do, at any Time during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the faid 7th Day of this inftant June, prefume to transport, into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coastwife, any Gunpowder or Salt Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or faip or lade any Gunpowder or Salt Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, on Board any Ship or Veffel, in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, or carrying the fame Coastwife, without Leave or Permission in that Behalf first obtained from His Majefty, or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring and fuffering the respective Forfeitures and Penalties inflicted by an Act passed in the Twentyninth Year of His late Majesty's Reign, intituled, " An Act to impower His Majefty to prohibit the " Exportation of Salt Petre, and to enforce the " Law for impowering His Majesty to prohibit the

" Exportation of Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition; and also to impower His Maipfly to reftrain the carrying Coastwife of Salt Petre, Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition:—And the Lords Commissioners of His Majefty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master General of the Ordnance, and His Majesty Secretary at War, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

A CHAPTER of the Moit Noble Order of the Garter having been fummoned to meet this Day, the Knights Companions, in their Mantles and Collars, with the Officers of the Order hereafter mentioned, in their Mantles, Chains and Badges, attended the Sovereign in his own Apartment; and being called over by Garter, a Proceffion was made from thence to the Great Council-Chamber, in the following Order:

Marquis of Stafford. Duke of Grafton. Earl of Hertford.

His Royal Highness the Duke of Gloucester.

His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales.

Black Rod.

Garter.

The SOVEREIGN.

The Sovereign and Knights Companions being feated, Garter acquainted the Sovereign, that the Bifhop of Lichfield and Coventry, Dean of Windfor, attended at the Door, and humbly prayed to be admitted to take the Oath of Register of that Most Noble Order.

Then the Bifhop, in his Mantle over his Epifcopal Habit, was conducted by Garter and Black Rod (the latter carrying, on a Crimfon Velvet Cufhion, the Regifter's Gold Chain and Badge) and the Bifhop kneeling near the Sovereign, the Oath was adminifered administered to him by Garter ; which being done, Black Rod, kneeling, prefented to the Sovereign the was Gold Chain and Badge, which His Majefly pleafed to put over the Register's Neck, who, having kiffed His Majesty's Hand, withdrew to his Place.

The Register then acquainted the Sovereign, that the Bifhop of Salifbury attended at the Door, and humbly prayed to be admitted to take the Oath of Chancellor of that Moft Noble Order; whereupon, being in his Mantle, over his Episcopal Habit, he was conducted to the Sovereign by Garter and Black Rod, the latter carrying, on a Crimson Velvet. Cushion, the Purse, Gold Chain and Badge, and the Bishop kneeling near the Sovereign, the Oath. was administered to him by the Register; and being invested with the Gold Chain and Badge, the Purfe was delivered to him by the Sovereign; and, having kiffed His Majesty's Hand, withdrew to his Place.

Then the Chancellor fignified to the Chapter the Sovereign's Pleasure for alling up the Three vacant Stalls; and as, by the Statutes, none but a Knight can be elected, Garter and Black Rod were fent to introduce James Marquis of Salifbury, who was knighted by the Sovereign with the Sword of State; after which his Lordship withdrew.

The Knights Companions proceeded to the Election; and the Suffrages being collected by the Chancellor, and prefented to the Sovereign, James Mar-quis of Salitbury was, by His Majetty's Command, declared duly elected; his Lordihip was thereupon received at the Door of the Chapter-Room by the Two Junior Knights, and conducted between them to the Sovereign, preceded by Garter (bearing the Enfigns of the Order on a Cushion) and Black Rod.

Garter prefenting the Garter to the Sovereign, His Majesty delivered it to the Two Senior Knights, who buckled it on his Lordship's Left Leg, the Chancellor pronouncing the Admonition.

Garter then prefented the Ribbon with the George to the Sovereign, and his Lordship kneeling, the Sovereign, with the Affiftance of the Two Senior Knights, put it over his Shoulder, the Chancellor, in the mean Time, pronouncing the Admonition; and the Marquis, having kified His Majefty's Hand, and feverally faluted the Knights prefent, withdrew.

After which the Knights Companions proceeded to a Second Election; and the Suffrages being col-lected as before, john Earl of Weitmorland, Lord Lieutenant of the Kingdom of Ireland (who had the Honor of Knighthood conferred on him by Patent under the Great Seal, bearing Date the 26th Day of November laft) was, by His Majefty's Command, declared duly elected.

The Chapter proceeded to a Third Election ; and the Suffrages being collected as before, Frederick Earl of Carlifle, late Knight of the Thiftle, was, by His Majefty's Command, declared duly elected ; and his Lordship was introduced and invested with the Garden, Ribbon and George in the fame Manner as the Marquis of Salifbury had been; and, the like Formalities having been observed, he withdrew.

Garter then calling over the Knights, a Procession was made back to His Majefty's Apartment, in the Order as before, except that the Chancellor and Regifter walked in their Places.

To the KING's Moft Excellent Majefty.

'May it please your Majesty,

WE, your Majefty's most loyal and dutiful Subjects, interested in the Island of Tobago and refident in London, humbly beg Leave to congratulate. your Majesty on the brilliant Success of your Ma-

jefty's Arms under the Command of General Cuyler; and at the fame Time to lay our grateful Thanks at the Foot of your Majesty's Throne, for the inestimable Benefits we are again called to enjoy by the Re-union of that Colony to your Majesty's Dominions.

After fuffering for Twelve Years under every Species of Mifery, at one Time produced by uncontrouled and almost insupportable Despotism, and at another Time by the still more insupportable and uncontroulable Fury of popular Anarchy, the Inha-bitants of Tobago have been reftored to the Bleffings of your Majesty's mild Administration, and to the Protection of those Laws and that Constitution, which have long been, and now are more than ever, the Envy and Admiration of the World.

When we reflect that the Lives and Properties of our Friends and Relations, as well as our own Properties, have thus been inatched from inevitable Deftruction, we cannot find Words to express our Gratitude to your Majesty for your paternal Care and early Recollection of the Sufferings of your ancient Subjects of Tohago, and for the Meafures which your Majetty gracioully directed to be purfued for their Relief, fo gallantly carried into Execution by a Handful of your Majelty's brave Troops.

Looking back with Horror on the Dangers from which we and our Fellow Subjects in Tobago have escaped, we dare with Confidence hope, that your Majefty will be gracioufly pleafed to order fuch Measures to be purfued as shall for ever preferve the Inhabitants of Tobago from failing back into that Abyfs of Slavery, from which they have been almost miraculoufly emancipated.

Whitehall, June 13. His Catholic Majesty has published an Edict at Madrid, which was passed the 1st of April last by the Council of Finances, prohibiting all Trade and Intercourfe with France, her Poffettions and Inha-This Edict contains a positive Prohibition. bitants. against the Importation into any of the Dominions of Spain, either in French or other Shipping, of any of the Manufactures or Produce of France, or any Baccallao or other dried Fish; and also of all Salted and Pickled Provisions, and of all other French Articles whatfoever. This Prohibition alfo extends to all Articles and Produce either of Spain or of other Countries, which may have been dyed, bleached, dreffed or otherwife improved in France; and which may have been first imported and afterwards paid Duties in France. But there is a Proviso. that with regard to all Articles which are not comprehended in this Prohibition, not only the Subjects of Spain, but the Subjects of other Friendly Powers, may continue their Trade as formerly, only observing the Precautions that are necessary for preventing the Importation of any French Merchandize into the Do-minions of Spain. The fame Edict contains various Regulations with regard to French Commodities which had already been imported into Spain, requiring, among other Things, that they should be registered within Fifteen Days, and disposed of within Six Months. This Edict also requires that, after the Expiration of Three Months from the Date of its Publication, no Merchandize or other Articles of Traffic, coming from the Dominious of Friendly Powers, fhall be, admitted to Entry at any of the Cuftom-Houfes of Spain, without fufficient Proof that fuch Merchandize and other Articles of Traffic did not come from the French Poffeffions. It declares, however, that Certificates, expressing Quality and Quantity of the Goods, their Fabric or Growth, from the Magifirates or Infactor of Manufactories, atteffed by the Conful in Spain (if there be any) of the Cities and Ports from whence fuch Merchandize and other Articles of Traffic may come, shall be fufficient Proof

Proof that fuch Merchandize and other Articles are not of the Product of France, and had not been improved or paid Duties within any of the Posseffions

of France. This Edict was accompanied with Instructions for the Intendants and other O.hcers of the Revenue, for the more effectual Prohibition of all Trade with France, without injuring the Commerce with other Countries. There is a particular Instruction with regard to the Manufactures of Great Britain : And, in order to avoid any Detriment which might enfue either to the Spanish or British Subjects, from the great Similarity of various British Manufactures to the Manufactures of France, it is provided, that upon the Arrival of any fuch British Manufactures at the Ports of Spain, it shall be fufficient Proof of their not being French Manufactures, if Certificates be produced from the Magiltrates of the Ports of Great. Britain from whence fuch British Manufactures may. come, attefted by the Spanish Conful (if there should be one) that fuch Manufactures are of the Fabric of Great Britain : And, upon the Production of fuch Certificates, fuch British Manufactures shall be admitted to Entry, and be permitted to be fold, on paying the accustomed Duties. There is also an Instruction, requiring Letters of Marque and Privateers, which may bring French Prizes into the Ports of Spain, to conform to the Maritime Ordinance in that Respect.

Gascoyne; such Arms being first duly exemplified according to the Laws of Arms, and recorded in the Heralds Office :

And also to order that these His Majesty's feveral Conceffions and Declarations be registered in His College of Arms.
