

*Majesty, intituled, An Act for continuing, amending and rendering more effectual so much of Three Acts of Parliament for repairing the Roads from Seven Oaks, Tunbridge Wells and Kipping's Cross, to Lamberhurst Pound and Pullen's Hill, in the County of Kent, and to Flimwell Vent, in the County of Sussex, as relates to the Road leading from Seven Oaks Common to Woodsgate, Tunbridge Wells and Kipping's Cross, in the said County of Kent; and for amending, widening and keeping in Repair the Road from Tunbridge Wells to Woodsgate aforesaid.*

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the 7th of December, 1792, for prohibiting the Exporting out of this Kingdom, or carrying Coastwise, Gunpowder or Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, expired upon the 7th Day of this instant June: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the said Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer; His Majesty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit and command, that no Person or Persons whatsoever (except the Master General of the Ordnance for His Majesty's Service) do, at any Time during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the said 7th Day of this instant June, presume to transport, into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coastwise, any Gunpowder or Salt Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or ship or lade any Gunpowder or Salt Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, on Board any Ship or Vessel, in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, or carrying the same Coastwise, without Leave or Permission in that Behalf first obtained from His Majesty, or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring and suffering the respective Forfeitures and Penalties inflicted by an Act passed in the Twentieth Year of His late Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act to empower His Majesty to prohibit the Exportation of Salt Petre, and to enforce the Law for empowering His Majesty to prohibit the Exportation of Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition; and also to empower His Majesty to restrain the carrying Coastwise of Salt Petre, Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition:—And the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain,

the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master General of the Ordnance, and His Majesty's Secretary at War, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

THIS Day The King, Sovereign of the Most Ancient and Noble Order of the Thistle, was graciously pleased to invest His Grace James Duke of Montrose with the Ensigns thereof.

His Grace was conducted into the Royal Presence, preceded by His Royal Highness the Duke of Clarence, Senior Knight of the Order, and attended by the Duke of Buccleugh and Duke of Roxburgh, the Two next Knights in Seniority present, and, with usual Reverences, advanced to the Sovereign, and, kneeling down, was knighted; and, having kissed His Majesty's Hand, rose up.

Then the Right Honorable Henry Dundas, His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, by the Sovereign's special Command, administered the Oath to his Grace, Green Rod not having yet taken the Oath of Office. The Ensigns of the Order, on a Crimson Velvet Cushion, were presented, by Green Rod kneeling, to the Sovereign, who put the Ribbon over the Duke's Left Shoulder; and his Grace, then kneeling, had again the Honor of kissing His Majesty's Hand: He then rose up, and, making a low Reverence, withdrew.

The Ceremony was performed soon after the Levee, in His Majesty's Closet, several of the Great Officers of the Court being present.
