THEREAS by an Act, paffed in the Tairtyfecond Year of His prefent Majefty's Reign, intituled, " An Act for regulating the Allowance of " the Drawback and Payment of the Bounty on the " Exportation of Sugar, and for permitting the " Importation of Sugar and Coffee into the Bahama " and Bermuda Islands, in Foreign Ships," it is, amongst other Things, enacted, That it shall and may be lawful to import into the Port of Naffau in the Island of New Providence, one of the Bahama Islands, and into fuch other Port or Ports in the faid Bahama Islands, or the Island of Bermuda, as shall be approved by His Majefty in Council, Sugar and Coffee, the Produce of any Foreign Country or Plantation, in fuch Foreign Ships, and fubject to fuch Regulations as are prefcribed in an Act, paffed in the Twenty-feventh Year of His prefent Majesty's Reign, intituled, " An Act for allowing the Importation and Exporta-" tion of certain Goods, Wares and Merchandize, in " the Ports of Kingfton, Savannah la Mar, Montego " Bay, and Santa Lucea, in the Island of Jamaica; in " the Port of St. George, in the Island of Grenada; " in the Port of Rofeau, in the Island of Dominica; " and in the Port of Naffau, in the Ifland of New " Providence, one of the Bahama Islands, under cer-" tain Regulations and Reftrictions," with refpect to the Ports therein mentioned ; and in another Act, made in the Thirtieth Year of His prefent Majesty's Reign, incituled, "An Act for amending an Act, paffed in " the Twenty-feventh Year of the Reign of His

" prefent Majefty, intituled, An Act for allowing " the Importation and Exportation of certain Goods, " Wares and Merchandize, in the Ports of King-" fton, Savannah la Mar, Montego Bay, and Santa " Lucea, in the Ifland of Jamaica; in the Port of " St. George, in the Ifland of Grenada; in the Port of Rofeau, in the Ifland of Dominica; and in the " Port of Naffau, in the Ifland of New Providence, " one of the Bahama Iflands, under certain Regu-" lations and Reftrictions; and for regulating the " Duties on the Importation of Goods and Com-" modities, the Growth and Production of the Coun-" tries bordering on the Province of Quebec."

And whereas by an Act paffed in the last Session of. Parliament, intituled, " An Act to amend an Act, passed in the Twenty-feventh Year of His prefent ¢ 6 Majesty's Reign, for allowing the Importation and Exportation of certain Goods, Wares and Merchan-" dize, in Foreign Ships, into and from certain Ports" " and Places in the Weft Indies; and for amending " fo much of an Act, made in the Thirty-fecond " Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, as re-" lates to permitting the Importation of Sugar into " the Bahama and Bermuda Islands in Foreign Ships; " and fo much of Two Acts, made in the Twenty-" eighth and Thirty-first Years of His prefent Majefty's Reign, as prohibits the Importation of " Timber into any Island under the Dominion of " His Majesty in the West Indies, from any Foreign " Colony or Plantation in the West Indies; or South " America; and fo much of the faid Act, made in " the Twenty-eighth Year of His prefent Majefty's " Reign, as prohibits the Importation of Pitch. " Tar and Turpentine, into Nova Scotia or New " Brunfwick,

" Brunfwick, from any Country belonging to the] " United States of America ;" it is, amongst other Things, enacted, That it shall and may be lawful, from and after the Tenth Day of July, 1793, to import into fuch Port or Ports in the Islands called Caicos, as shall be approved of by His Majesty in Council, Sugar and Coffee, the Produce of any Foreign Country or Plantation, in fuch Foreign Ships, and fubject to fuch Regulations as are prefcribed in the faid Three Acts, passed in the Twenty-feventh, Thirtieth, and Thirty-second Years of His prefent Majefty's Reign, with refpect to the Ports therein mentioned : His Majesty, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth hereby approve of the Port of St. George's Harbour, in the Grand: Caicos, one of the faid Iflands called Caicos, to be a Port for the Importation of Sugar and Coffee, the Produce of any Foreign Country or Plantation, in fuch Foreign Ships, and fubject to fuch Regulasions as are prescribed in the faid Acts .- And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majefty's Treasury, and the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.
