ARTICLES of Capitulation proposed by General Chancel, Commander in Chief at Condé.

Article I.

THE Garrison shall furrender themselves Prifoners of War: Shall march out with the Honours of War: Shall transport their Cannon to the Hamlet of Cocq, where they shall lay down their Arms, Battalion by Battalion, as well as their Colours.

Anfwer. Granted.

Article II.

The Staff Officers, the Commiffaries of War, and the Officers of every Rank, fhall retain their Swords, their Portmanteaux and Trunks, with their Carriages and Horfes; and, if His Serene Highnefs fhould defire it, they fhall give their Parole of Honour that whatever they carry away is their own private Property.

Anfwer. Granted.

Article III.

The Garrifon shall remain in the Place until the 12th Instant, from whence it shall depart, in Two Columns, Twenty-four Hours Interval being given for their being conducted to the Place.

Anfwer: Granted, till the 12th: On the 13th the Garrifon fhall march out at the Hour which fhall be agreed on. They fhall have Twenty-four Hours previous Notice of the Place to which they fhall be conducted.

Article IV;

Each Battalion shall carry away it's Covered Waggon, drawn by Four Horfes; and it shall, moreover, be furnished with all the Carriages necessary for the Garrison.

Anfwer. The Horfes belonging to the French Nation may be used for drawing the Baggage to the Place where the Troops shall be detained Prisoners of War; and, if a greater Number of Waggons shall be necessfary, they shall be furnished (or Boats;) but Covered Waggons are refused.

Article V.

The French Commiffaries of War shall remain in the Place, to attend to the Support and the Police of the Hospitals. Provisions and Medicines shall be furnished, by His Serene Highnes's Orders, to the Military of all Ranks who shall be actually in the faid Hospitals, and to the fick Officers in their own Apartments, at the Expence of the French Nation, until their entire Recovery; and as often as a vertain Number of Convalescents shall be in a Situation to bear being removed, a fufficient Number of Carariages shall be furnished, with an Escort; to conduct them with Safety to the Town appointed by His Serene Highness.

Anfwer. Granted; provided that the Number of Commiffaries who may remain shall be limited by the Commander of the Imperial Garrison, and shall be subject to his Directions.

Article VI.

The General, the Staff Officers, and the principal Officers of all the Corps of the Garrifon, fhall carry away with them (as being refponfible) all the Papers which may be neceffary either for their Juftification, or to enable them to give an Account of their perfonal Conduct, to fuch as have a Right to require it, fince the Blockade of the Place.

fince the Blockade of the Place. *Anfwer.* Granted; after the faid Papers shall have been examined, in order to certify that they contain Objects only relative to their Responsibility, and not to the Archives of the Place.

Article VII.

The Commanding Officers of Artillery, and of Engineers, shall remain in the Place the necessary Time for delivering into the Hands of His Imperial Majesty's Commission appointed for this Purpose, the different Effects with which they are respectively intrusted, and in order to put their Accompts in a State of due Order and Validity. *Anfwer.* The Chief Officer of Engineers in the

Anfwer. The Chief Officer of Engineers in the Place shall deliver to that of His Imperial Majesty, who shall be appointed for that Purpole, all the Plans, Memorials, Memorials, Meafurements, Drawings, and other Papers, which shall be found in the Depôt of the Fortifications, and belonging to the Place; and he shall explain to the faid Officer the Method of managing the Sluices, the Water-Courses, the Countermines, as well old as new, the Barracks, Military Buildings, and other Things under his Charge. In the fame Manner, the Chief Officer of Artillery, the Keepers of the Magazines, the Commission of War, of Victualling, and of Forage, &c. &c. who are the Keepers and Administrators of the Buildings and Effects belonging to the French Nation, shall deliver up the Papers, Books, Plans, Ammunition, and other Effects with which they may be charged, according to an Inventory, which shall be legally verified by an Officer of the Forces of His Imperial Majesty.

Article VIII.

All the Women and Children of the Military, of whatever Rank their Hußbands or Fathers may be, as well as the Citizens, fhall be allowed a Month to retire with their Effects, Goods and Property, into fuch French Town as they fhall chufe. For this Purpofe the neceffary Pafiports fhall be delivered to them. The General or Superior Officer, whom His Serene Highnefs fhall leave to command in the Place, fhall take Care that no one fhall be diffurbed on Account of his Opinion, nor for what he might have done previoufly to the prefent Capitulation.

Anfwer. The fame Regard shall be shewn to them which is due to all the Inhabitants of the Country, and to the good Citizens of the Town.

Article IX.

The National Guard of Citizens of Condé, the Artillery Men excepted, having been employed during the Blockade only in the Protection of Property and in the Police of the Town, fhall not be regarded as Prifoners of War, but may remain peaceably in their Houfes. The Company of Cannoneers and the National Guard of Condé, having been many Months in the Pay of the Nation, and having in that Quality performed active Service in the fame Manner as the Cannoneers of the Line, fhall be Prifoners of War; they fhall be the first exchanged or ranfomed, and fhall have for their Prifon the Town of Condé, the Place of their Dwelling.

Anfwer. His Majelty the Emperor and King does not make War upon the peaceable Citizens and Inhabitants, all fuch, being fure of his Protection, fhall remain in their own Houfes, without being diffurbed. Those who have worn Uniforms and borne Arms shall be declared fubject to the Laws of War, and, as such, shall be difarmed, and made Prisoners. As to the Place of their Detention, they shall have Twenty-four Hours Notice previously to their Departure from the Place.

Article X.

The Curate of the Town of Condé, as well as all the Priefts, who have taken the Oath required by the Civil Conffitution of the Clergy, fhall have Eight Days Notice, and fhall be provided with Paffports to retire where they pleafe with their Effects and Baggage. They fhall not, any more than the other Citizens, be diffurbed on Account of their Opinions.

Baggage. They main not, any more than the other Citizens, be diffurbed on Account of their Opinions. *Anfwer.* This Object, not being of a Military Nature, fhall be referred to His Majefty the Emperor; and, in the mean Time, they fhall remain in the Town, under the Protection granted to the Inhabitants, but without being permitted to perform any Duty; those who wish to depart fooner fhall have Pafsports.

Article XI.

The General places, under the Safeguard of the Auftrian Government, the Perfons and Property of all Citizens, of whatever Defcription they may be, as well as all those who may chuse to retire from the Place.

Anfwer. The Auftrian Troops, on entering into the Place, fhall observe the most exact Police, so thatno Infult shall be offered to Individuals, nor Attack made upon Property.

Article XII.

The Effects which may have been deposited in this Place by different Military Individuals, who shall not have been themselves in the Town, nor in the Corps, and do not form a Part of the Garrison, shall be faithfully delivered up to their Owners, upon Requisition.

Anfwer. This Article is granted of Courfe.

Article XIII.

General Chancel recommends the Auftrian Deferters, who may be found in the Place, to the Clemency of His Serene Highness and that of His Imperial Majefty.

Anfwer. All the Deferters of His Imperial Majefty fhall be delivered up, and the neceffary Refearches for difcovering them fhall be made.

Article XIV.

The Contractors for Military Subfiftance, Servants attached to the Military, and the Artillery Drivers, not having any Military Duty to perform, cannot be looked upon as making Part of the Garrifon, and fhall have Liberty to return to their Homes; and for this Purpofe they fhall be furnished with Passports and the necessary Carriages.

Anfwer. This Article shall be performed according to the Cartel established between the Two Armies.

Article XV.

Measures having been taken to ensure the Payment of the Debts which the Garrison may have contracted during the Blockade, the Orders given to this Effect shall be communicated to His Serene Highness, if he should defire it.

Anfwer. The well-founded Pretensions and Claims of the Inhabitants of the Town of Condé upon the French Troops, or upon the Nation, shall be liquidated by them, to the Satisfaction of the Parties.

Article XVI.

The Commission at War, *Pigeon* employed in the Army of the Ardennes, and dicharging the Duties of Infpector of the Place, having caused to be paid to the Austrian Prifoners under his Care the fame Allowance which they had in His Imperial Majesty's Army, the fame Allowance shall also be paid to the Garrison of Condé, which is attached to each Individual according to his Rank. *Anjuwer*. The fame Rule shall be observed, in

Anjwer. The fame Rule shall be observed, in this Respect, as has been settled by the Cartel for the Prisoners of War.

ADDITIONAL ARTICLES, proposed by His Serene Highness Prince Ferdinand of Wirtemberg, Lieutenant-General of the Imperial and Royal Arnies.

Article I.

A T Ten o'Clock of the Evening of this Day, the 10th of July, 1793, General Chancel fhall deliver up to the Troops of His Majefty the Emperor and King, the Fort or Redoubts of Thivencelles, Jar, Macou and Mafy; and the Imperial Troops shall take immediate Possefilion of them. The Redoubt of the Moulin de Fresnes, as well as of the Battery called Chancel, shall remain neuter.

Article II.

At the fame Time there shall be delivered up to the Austrian Troops the outer Draw-Bridge of the Gate of Condé, called the Gate of Tournai; and the interior Bridge towards the Square shall be occupied by the French Troops.

Article III.

The Fortifications, Outworks, Redoubts, Intrenchments, Forts, Sluices, Countermines, Galleries, Subterraneous Places, Cafemates, Arfenals, Magazines, Barracks, Pavillons, and, in fhort, all the Publick Edifices, Civil and Military, fhall be delivered up to the Commiffaries of His Imperial Majefty, appointed for this Purpofe, in *flatu quo*, without any Alteration whatever being made in the faid Works, &c. &c.

Article IV.

All the Artillery of the Place, ferving for the Defence, as well as that attached to the Battalions, after the latter fhall have laid down their Arms, fhall be delivered up in it's actual State, without any Damage being done to the faid Artillery, it's Equipage, Carriages, &c. In like Manner, the Arms of every Kind, as well as Ammunition, fuch as Powder, Bombs, Obufer, Bullets, Balls, Cartridges, &c. together with all other moveable Property belonging to the French Nation, and which are equally included in the prefent Article, fuch as Camp Equipage, Artillery, and other Horfes, other than those proper for the Officers, comprifed in the IId Article.
