The Mails for Lisbon will likewise, for the future, be made up and dispatched from hence every Tuesday Night, instead of Wednesday in the Afternoon, as at present: All Persons are, therefore, desired to put their Letters into this Office on Fridays, for Spain and Oporto, and on Tuesdays, for Lisbon, before Twelve o'Clock at Night.
