**XESTERDAY** Morning a Meffenger arrived at the Office of the Right Honorable Lord Grenville, His Majefly's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, with Difpatches from the Earl of Yarmouth, dated at the Camp before Mayence, July 23, 1793, containing an Account of the Surrender of that City to His Pruffian Majefly on the preceding Day, with the Articles of Capitulation, of which the following is a Tranflation.

ARTICLES of CAPITULATION offered by Brigadier-General D'Oyré, Commander in Chief at Mayence, Caffel, and the Rlaces which are dependent upon them.

#### Article L

T H E French Army shall deliver up to His Majefty the King of Prussia the City of Mayence and Cassed to the their Fortifications and all the Posts which belong to them, in their present State; also the Artillery, both French and Foreign, Warlike Stores and Provisions, those Matters only ex-

cepted, which are mentioned in the following Articles.

#### Artičle II.

The Garrifon shall march out with all the Honors of War, carrying away their Arms, Baggage and other Effects, the private Property of the Individuals of the Garrifon.

Anfwer. Granted, on Condition that the Garrifon fhall not ferve, during the Space of a Year, against the Armies of the Allied Powers; and that if they carry away any Covered Waggons, His Pruffian Majefty referves the Right of fearching them, in cafe he fhould think proper.

#### Article III.

The Garrifon shall be allowed to carry away with them their Field Pieces with their Carriages.
