THEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the Twenty-fifth of January last, prohibiting the Transporting into any Parts out of this Kingdom any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rofin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowfprits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, will expire upon the Twentyfifth of this inftant July : And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the faid Prohibition fhould be continued for fome Time longer, His Majefty doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit and command, that no Perfon or Perfons whomfoever, do at any Time, for the Space of Six Months from the faid Twenty-fifth Day of this instant July, prefume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rofin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, or thip or lade any of the Articles above mentioned on board any Ship or Veffel in order to transporting the fame into any Parts beyond the Seas, without Leave or Permiffion being first had and obtained from His Majefty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of I Yards and Garrifons, or to His Majefty's Colonies

incurring the Forfeitures inflicted by an Act paffed in the last Session of Parliament, intituled, " An " Act to enable His Majesty to restrain the Ex-" portation of Naval Stores, and more effectually " to prevent the Exportation of Salt-Petre, Arms, " and Ammunition, when prohibited by Procla-" mation or Order in Council." But it is neverthelefs His Majefty's Pleafure, that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be construed to extend, to any of His Majefty's Ships of War, or any other Ships or Veffels, or Boats, in the Service of His Majefty, or employed or freighted by His Majefty's Board of Ordnance, or by the Commiffioners of His Majesty's Navy, nor to prevent any Ship or Veffel from taking or having on board fuch Quantities of Naval Stores as may be neceffary for the Ufe of fuch Ship or Veffel during the Course of her intended Voyage, or by Licence from the Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, or the Commissioners of the Admiralty for the Time being, nor to the Exportation of the faid feveral Articles to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Yards or Garrifons, or to His Majefty's Colonies or Plantations in America or the Weft-Indies, or to Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Forts and Settlements on the Coaft of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies; provided that, upon the Exportation of any of the faid Articles for the Purposes of Trade to Ireland, or to His Majefty's and

and Plantations in America or the Weft Indies, | or to the Island of Newfoundland, or to His Majefty's Forts and Settlements on the Coaft of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies, the Exporters of fuch Articles do first make Oath of the true Defination of the fame to the Places for which they shall be entered Outwards, before the Entry of the fame shall be made, and do give full and fufficient Security, by Bond, to the Satiffaction of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Cultoms, to carry the faid Articles to the Places for which they are fo entered Outwards, and for the Purposes specified, and none other; and fuch Bond shall not be cancelled or delivered up until Proof be made to the Satisfaction of the faid Comissioners, by the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the faid Commissioners, and specified in the Bond, of a Certificate or Certificates, in fuch Form and Manner as shall be directed by the faid Commissioners, shewing that the faid Articles have been duly landed at the Places for which they were entered Outwards. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them refpectively appertain.

The KING's Most Excellent Majefty in Council. 7 HEREAS His Majefty was pleafed, by His Order in Council, bearing Date the Seventh of December, 1792, to order, require, prohibit and command, that no Perfon or Perfons whatfoever (except the Master-General of the Ordnance for His Majesty's Service) should, during the Space of Six Months from the Date of the faid Order, prefume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coaftwife, any Gunpowder or Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition ; or thip or lade any Gunpowder or Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, on board any Ship or Veffel, in order to transporting the fame into any Parts beyond the Seas, or carrying the fame Coastwife, without Leave or Permission in that Behalf first obtained from His Majefty or His Privy Council; which Order was, by another Order dated the Fourteenth Day of June, continued for and during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the Seventh Day of the faid inftant June : And whereas it may

be beneficial to the Trade and Manufacture of Gunpowder, if the Exportation thereof is permitted to certain Places, under certain Conditions; His Majesty, taking the fame into His Royal Confideration, is pleafed, by the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, as it is hereby ordered, that from and after the Date hereof. the Exportation of Gunpowder shall, notwithstanding the faid Orders, be permitted and allowed from any of the Ports of this Kingdom to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Colonies or Plantations in America, or the West Indies, or to the Island of Newfoundland, in British-built Ships, owned by His Majesty's Subjects, and navigated according to Law; provided that the Merchant, Exporter of fuch Gunpowder, do enter into Security by Bond, with Two other able and fufficient Sureties, to be approved by the Principal Officers of the Cultoms at the Port from whence fuch Ship or Ships shall clear out, in Six Times the Value of the faid Gunpowder fo exported. and shall thereby engage that fuch Ship or Ships shall fail under Convoy, and shall not defert the fame on the Voyage, nor until their Arrival at the Port of the Country for which fuch Gunpowder shall be cleared out; and upon further Condition to produce, within Two Months from the Date of the Bond, a Certificate or Certificates, from the proper Officers of the Cuftoms in Ireland, of the due Landing of the Gunpowder cleared out for that Kingdom; and within Twelve Months from the Date of the Bond, from the Governor or Commander in Chief of His Majesty's Colonies or Plantations in America, or the Weit Indies, or from the proper Officers of the Cultoms at Newfoundland, that the Gunpowder exported to any of the Ports of the faid Colonies or Plantations, or of the Island of Newfoundland, respectively, has all been duly landed at the Port for which the fame was cleared out ; and the Bonds and Securities fo entered into shall not be cancelled or delivered up, but on the Production of fuch Certificates : And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majeity's Treasury are to give the necessary Directions herein accordingly.
