The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. X7HEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the Twenty-fifth of January last, prohibiting the Transporting into any Parts out of this Kingdom any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rosin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, will expire upon the Twentyfifth of this instant July: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the said Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer, His Majesty doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit and command, that no Person or Persons whomsoever, do at any Time, for the Space of Six Months from the faid Twenty-fifth Day of this instant July, prefume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rosin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, or ship or fade any of the Articles above mentioned on board any Ship or Vessel in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, without Leave er Permission being first had and obtained from

incurring the Forseitures inflicted by an Act passed in the last Session of Parliament, intituled, " An " Act to enable His Majesty to restrain the Ex-" portation of Naval Stores, and more effectually " to prevent the Exportation of Salt-Petre, Arms, " and Ammunition, when prohibited by Procla-" mation or Order in Council." But it is nevertheless His Majesty's Pleasure, that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be construed to extend, to any of His Majesty's Ships of War, or any other Ships or Vessels, or Boats, in the Service of His Majesty, or employed or freighted by His Majesty's Board of Ordnance, or by the Commissioners of His Majesty's Navy, nor to prevent any Ship or Vessel from taking or having on board fuch Quantities of Naval Stores as may be necesfary for the Use of such Ship or Vessel during the Course of her intended Voyage, or by Licence from the Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, or the Commissioners of the Admiralty for the Time being, nor to the Exportation of the said several Articles to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Yards or Garrisons, or to His Majesty's Colonies or Plantations in America or the West-Indies, or to Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies; provided that, upon the Exportation of any of the faid Articles for the Purposes of Trade to Ireland, or to His Majesty's His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of I Yards and Garrisons, or to His Majesty's Colonies
