The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the Twenty-fifth of January last, prohibiting the Transporting into any Parts out of this Kingdom any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rofin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowforits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, will expire upon the Twentyfifth of this instant July: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the faid Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer, His Majesty doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit and command, that no Person or Persons whomsoever, do at any Time, for the Space of Six Months from the faid Twenty-fifth Day of this instant July, presume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rofin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, or ship or lade any of the Articles above mentioned on board any Ship or Vessel in order to transporting the fame into any Parts beyond the Seas, without Leave or Permission being sirst had and obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of

incurring the Porfeitures inflicted by an Act passed in the last Session of Parliament, intituled, " An " Act to enable His Majesty to restrain the Ex-" portation of Naval Stores, and more effectually " to prevent the Exportation of Salt-Petre, Arms, " and Ammunition, when prohibited by Procla-" mation or Order in Council." But it is nevertheless His Majesty's Pleasure, that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be construed to extend, to any of His Majesty's Ships of War, or any other Ships or Vessels, or Boats, in the Service of His Majesty, or employed or freighted by His Majesty's Board of Ordnance, or by the Commissioners of His Majesty's Navy, nor to prevent any Ship or Vessel from taking or having on board fuch Quantities of Naval Stores as may be necesfary for the Use of such Ship or Vessel during the Course of her intended Voyage, or by Licence from the Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, or the Commissioners of the Admiralty for the Time being, nor to the Exportation of the faid feveral Articles to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Yards or Garrisons, or to His Majesty's Colonies or Plan-.. tations in America or the West-Indies, or to Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies; provided that, upon the Exportation of any of the faid Articles for the urposes of Trade to Ireland, or to His Majestyl's Yards and Garrisons, or to His Majesty's Colonies

and Plantations in America or the West Indies, | be beneficial to the Trade and Manufacture of or to the Island of Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies, the Exporters of fuch Articles do first make Oath of the true Destination of the same to the Places for which they shall be entered Outwards, before the Entry of the same shall be made, and do give full and sufficient Security, by Bond, to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs, to carry the said Articles to the Places for which they are so entered Outwards, and for the Purposes specified, and none other; and such Bond shall not be cancelled or delivered up until Proof be made to the Satisfaction of the faid Comissioners, by the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the faid Commissioners, and specified in the Bond, of a Certificate or Certificates, in such Form and Manner as shall be directed by the faid Commissioners, shewing that the faid Articles have been duly landed at the Places for which they were entered Outwards. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them respectively appertain.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. THEREAS His Majesty was pleased, by His Order in Council, bearing Date the Seventh of December, 1792, to order, require, prohibit and command, that no Person or Persons whatsoever (except the Master-General of the Ordnance for His Majesty's Service) should, during the Space of Six Months from the Date of the faid Order, presume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coastwife, any Gunpowder or Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition; or ship or lade any Gunpowder or Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, on board any Ship or Vessel, in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, or carrying the fame Coastwife, without Leave or Permission in that Behalf first obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council; which Order was, by another Order dated the Fourteenth Day of June, continued for and during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the Seventh Day of the faid instant June: And whereas it may

Gunpowder, if the Exportation thereof is permitted to certain Places, under certain Conditions; His Majesty, taking the same into His Royal Confideration, is pleased, by the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, as it is hereby ordered, that from and after the Date hereof, the Exportation of Gunpowder shall, notwithstanding the said Orders, be permitted and allowed from any of the Ports of this Kingdom to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Colonies or Plantations in America, or the West Indies, or to the Island of Newfoundland, in British-built Ships, owned by His Majesty's Subjects, and navigated according to Law; provided that the Merchant, Exporter of such Gunpowder, do enter into Security by Bond, with Two other able and fufficient Sureries, to be approved by the Principal Officers of the Customs at the Port from whence fuch Ship or Ships shall clear out, in Six Times the Value of the faid Gunpowder fo exported, and shall thereby engage that such Ship or Ships shall fail under Convoy, and shall not desert the fame on the Voyage, nor until their Arrival at the Port of the Country for which fuch Gunpowder shall be cleared out; and upon further Condition to produce, within Two Months from the Date of the Bond, a Certificate or Certificates, from the proper Officers of the Customs in Ireland, of the due Landing of the Gunpowder cleared out for that Kingdom; and within Twelve Months from the Date of the Bond, from the Governor or Commander in Chief of His Majesty's Colonies or Plantations in America, or the West Indies, or from the proper Officers of the Customs at Newfoundland, that the Gunpowder exported to any of the Ports of the faid Colonies or Plantations, or of the Island of Newfoundland, respectively, has all been duly landed at the Port for which the same was cleared out; and the Bonds and Securities fo entered into shall not be cancelled or delivered up, but on the Production of fuch Certificates: And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary Directions herein accordingly.
