THEREAS by an Act, passed in the last Seffion of Parliament, intituled, " An Act to amend'an Act made in the Thilty-first Year of the " Reign of His prefent Majesty, intituled, An Act " for regulating the Importation and Exportation of "Coin, and the Payment of the Duty on Foreign " Corn imported, and of the Bounty on British Corn " exported;" it is, amongst other Things, enacted, That it shall-and may'be lawful for His Majeffy, His Heirs and Succeffors, and He and They is and are thereby authorized, with Advice of His or Their Privy Council; at any Time when the General Average Price of any Sort of Corn' or of Oatmeal, in England or Scotland respectively, taken as in the faid Act-passed in the last Session of Paritament' is directed, fhall appear to be at or above the Price at or above which Foreign Corn, Meaf or Flour of the fame Sort is allowed by Law to be imported from Ireland or the Province of Quebec, or the other Britifh Colonies and Plantations in North America, at the first Low Duties specified" in the Table marked E. in the faid Act paffed in the Thirty-fillt Year' of His prefent Majelty's Reign, to prohibit generally, for a limited Time, the Exportation' front England and Scotland refpectively; as the Cafe may be, 'of any fuch Sort of Corn or other Articles mentioned in the laid Acts; and in like Manner; at any Time when the Average Price of any Sort of Corn of of

And whereas it appears, from the Returns received in the Week ending the Seventeenth Day of August, 1793, that the General Average Prices of Wheat, Rye, Peafe, Beans, Barley, Beer or Bigg, Oats and Oatmeal, in that Part of Great Britain called England, are above the Prices at which Foreign Wheat, Wheat-Meal and Flour, Rye, Peafe, Beans, Barley, Beer or Bigg, Oats and Oatmeal, are allowed by Law to be imported at the first Low Duty specified in the faid Table marked E.; His Majefty, therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, purfuant to the Powers given by the faid Act, hath thought fit to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Prohibition to export Wheat, Wheat-Meal or Flour, or Malt, Bread or Biscuit made thereof, from any Port or Place in that Part of Great Britain called England, and every Provision, Regulation and Exception refpecting the faid Prohibition in the faid Order contained, shall be and continue in Force until the Sixteenth Day of November, 1793, or until His Majesty shall think fit to revoke this prefent Order; and that the Prohibition to export Rye, Peale, Beans, Barley, Beer or Bigg, or Oats, or any Meal, Flour, Malt, Bread or Bifcuit made thereof, from any Port or Place in that Part of Great Britain called England, and every Provision respecting the faid Prohibition in the faid Order contained, shall be and continue in Force until the Thirtieth Day of November, 1793. And whereas it appears, from the Returns received in the Month immediately preceding the Fifteenth Day of August, 1793, that the General Average Prices of Barley, Beer or Bigg, Peafe, Beans, Oats and Oatmeal, in that Part of Great Britain called Scotland, are above the Prices at which Foreign Barley, Beer or Bigg, Peafe, Beans, Oats and Oatmeal, are allowed by Law to be imported at the full Low Duty specified i the faid Table marked E.; His Majesty, therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, pur-

fuant to the Powers given by the faid Act, hath thought fit to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Prohibition to export Barley, Beer or Bigg, Peafe, Beans or Oats, or any Meal, Flour, Malt, Bread or Bifcuit made thereof, from any Port or Place in that Part of Great Britain called Scotland, and every Provision, Regulation and Exception refpecting the faid Prohibition in the faid Order contained, fhall be and continue in Force until the Thirtieth Day of November, 1793. And His Majefty, by and with the Advice aforefaid, hath thought fit to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Permission to import into any Port or Place in that Part of Great Britain called England, and to take out or Warehouse, for Home Confumption, any Foreign Rye, Peafe, Beans, Barley, Beer or Bigg, Oats or Oatmeal; and that the Permission to import into any Port or Place in that Part of Great Britain called Scotland, and to take out of Warehoufe, for Home Confumption, any Foreign Barley, Peafe, Oats and Oatmeal, on Payment of the fecond Low Duty only, mentioned in the faid Table marked E. and no other, in the faid Order contained, shall be and continue in Force until the Thirtieth Day of November, 1793.

And the Right Honorable the Lords Commiffioners of His Majofty's Treasury are to give the neceffary Directions herein accordingly.

ESEN R т, The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. 7HEREAS His Majelty was pleafed, by His Order in Council bearing Date the Thirteenth of March, 1793, to order, that an Embargo should be forthwith laid upon all Ships or Veffels laden or to be laden in any of the Ports of Great Britain with Salted Provisions of any Kind whatfoever, and also upon all Ships and Vessels laden or to be laden with Butter and Cheefe, Peafe, Beans, Rice, Hay, Straw, or Forage of any Kind whatfoever, and with Hides or Leather manufactured or unmanufactured; but it was His Majefty's Pleafure, amongst other Things, that the faid Embargo should not extend to any Ships or Veffels, being British. Ships and Veffels, and navigated according to Law, which may be employed in carrying any of the Articles abovementioned to any Country in or out of Europe, in Amity with His Majesty: And whereas it has been represented, on Behalf of the Merchants Importers and Exporters of Rice, that Orders for Rice have been received from Foreign Ports, to which British Veffels very feldom refort, and that if the Exportation of Rice to Countries in Amity with His Majefty,

Majefty, in Foreign Bottoms, is not permitted, the Trade in that Article will be greatly injured; His Majesty, taking the fame into Consideration, is pleafed, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that, from and after the Date hereof, the Exportation of Rice shall, notwithstanding the faid Order, be permitted and allowed from any of the Ports in this Kingdom to any Country in or out of Europe in Amity with His Majefty, in Foreign Ships or Veffels, provided the Merchant Exporter of any fuch Rice do first make Oath of the true Destination of the fame to the Places for which fuch Rice shall be entered Outwards, before the Entry of the fame shall be made, and do give full and fufficient Security by Bond, to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs, with Two fufficient Sureties, being known British Merchants, or other Persons of acknowledged Credit refident in this Kingdom, to be approved of by the proper Officers of the Cuftoms, to carry the faid Rice to the Place for which it is fo entered Outwards, and for the Purpofes fpecified, and none other; and to produce, within Twelve Months from the Date of the Bond, from the British Conful refident at the Port for which fuch Rice shall be cleared out, or in cafe there shall be no such Conful there refilent, or he shall be absent from the same, then f-o.n Two British Merchants refident there, a Certilicate or Certificates that fuch Rice has been all duly delivered at the Port for which the fame was cl ared out; and the Bonds or Securities shall not be cancelled or delivered up but on the Production of fuch Certificate or Certificates.

And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majefty's Treasury are to give the necessary Directions herein accordingly.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. HEREAS His Majefty was gracioufly pleafed, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Twenty-fixth Day of December laft, to promife and declare, that the Bounties of Five Pounds for every Able Seaman, and Iwo Pounds. Ten Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, fit for His Majesty's Service, should be paid in the Manner thereby directed to every fuch Able and Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should, on or before the Twenty-eighth Day of February then following, enter themfelves to ferve in His Majelty's Royal Navy, either with the Captains or

Lieutenants of His Majefty's Ships or Veffels, or Officers employed on Shore for raifing Men for the Service of the Royal Navy: And whereas His Majefty was also graciously pleased, by His faid Proclamation, to declare, that all Able-bodied Landmen, not above the Age of Thirty five nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should fo enter themselves as aforefaid, should receive the Sum of Thirty Shillings each Man, as His Majefty's Royal Bounty: And whereas His Majefty was also graciously pleased, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Sixteenth Day of the faid Month of February last, to promise and declare, that a Reward of Twenty Shillings for every Able and Ordinary Seaman, fit to ferve on board His Majesty's Ships, should be paid to any Perfon who should discover any Seaman or Seamen who might conceal him or themfelves, fo that fuch Seaman or Seamen should be taken for His Majesty's Service, on or before the Thirtieth Day of April then next, by any of His Majefty's Sea Officers appointed to raife Men on Shore, or by the Captains and Commanders of any of His Majefty's Ships or Veffels in the Ports or on the Coafts of this Kingdom: And whereas the Time limited by the faid Proclamations for Payment of the faid Bounties and Reward, hath been prolonged and extended to the Thirty-first Day of this Inftant August: And it being judged expedient for His Majesty's Service that the faid Bounties and Reward should be continued to be paid for fome Time longer; His Majefty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby accordingly ordered, that the Time limited for Payment of the faid Bounties and Reward be prolonged and extended from the faid Thirty-first Day of this instant August to the Thirtyfirit Day of October next, inclusive: Whereof all Perfons concerned are to take Norice, and govern themfelves accordingly.
