THE following Dispatch from Colonel Sir James Murray, Adjutant-General to the Forces under the Command of His Royal Highness the Duke of York, was this Evening received by Express at the Office of the Right Honorable Henry Dundas, His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department.

Furnes, September 10, 1793.

SIR,

I Have the Honor to inform you, that in consequence of Information received this Morning from Ypres, stating that that important Place was attacked, and that it stood in Need of immediate Assistance; His Royal Highness determined

to go to it's Relief. The Troops were already marched; when Intelligence was received of the Enemy having fallen back to Bailleul. This Retreat seems to have been occasioned by a successful Attack; which was made upon the 8th by General Beaulieu, upon their Posts near Lisle.

In consequence of this; the Troops have returned to their former Camp.
